### Driver's Licenses

Without attempting to explain further whether you put your right hand through the left window or your left hand through the rear winder in executing hand signals under the new traffic laws, there are a number of requirements with respect to driver's licenses which are worth study at this particular time when so many people are waiting till the last minute to obtain their licenses.

In the first place everyone who drives a car is re quired to have a license. If you have had a license during the past year you can got it renewed without taking a driver's examination, but if you have not had a license and are applying for a new one you must take the tests. You are also required to have your license with you at all times when operating a car and to display it when asked to do so by an officer.

Driver's licenses are necessarily revoked upon conviction for the following offenses:

1) Killing anyone while operating a motor vehicle. 2) Driving while under the influence of liquor or nar-

cotic drug. 3) Any felony in the commission of which a motor rehicle is used.

4) Failure to stop and render aid as required under the laws of this state in the event of a motor vehicle ac-

cident resulting in the death or personal injury of another.

5) Perjury or the making of a false affidavit or statement under oath to the Department under any law re-lating to the ownership or operation of motor vehicles. 6) Conviction or forfeiture of ball not vacated, upon

three charges of reckless driving committed within a period of 12 months. That fourth provision, we believe requires further explanation. Under the law the driver of a vehicle involved in an accident in which anyone is killed or injured, must

stop and render all possible aid to the victim. He must give his name and address and registration number of his automobile and show his driver's license. Then he is required, if requested, to take his victim to the hospital or to a doctor's office for treatment.

Further, in all accidents where anyone is killed or in jured, or where property damage to the extent of \$50 is caused, a written report of it to the Department of Public Safety must be made within 24 hours. Special forms for this purpose may be had from patrolmen, sheriffs or city police. Failure to make such reports is punishable by fine or imprisonment or both.


