Rule Common In Seminole

Lawmen And The Drinking Policy

Herals Staff Writer

A poll of attitudes and practices of area law enforcement regarding a department policy prohibiting policemen in Altamonte Springs from frequenting establishinments which sell only alcoholic beverages in their jurisdiction disclosed that city is not alone.

The poll came on the heels of an ordered suspension of a police sergeant in Altamonte Springs accused of patronizing a bottle club in that city, contrary to depart-The Seminole County Sheriff's and Casselberry Police

departments have nearly identical policies. "The philosophy behind such a policy," said Altamonte Springs Chief Justus East, "is that an officer has arrest

powers 24 hours daily. If he goes to an establishment for the sole purpose of consuming intoxicating beverages, he is susceptible to trouble. He might be called on to make an arrest when his normal faculties are impaired from drinking or he might get into trouble himself. An officer cannot drink and become intoxicated in a public place." Meanwhile, in Winter Springs, Longwood, Oviedo and Lake Mary where there are no establishments in business solely selling alcoholic beverages, according to officers in those communities, no such policy exists. The police officers interviewed are split in their feelings about such a

Lt. George Myers of the Lake Mary Police Department said he thinks such a policy is wrong. "Police officers are no different than anyone else. I don't feel it is detrimental if a man goes to a place and gets a few drinks."

agreement with such a policy at all. "Policemen have rights, too," he said. "You can't tell them what to do with their personal life."

"I agree it's a good policy," Winter Springs Police Chief John Govoruhk said. "If we had an establishment here selling alcoholic beverages only, I would institute such a policy. Something like that should be restricted." Seminole County Sheriff's Department spokesman John Spolski pointed to the department's manual of general

The manual prohibits the use of intoxicants while on duty, Spolski said. But, the manual adds, "Even more, members must be very careful about drinking while off See LAWMEN, Page 5A

Notice Served

Altamonte Springs Police Sgt. Norman Floyd Jr. was served Wednesday night with notice of his suspension from the city police department and of other disciplinary action taken against him by Police Chief Justus East. The 27-year-old son of Mayor Norman Floyd Sr. has not notified the department whether he will take advantage of his rights of appeal under the state police bill of rights or under city police and city employee personnel policy, East said today. Floyd Jr. has not been available for comment.

East ordered Floyd Jr.'s suspension Tuesday after a fellow officer filed a complaint charging the sergeant violated police department policy forbidding officers from patronizing Altamonte establishments which sell alcoholic beverages only.

Meanwhile, at a city commission meeting Wednesday night, City Commissioner Dolores Vickers was stopped by the mayor from discussing the situation. He reminded her of Floyd Jr.'s rights under the various laws and the fact the young officer had not at that point been served with notice of the disciplinary action.

More Arms Aid For Egypt

As Stabilizer In Mideast?

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Carter s expected to propose additional military assistance to Egypt to permit President Anwar Sadat to play a bigger role in stabilizing the Middle East since the loss of Iran, administration officials said.

But the officials also indicated the aid will not consist of the massive modern weaponry costing billions of dollars which Sadat requested from Defense Secretary Harold Brown on Brown's recent fact-finding trip to the Middle East.

Egyptian-Israel ministerial level talks are under way at Camp David, but it was understood that the granting of new weapons requests to Egypt would not be conditioned on first achieving a peace settlement.

The Prince Raps The Bosses

LONDON (UPI) - It was almost like having Prince Charles packing a picket sign. The heir to the British throne personally got into the fray Wednesday in strike-bound England, coming down solidly on behalf of labor. Said the prince in London, "Much of British management does not seem to understand the importance of the human factor." He says British bosses could learn a lot from the United States and its "single status system." Explains Charles, "Basically, it means that the conditions of employment are the same whatever your position. It also means eating in the same canteen."

Chess Champion Faces Suit

MANILA, Philippines (UPI) — A Dutch court has summoned World Chess Champion Anatoly Karpov to appear before it to answer a lawsuit by Russian defector Viktor Korchnoi seeking to annul the result of their world title match, a Philippine chess official said today. Karpov retained his title by beating Korchnoi 6-5 in a controversial match last October Baguio City, Philippines. Korchnoi claimed Karpov used a Soviet hypnotist to disturb him during the final game in violation of a previous agreement and went to court to seek annulment of the result.

