



Cobia Boats Lays Off 100 Employes

Cutback To Last

45 To 90 Days

Officials Claim

Approximately 100 employes at Cobia Boat Co. were to be laid off today because dealers fear the energy crisis may curtail new boat pur-chases, company officials announced today. Cobia has about 300 employes working in its Sanford plant, with an annual payroll of ap-proximately \$1.5 million.

Cobia executive vice president and general manager Edward N. Atchley said they are cutting back 50 per cent from a production standpoint, and this will affect the 100 employes. He said the duration of the cutback would be 45 to 90 days, adding he hopes to be back in full production by mid-January or February Atchley said Cobia dealers currently have

well-stocked inventories of new boats and have delayed placing orders to meet the traditional Spring rush until they see what effect the energy

Cobia is helping find temporary jobs for its people during the short-term layoff said Atchley. He said despite the cut-back 1974 sales are

Confusion In China

Power Struggle Causes Guessing

COPLEY NEWS SERVICE

One of the most curious political power struggles in the checkered history of Communist rule in China is now unfolding.

And the most curious aspect of that power struggle is that there is no clear indication to outsiders just who is involved or exactly what objective is being sought. But there is no mistaking the fact that a serious political rivalry exists in the upper echelons of the Chinese Communist leadership.

Analysts in this China-watching post assume - and it's only an assumption - that the struggle is between a group of more moderate pragmatic men identified with Premier Chou En-lai on one hand and a group of more radical officials who identify with the late Defense Minister Lin Piao on the other hand.

The significant thing is that indications of this struggle have become much more numerous since the Chinese Communist Party held its 10th National Congress from Aug. 24 to 28.

That congress was intended to put a final lid on the issue of Lin Piao and his clique who attempted to stage a coup d'état against Chasirman Mao Tse-tung back in the autumn of 1971 Instead of greater political solidarity, however, the congress seems to have sparked new dif-

What makes the whole thing so confusing and curious is that the Chinese do not deal with the disupte in an open and frank fashion but refer to it only in a vague way or through allegory based on historical figures.

Since the 10th Party Congress, for example, a campaign criticizing the ancient Chinese sage Confucius has been unfolding. The assumption is that a high-level Chinese official (officials) perhaps even Chou En-lai - is the real target for

this criticism. But Confucius is not the only historical figure that has been brought back into the limelight. Singled out for unusual praise is one of the most notorious emperors China has ever had, Chin Shin-huang-ti who ruled from 221 to 210 B.C.







DEAR POLLY - My Pet Peeve is with the young breed of beauty operators who do not find it necessary to brush the tangles out of one's hair before shampooing and who never position the chair so one can see what they are doing until the "beautiful finished style" is finished. They also run a customer through before the hair is completely dry and when that "beautiful finished style" is exactly what the customer hates or the hair is parted on the wrong side they are nasty and can do nothing about it because the next customer is waiting. —DISGUSTED.

DEAR POLLY AND Mrs. J.S. who damaged the finish on her bathtub with a cleaner - I had the same trouble and applied three coats of epoxy enamel on the botto.n and sides where needed and allowed this to dry several days between each coat. After three years the tub still looks good and cleans well, too. Be sure the paint used is an EPOXY ENAMEL. —TILLIE.

DEAR POLLY - My quick and easy way to remove candle wax from wood furniture is to rub lightly with an old nylon stocking. The wax comes off with little or no effort and there is no danger of harming the furniture. -BEAT-

DEAR POLLY - I use silver polish to clean my white storm doors, to take marks off no-wax flooring, clean appliances even colored ones, laminated plastic tops and sinks. I think it is wonderful because there is no danger of scratching like there might be with scrubbing powder. We had trouble with our foam rubber mattress sliding on the box springs. I bought a one-inch thick foam mattress pad and put it between them. This holds both in place and helps keep the sheets and blanket tucked in. - SHARON.





