The case is due to go to The NBA has strict bylaws permanently barring any player who has ever been associated with "known gamblers," but in seeking to maintain purity the league has trampled on due process and the presumption of innocence, LIFE says. LIFE says the NBA and its president, Walter Kennedy, have been inconsistent in their attitude toward "tainted

players. Kennedy cited the indictment against Hacken, in which Hawkins was named, as the basis for barring Connie. "But now he (Kennedy) admits that until a few months ago he never checked to see if it also mentions any NBA players," LIFE notes. "In fact, the first player named in the indictment is Fred Crawford of the NBA's Los Angeles akers. One of the best places to eat this specialty is at Pandl's in Whitefish Bay, Milwaukee's oldest restaurant. Milwaukee residents told us that long ago, but we just caught up with Pandl's recipe in a delghtful regonal cookbook, "Be Wisconsin's Guest." This collection contains recipes from almost 50 Wisconsin restaurants as well as many contributed by members of the Junior League of Milwaukee who publish and distribute the

cookbook. What else is special about "Be Wisconsin's Guest?" A gooti number of recipes that are just a little different. Among them. baked breaded chicken wings and baked shrimp stuffed with crabmeat in the appetizer section; several unusual vegetable casseroles to serve as meat or fish accompaniments; a simple-to-make but interesting Sunday breakfast cake of Scandinavian origin; super-seasoning for roast beef; Hungarian beef goulash with an especially delicious gravy; coconut souffle made with egg whites; and eggnog

PANCAKE to cup all-purpose flour 1/2 cup milk Pinch of salt 4 large eggs

BURGUNDY BEEF tablespoons butter 3 pounds boneless beef rump cut in 114-inch cubes

4 cup brandy 2 beef bouillon cubes dissolved in I cup boiling water 15 cups red Burgundy wine 1 teaspoon salt 14 teaspoon pepper

1 bay leaf 16 teaspoon dry crushed thyme tablespoons frozen chopped 2 strips bacon, diced

bag (1 pound, 4 ounces) frozen small whole onions 1 package (6 ounces) frozen whole mushrooms In a large skillet in the hot butter, brown beef well on

In a small saucepan heat brandy until warm. With a match, light the brandy and pour flaming over beef; shake skillet until flame dies. Transfer beef and pan juices to a casserole that has a tight fitting lid. Add bouillon, wine. salt, pepper, bay leaf, thyme

and parsley. Cover tightly with foil (to collect droplets of steam), then cover with lid and cook in a preheated 350-degree oven until beef is tender-about two hours.

About 10 minutes before beef is done, cook bacon in skillet. Add onions and mushrooms (not defrosted). Cover and cook over medium heat, stirring several times, until vegetables are thawed and tender-about five minutes. Uncover and continue cooking until liquid has evaporated and vegetables are lightly browned. Add to beef mixture. If you like, you may sprinkle the beef dish with additional chopped parsley. Makes six healthy servings.

This torta comes from Piacenza, a town in Northern Italy where rice is a staple and sauces are likely to be made with butter, eggs and cream. In Italy the rice torta goes to the to table at the end of the meal along with fruit and cheese. It's so highly regarded that it is usually served on holidays or

other festive occasions. The recipe was contributed by a friend who borrowed it from her Italian-born mother, Our friend says: "I've made a departure from the Italian service of torta because I use it as an hors d'oeuvre nearly every time I entertain a dozen or more friends. It's a perfect do-ahead dish and inexpensive. Recently I served my torta to my mother who pronounced it just right. Although she scorns any spinach that isn't fresh, she didn't even guess that I had used the frozen

JENNIE'S RICE TORTA 1/2 cup water 1 package (10 ounces) frozen

leaf spinach 3 cups cooked rice 1/2 pound ricotta cheese 1 cup freshly grated Parmesan

cheese 1/4 teaspoon salt 1-16th teaspoon pepper 4 large eggs

Olive oil Fine dry bread crumbs In a saucepan bring the water to a boil. Add spinach, Break up with a fork to thaw and bring to a boil; beil about one minute. Drain thoroughly; chop fine;

squeeze out any excess water. In a medium mixing bowl stir together the spinach, rice, ricot-In a small mixing bowl beat together three of the eggs until yolks and whites are combined;

fold into rice mixture. With olive oil, grease the bottom and sides of a square cake pan (9 by 9 by 2 inches). Sprinkle bottom and sides with enough bread crumbs to coat. Turn rice mixture into pan. Beat remaining eggs until yolk and white are combined. With a pastry brush, brush over rice mixture.

Bake in a prehented 350-degree oven until firm-about 30

minutes. Run a small spatula around the sides to loosen edges. Cut into 11/2-inch squares; remove with spatula. Serve warm as an hors d'oeuvre. Makes three dozen. Note: If any of the torta is

leftover, cut it into large sections. With a wide spatula, loosen carefully and remove; wrap in foil and refrigerate. To reheat, bring to room temperature and then reheat in the foll in a 350-degree oven just until warm-5 or ten minutes. Recipe may be easily doubled and baked in a 13-by 9-by 2-inch pan at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

up. Cut in half-inch slices. Place on greased cookie sheets. Bake in preheated 400-degree oven 12 to 15 minutes. Cut each cheese slice in 15 pieces; top each pinwheel with a cheese piece. Return to oven until cheese melts-two to three minutes. Serve hot. Makes about two and a half dozen.