More Oil Coming From OPEC?

VIENNA, Austria (UPI) — Delegates to next month's meeting of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries will discuss stepping up their oil production to compensate for the loss of Iranian oil, sources in the cartel say. OPEC Secretary General Rene Ortiz announced OPEC oil ministers will convene March 26 in Geneva for a "concultative meeting" to discuss the situation created by recent developments in Iran that have virtually shut off the nation's petroleum output.

ROME (UPI)— Republican leader Ugo La Malfa, 75, a friend of the West but an advocate of collaboration with Italy's powerful Communists, today agreed to try forming the country's next government.

Volcano Kills 136 Moslems

SEMARING, Indonesia (UPI) — A 1,000-year-old dormant volcano that killed at least 136 Moslem worshippers in a sudden eruption belched toxic fumes today that hindered rescue efforts. Officials feared the final death toll might be near 1,000.







Local Control Over Education

In proposing creation of a cabinet-level Department of Education, President Carter may be repaying the National Education Association for its political support during the 1976 presidential

campaign. Whether Mr. Carter is also acting in the best interests of the public is open to considerable

It is fair to say that most people favor local control of schools and education policy. This means a minimal role for Washington in

school financing and the establishment of administrative and instructional policy. But few in Washington doubt that a cabinetlevel Department of Education would be anything

other than a potent lobby for ever greater federal subsidies for education And subsidies, as they have always done, would beget regulations and "guidelines" that

could only further erode local control. As it happens, this would suit the purposes o the NEA whose membership of 1.8 million public school teachers often finds itself at odds with

economy-minded local school boards. The NEA assumes, no doubt correctly, that Congress and the Washington bureaucracy would be far less likely to pinch pennies than locally elected school boards directly accountable to the

Thus, on grounds of economy alone, a formidable case can be made against the proposed

Department of Education. A more profound issue is the question of control over education policy.

For the most part, curriculum, instructional standards, teacher certification and administrative procedures are now set by state legislatures and local school boards.

But if power over such policy matters were shifted to Washington, the politically influential NEA could reasonably expect to enjoy a quantum jump in influence, which is precisely what it has in

With all due respect to the dedication and professional competence of the majority of public school teachers, we think that taxpavers and parents should retain a dominant role in the establishment of education policy and the determination of proper school-funding levels.

And, if establishment of a Department Education would mean a dilution of this local role. we urge Congress to reject this particular reorganization plan.

Take **PPI After** Your Meals

WASHINGTON (NEA)- In this pill-happy culture where drugs are often consumed as casually as candy, what you don't know can hurt

That is the thoroughly sensible conclusion of the federal Food and Drug Administration, which believes patients have both a right and a need to know a good deal more than they currently do about drugs prescribed for them by

The FDA is currently in the process of expanding the number of drugs and medical devices for which "patient package inserts" will

Such "PPIs," as they are known in medical circles, are informational brocures or leaflets written in simple language and distributed with a drug each time it is dispensed to a patient. They typically include information about the appropriate use of a given drug, correct dosage and duration of use, storage conditions, expected benefits and possible side effects or risks associated with the medication.

Patient package inserts are nothing new. LIGHTER SIDE They have been required by FDA for anywhere from one to 10 years for a handful of products ranging from an asthma control aerosol to birth control pills and intrauterine devices.

But as FDA moves to require PPIs for more and more drugs, it is encouraging a certain amount of handwringing and foot-dragging from door that you hardly notice until one day you A. I'll admit that for a time America was in-

potentially dangerous or unpleasant side effects from a prescribed drug might be discouraged from taking needed medication. Some also suspect patients will start imagining adverse reactions where none exist - much the way second-year medical students are famous for experiencing symptoms of every deadly disease

patients will use information in the PPIs to start treating themselves (or friends with similar symptoms) with leftover prescription medicine. There is muttering, as well, about the cost of preparing and distributing package inserts, and

about the difficulty of explaining the relative risks and benefits of a drug in language simple enough for the average patient to understand. Advocates of PPIs, on the otherhand, contend they will significantly improve patient comprehension of, and compliance with, drug reatment prescribed by doctors.

