Ty-Rosseter are fully alive to the situation and are safeguarding the tax payer's interests at every point and will make the very best terms possible before the final contract is made. These brick roads will be the very last word in road building in this section and will endure for all time to come if properly made and these gentlemen expect to have the very best brick and the very best work obtainable at the very best terms and the smallest per cent of interest. While all of us want the work to proceed at once we recognize the fact that the interest of the people must be protected and road work that will be done here at this time will probably be watched with great in terest all over the south. 




