Fifteen Docketed For Trial

Fifteen defendants are docketed for trial the week of July 17 before Circuit Judge Tom Waddell Jr. The cases run the gamut from first degree murder and manslaughter to rape, attempted rape, lewd and lascivious assault and incest. Albert Evans faces first degree murder charges in the April 15 death of Damon Jones who was shot in the chest twice with slugs from a .22 caliber pistol. The affray allegedly took place as a result of an altercation between the two men 'over a woman

James Drake, 27-year-old Casselberry resident, is charged with attempted rape and assault with intent to commit rape upon a 24-year-old Orlando woman in May.

The woman reported to sheriff's deputies she was assaulted at the county dumping station on SR 419. Drake was charged with assaulting the woman in a car. Roosevelt Barkley is charged

with manslaughter in the Oct. 31, 1971 death of Charles Lambert, when he is alleged to have operated his car in a culpable and negligent manner effecting the death of Lambert. The incident took place on SR 520. Oviedo.

Carl Courtney is charged with attempted rape and assault with intent to commit rape in an April 5 incident. Roger Maxwell is charged

with lewd and lascivious assault upon a female child. (The Herald omits the name of the defendant in the incest case to avoid embarrassment to his

Other defendants docketed for trial and their charges include Steve McCummings, charged with breaking and entering with intent to commit a felony and grand larceny: Carl Courtney, aggravated assault; Lexie Martin, grand larceny Webster Ott, possession of a barbiturate; Michael Oviatt, possession of a barbiturate; Elwood Lester, buying, receiving, concealing stolen property; Albert King, breaking and entering with grand larceny; Douglas Jackson, breaking and entering with intent to commit a felony and grand larceny and Jack Yandle, breaking and entering with intent to commit a felony

and grand larceny. The state has dropped charges of breaking and entering with intent to commit a misdemeanor against James Redwine



TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - Gov. Reubin Askew's consumer adviser, Arthur England,

issue is being decided. He said the move would be a follow up to Askew's request Monday that the PSC reconsider its decision to allow utilities to use the tax as justification for a rate hike.

The sponsor of the 5 per cent corporate tax that took effect last Jan. 1, Askew told the PSC that letting utilities pass the tax on to consumers put the tax burden back on those the tax legislation had sought to help.

The Gulf Power increase, which formally goes into e fect today, was the first rate hike granted by the PSC in which the state corporate taxes were tallied as a cost of doing business in the rate-making formula. "I don't know exactly how



\$3 Billion Price Tag For Russian Oil Deal LONDON (AP) - The Occidental Petroleum

Co. announced today that it has signed an agreement with the Soviet government to supply the Russians a wide range of scientific and technical services. Informants in London estimated the value of the contract as high as \$3 billion and said it was the biggest ever signed by a U.S. corporation with the Soviets.

Dr. Armand Hammer, the 72-year-old chairman of Occidental, told a news conference the agreement was signed in Moscow on July 14. He said it covers a five-year period and is re newable by mutual consent.

Hammer, who first did business with the Soviets shortly after the Bolshevik Revolution. said the contract covers five areas:





choosing to live here in greater numbers every It is also wise to remember that the goings on in Miami Beach which were given the most complete exposure through the media of the written word and the TV tube last week were

emotional in the extreme. Especially were they so where Democrats were concerned. For there appears to have been not only new registrations but a switch-over of parties with the GOP adding to their numbers and the Democrats losing some.

This has happened before when Claude R. Kirk - Republican - became governor and some Democrats seeking green pastures and GOP alliance switched to be properly enrolled for the patronage plums.

Some of these have turned quite sour since the return of the Democrats to power with Gov. Reubin Askew in the governor's chair and the Democrats in their usual domination of both chambers of the legislature.

What is taking place now, however, appears to be something much deeper and something of real substantial meaning to the political world. Whether or not it continues will be worth wat-

Voter registration is something which we have urged and do so with no partisan motivation at all. Indeed if there is one single result which the presidential campaign should produce, especially the one this year, is the awakening of the citizen to his responsibility and opportunity as a voter.

McGovern's crew will see to this with the same grassroots operation which won him the nomination. Nixon's boys will have to follow suit. The citizen will be given every opportunity to "do his thing."

One Man's Opinion Our Population

When President Nixon's entourage journeyed from the airport to Peking at the beginning of his history-making visit to China last March, the motorcade had the highway To Americans watching over satellite-relayed television,"

China, which we think of as "teeming" with more than 800 million souls, appeared almost deserted, at least until the streets of the capital city itself were reached. This was not the result of security measures by the President's Communist hosts. Normal traffic had not been cleared from the airport highway. By American standards, there would have been very little traffic to clear.