Far too many doctors simply hand a patient a hastily scribbled prescription without the slightest attempt to explain what the medicine is, how it works, what its side effects might be or what alternative drugs might be available for

Rose Anxious To Go To Work

NEW YORK (UPI) - You can tell just by looking at him, Pete Rose can't wait to put on those new peppermint pinstripes. He's so anxious, in fact, he had the Philadelphia Phillies send him one of their uniforms, then went to a photographer's studio in Cincinnati where he had a picture of himself taken in it. Anyone asking for his autograph now gets that signed scaled-down photo of him in his new Phillies' flannels.

Next Wednesday, he'll be putting them on to go to work. That's when instead of reporting to the Cincinnati Reds for spring training as he has done for the past 16 years, he'll report to the Phillies for the first time. He's looking forward to the change. "I'm not gonna play any different than I've played in the last 16 years," says Rose, who signed for \$3.3 million with the Phillies two months ago after becoming a free agent with the Reds. "I'm

go. All I'm gonna try to do is pay back (Philadelphia owner) Ruly Carpenter for the confidence he had in me." Rose shows some impatience with people who ask him what he specifically hopes to do for the Phillies. Since he made his reputation out-hustling everyone else and has always given maximum effort, realistically, he doesn't see how he can possibly

not gonna try to prove Cincinnati made a mistake by letting me

try any harder than he has in the past. "With all the money I make now, I don't get my uniform any dirtier than I did when I was 9 years old," he says. "The only difference is my mother used to wash it. Now the club has it drycleaned. If I do anything at all differently today than I did as a kid it's only that I practice more."

Almost from the moment he signed with the Phillies, the general assumption was that Rose automatically would become their new leader. Mostly because they didn't have an old one. "I may not be the team leader for Philadelphia," says Rose who will be 38 in April. "It took me a lot of years to become that in Cincinnati. I think the reason there is no one leader with the The majority of them are in the 28-to-32 bracket and it's hard for a

kid 28 to look up to someone only a couple of years older." Reporting to a new club can be an unsettling experience for some players. Rose isn't worried about it too much because he knows virtually all the Phillies and has a close relationship with some. Besides, he remembers the first time he reported to the Reds in 1963 and after that experience, anything else has to be an

Rose came to spring training with the Reds as a second baseman and had a contract with Macon of the Sally League. Don asingame was the Reds' regular second baseman and was well-

liked by the other members of the team. "Most of the Reds players resented me," Rose says. "That was because they liked Blasingame so much. The only two fellows who spent any time at all with me were Frank Robinson and Vada Pinson. I remember (Cincinnati newspaperman) Earl Lawson handing out a piece of paper to all the players asking them whether they thought I'd make the club or not. The only guy who voted yes was Don Blasingame. All the rest voted no."

Rose doesn't have to worry about making the Phillies. Danny Ozark already has told him he plans to play him at first base and have him hitting first.

"I used to think I'd like to manage but I'm not so sure anymore Baseball players are too temperamental these days with those long-term contracts and all. With my personality, I'don't know if I could take it. Especially if some young kid part-timer started telling me how everything should be run."







Invading China: Foe Won't Talk

Thousands of Chinese invaders and seasoned Vietnamese regulars clashed today in the seaviest fighting of the weeklong war. Vietnam said it had blunted two Chinese attacks, killing 500 Chinese. China claimed Vietnam has refused to talk

Chinese air force planes arrived near the Sino-Vietnamese border while a bridge to aid Chinese reinforcements equipped with heavy firearms was built near Lao Cai over the Red River, which flow from China past Hanoi.

Kwangsi province just northeast of Vietnam with 130mm artillery fire and that the Chinese were organizing militia groups

In Washington, Chinese Ambasador Chai Tse-min saw Treesury Secretary Michael Blumenthal off on a trip to China and when asked about the war Chai told reporters: "All I know is what