World News Briefs

Election Financing

WASHINGTON (AP) - Senators favoring public financing of federal election campaigns have been defeated by the White House. The senators tried to attach the financing provision to emergency legislation on the debt ceiling, but ran into a filibuster. The battle is expected to be renewed early in the 1974 session.

Electricity Use Down

NEW YORK (AP) - From New York to San Francisco, conservation efforts and warm weather combined for a decline in electricity consumption during November. But utility officials say they can't judge how much of the drop was due to the generally higher temperatures and how much resulted frem Americans responding to President Nixon's Nov. 8 appeal for energy savings. In New York, a spokesman for Consolidated Edison said that for the weeks ended Nov. 4 and Nov. 11, electricity consumption was higher than during the same period in 1972. The next two weeks showed a decline, however, both from the previous weeks and from the 1972 figures.

Energy Center

GAINESVILLE, Fla. (AP) - An "Energy Center" has been established to pool information about the energy crisis and channel it to industry and government. The University of Florida center - the first of its kind in the United States - is using material provided by about 50 scientists and specialists from a dozen fields. The information is being used to help government officials and research groups across the nation.

Pioneer Passes Jupiter

MOANTAIN VIEW, Calif. (AP) - Pioneer 10 has sailed safely through Jupiter's radiation belts and is still transmitting important data as it heads for the Milky Way. Scientists have begun to study data that charted the shape and nature of Jupiter's magnetic field, measured the magnitude of radiation belts and promised to reveal details of the turbulent Jogian atmosphere. Pioneer 10 nearly destroyed by violent radiation storms - swept within \$1,000 miles of Jupiter's colorful cloud tufts

Skylab 3 Is Go

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) - Skylab 3's astronauts should be able to complete most of their planned earth resources surveys despite excessive use of control gas, space officials report. The astronauts were encouraged Monday when they completed two resources runs over the United States, using only two-thirds of the fuel that was needed for two similar passes Sunday. A computer analysis at mission control told the spacemen how to maneuver the spacestation to the proper position with less gas consumption. Additional computer checks are expected to reduce the fuel use even more, but probably enough for only 35-40 of the 50 resources runs originally scheduled for the 84-day mission.

Nixon Personal Finances

WASHINGTON (AP) - PresidentNixon has given selected Republican leaders a look at personal financial reports he plans to release publicly this week. White House spokesmen would give no details. However, Rep. John B. Anderson of Illinois, one of those attending, said White House lawyers gave an extensive presentation of Nixon's financial situation.

Sirica Hears Tapes

WASHINGTON (AP) - U.S. District Judge John J Sirica has spent a day listening to Watergate tapes. And White House officials were expected to tell the judge today how they handled the secret recordings.

S. Koreans Demand Their Education

Associated Press Writer

SEOUL (AP) - A South Korean miner entombed in the collapsed shaft of a coal mine painfully scrawled out his will 55 minutes before

His last wish was that his three small children

Kim Chong-Ho's will was published in Korean newspapers last week alongside accounts of student clashes with riot police. The demonstrations that began two months ago were aimed at getting back the freedoms President Chung Hee Park took away 14 months ago when he procinimed martial law.

One of the most literate peoples on earth, the South Koreans place an extremely high value on education, as Kim's will testifies. Thousands of children go to school from 8 a.m. to 19 p.m., supplementing their regular daytime classes with special night ones to make the difficult climb from one level to the next.

The 303,000 university students who stand at the apex of the educational system are regarded as the nation's elite. They were in the forefront of resistance during the dark 35 years of Japanese rule. They brought down President Syngman Rhee in 1960.

Now they are in ferment again, holding mass meetings, hunger strikes, class boycotts and street marches to emphasize their demands that Park restore the press, academic and personal freedoms he suppressed under a decree called "national revitalization reforms."

Citing what many Koreans believe is the nonexistent threat of North Korean invasion and subversion, Park replaced the nation's liberal democracy with a largely hand-picked legisla-ture, installed Central Intelligence Agency agents on university campuses and clamped down on free speech and the newspapers.

The students lay low for months, unwilling to confront the government.