In America, however, one need not go into the cities to find people. Travel anywhere in the country, especially during the peak vacation months, from the least-known park in the most remote location to a well-publicized attraction like Disney World, and you'll encounter people. people, people, along with their cars, their trailers, their campers, their pets. China, with 800 million, is not seriously more crowded

than it was with 600 million or 400 million. But in terms of "effective" population, the United States with 200 milion is probably the most populous nation in the world. We not only have two cars in every garage but many. of us have two garages, or at least a carport at our summer cottage, as well as a minimum of one television set and other conveniences at both locations. Because of the great mobility and affluence at the com-

nand of Americans, our actual numbers have to be multiplied by a factor of several times to arrive at the "effective" population—the true population in terms of its impact on the environment and the consumption of re-

The lesson, which ecologists and others are trying to sink into us, is that while the world may be able to support an indefinite number of people-so long as living standards are kept low enough-it may already contain. too many for any but a small minority to hope to approach

MIAMI BEACH (NEA The 1972 Democratic convention had a lot of good and new things about it. What it did not have was electricity and excitement and a truly unifying spirit. I have more to compare it with than do most observers,

And so it was, having consumed prime television time for four straight days to parade its dreariest events and put on its relatively more interesting happenings from near midnight to the small hours of the morning. It can be argued that we observers simply were disappointed because our predictions of chaos here never came to pass. There may be something to that. Yet the alternative to chaos need not be smothering duliness

POLLY'S POINTERS

Silk Lampshades By POLLY CRAMER

DEAR POLLY-Mrs. G. S. who wants to clean her silk ampshades at home did not request washing instructions but I cannot resist passing on a method that really works. Be sure the shade fabric is coloriast. Remove any trim before washing. Sometimes these trims are attached with a fabric glue and can be easily pulled loose. If stitched, cut the threads and when trim is returned it may be either sewed or glued Freshen any trim by brushing with a soft brush, such as an old toothbrush Wash in warm mild suds that are deep enough to cover the entire shade. Brush suds on, inside and out, with a soft lampshade brush and work quickly with an up-andvent streaking and for this use a sink spray hose or hold under the shower. To prevent rusting of the frame squeeze around top and bottom with a heavy bath towel to remove excess moisture. Hang shade by a string to clothesline to dry so it hangs free and dries evenly. From time to time during the drying process go over frames

DEAR GIRLS-This is tricky business but works on most silk shades. If the fabric looks stretched and soggy during the process, do not worry as it will tighten when ry. If outdoor drying is impossible an electric fan may be used to speed things up. Work fast .- POLLY

King-size catfish are giving the bank fisherman plenty of thrills around the Marina Isle Camp. At least three rods have been lost this week by anglers who left them unattended and returned to find them pulled overboard by the big cats. Some have been landed up to 14 pounds recently.

A little further East on the river, Pat Brooks at Lemon Bluff Camp reported plenty of boaters, a few fishermen, and a few fair bream catches over the week end but bass scarce. "It shouldn't be too long before the shadeen minnows start running," said Pat, "then the bass will be going crazy

"Lots of catfish, a few bream, one five pound bass along with a couple of small ones," was the word from George Cheney, Wekiya River Haven camp. The bass are lying in deep holes along the Blackwater Creek area according to George. The campground here has been fairly full over the weekend with bow and arrow fishermen accounting for about half of the visitors. They are scoring well on big fat mullet, some of them in the three pound class. Cheney said bow fishermen have reported seeing large numbers of big catfish lying in the deep holes along the river.







Comptroller Fred Dickinson warned the Cabinet Tuesday that requiring out-of-state banking corporations to pay the tax on mortgages they buy from Florida lending institutions could drive interest

But the Cabinet ruled that they would have to pay. Dickinson, a long-time foe of the tax, said the outof-state banks would go to court and clarify the

He contended that charging the tax would cause big New York banks to withdraw from the \$5 billiona-year Florida mortgage market and since they now lend 40 per cent of the money, Florida mortgage lending institutions would have to seek funds from other sources at higher rates.

However, revenue director Ed Straughn, who submitted the tax proposal to the Cabinet, said imposition of the tax would have minimal effect on Florida home owners.

"There might be some extra cost involved if (the Altamonte Springs, I believe the New York banks) are taxed but it would only be a short time before they adjust their overhead costs,' he said. "I have no way of knowing whether they will decline to invest.

Jury Sets **Evans Free** Of Murder

O. H. (Bill) Eaton, assistant state attorney, expressed disappointment at the Tuesday afternoon innocent verdict brought in by a six-member all-white jury in the murder trial of Albert Evans, 58, of Sanford.

Eaton, who handled the state's prosecution of Evans in the shooting death of Damon Jones, also of Sanford, over the attentions of Dessie Mae Jones, a widow and no relation to the deceased, said the jury might have been confused over what constituted a second degree murder charge.

Evans admitted he shot Jones on the evening of April 15 after the man had driven to the home of Dessie Mae Jones on 12th Street and asked to talk to his "girl friend."

Evans, who was sitting on the porch with the woman, followed Jones back to his parked truck and after a brief conversation suddenly produced a .22 caliber pistol and allegedly shot Jones in the chest, killing him instantly according to Mrs. Jones, an eyewitness, who testified Evans fired three shots into Jones.

However, the jury found Evans was innocent of the

When questioned today how a jury could render an innocent verdict after Evans had admitted shooting Jones in a confession, prosecutor Eaton said "it may have been they took into consideration the environment in which the incident happened," in an apparent reference to the predominantly black area of the city.

"It may have been the statement by Evans that he didn't mean to kill Jones that persuaded the jury to reach its decision," Eaton added.
