#### Life Or Death Ruling Awaited In Mass Killing

HAMILTON, Ohio (AP) - The three-judge panel that convicted James U. Ruppert of murdering 11 members of his family at an Easter Sunday gathering in his mother's home rules today whether Ruppert should be imprisoned for life or die in the electric chair.

The Hamilton County Common Pleas Court panel convicted Ruppert on a 2-1 vote July 3 in the shooting deaths of his mother, brother, sister-inlaw and eight nieces and Judge Fred B. Cramer dissented, saying he was in-

clined to believe the defense contention that Ruppert was insane at the time of the slayings. The panel would have to rule unanimously that there were no mitigating circumstances in order for the 41-

#### **New Draft Method Studied**

The date for this year's crop of 18-year-olds hasn't been set yet but it probably will be early in 1976 on a day to be

Draft Director Byron V. Pepitone said he hopes to enlist thousands of volunteers to help in the registration so there will be no tedious waiting in line by the young men for the brief signup process.



### IRS Wrongdoings Must Be Stopped

Disclosure that the Internal Revenue Service has been engaged in spying on the affairs of private citizens in the United States of America may be a blessing in disguise.

Thou ands of Americans who have hang-up about the methods and conducts of the IRS now have something to get their teeth into. Telephone taps, clandestine bugging and undetected recording of conversations all are clearly outside the legal purview of the federal tax-collecting agency. The IRS should be obliged to answer for all these repugnant acts, not just because they represent an invasion of the privacy which is the right of every citizen, but because they also constitute a misapplication of public funds.

The country was understandably outraged by news that the Central Intelligence Agency had spied on private citizens. There has been a rash of investigations of the CIA, some of which have departed widely from their original purpose. They undoubtedly have damaged our capability to amass the international intelligence we need for survival in a dog-eat-dog world.

As wicked and unpalatable as the CIA conduct was, however, it can at least be said that its illegal prying into domestic affairs was aimed at helping preserve our national security. The motive had something to do with the welfare and safety of the very people whose privacy was being invaded.

Not so with the IRS. Its spying was not aimed at protecting the national security in any remote sense. It was simply checking surrepitously to see if taxpayers were telling all on their income tax

The IRS has the authority to require taxpayers to document every statement they make on a tax Russian-backed parties, as has occurred in Latin return. Indeed, as many taxpayers know, the agency can be meticulous to the point of harassment in this auditing process. The agency has just assigned a formidable corps of auditors, economists and other experts to examine the books of 50 large corporations simply on the suspicion that they may have concealed illegal political contributions or pay-offs in foreign countries.



### RAY CROMLEY Mao Wants U.S. Presence In Asia

Mao Tse-tung is now engaged in an all-out effort to get the United States and West Europe to snatch his chestnuts out of the fire.

He's intent on selling the United States on keeping a strong enough force in the waters off Southeast Asia and a sufficient diplomatic and economic presence to blunt Russian expansion. He has an abiding fear of Soviet encirclement, which seems high on the list of Kremlin aims. And Mao also hopes, through a continued United States presence, to keep the door open for the building of a more effective Chinese - sponsored underground in Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore

It is clear that after Laos, Vietnam and Cambodia, Mao is not worried that American operations in Asia will be any bar to the particular brand of underground subversion and guerrilla warfare in which he has proven his technical genius. On the contrary, a buildup of America, Africa and in South Asia, could prove a

Mao's stay-in-Asia messages to the United States comes in the form of covert hints to sources close to American diplomatic circles. Mao has learned, by careful observation, that U.S. foreign service officers, the State Department hierarchy and selected influential academic leaders jump much more quickly to

The Chinese have also let it be known in Japan again "secretly" but taking care to make certain end the alliance that country has with the United States. As has been well reported, they confidentially told President Marcos of the Philippines they had no objection to American bases in his country. Mao's men have also hinted strongly they are in no hurrry to acquire Taiwan,

### Captain Slays Lover's Brother; Ghost Returns To Haunt House

There is a house in Beaufort, Ga., the oldest one still standing, that is called the Hammock House. It was bought and maintained by a group of sea captains as a rest house and was fitted with the most luxurious appointments. Here, families of the captains stayed and elaborate parties were given. It was the forerunner of the private club of today with a very exclusive clientele.

It seems that one captain had arranged to meet his fiance there and marry her in an elaborate ceremony. She left home in the East to travel by land. He, of course came by sea in his ship.

Her trip was on schedule and she arrived on time at Hammock House. He, on the other hand, was plagued by illness among his crew and by bad weather. As he became more and more overdue, he grew increasingly distraught until, arriving in Beaufort, he was in a frenzy. The house, incidently, is called the Hammock House

because it occupies one of those rare pieces of slightly higher ground called a hummock, used by the old seamen as a sighting point to take bearings so they could navigate the inlet. Since the house was built on the slight rise it was easily visible from sea.

The evening that the captain arrived, he saw the house ablaze with lights and obviously a party was going on. Now, the people at the house were not a bit worried about the Captain because he was a superb seaman and they felt no mishap could possibly have befallen him. The Captain didn't see it this way. In his frenzy of

impatience he felt a tremendous wave of self-pity which turned to rage when he felt that no one was a bit worried about him or cared if he had been lost at sea.

To make matters worse, his fiance had encountered her brother while in Beaufort. He was a young British officer and his ship was stationed at Beaufort. Not having seen or heard from his sister for a long time, they spent the days waiting for the arrival of her husband-to-be in visiting and catching up on news of each other.

They were walking arm-in-arm when the enraged captain appeared on the scene. The brother had just kissed his sister on the cheek when the Captain arrived. Seeing this tender action, he did not wait for any explanations but immediately attacked the soldier and ought him ferociously.

The young soldier's companions were prevented from intervening because the Captain's crewmen held everyone at bays with their swords and guns. Despite all efforts to explain, the captain continued to attack and finally drove the young officer up the stairs three flights to the attic.

Here the young man could go no further. Lunging, he lost his footing and the Captain ran him through with his daggar. Both fell backwards down the stairs. When they reached the bottom, the Captain disentangled himself and ran with his men out the door and back to his ship. He rapidly put out to sea and was heard of no more. He probably never even knew the identity of his victim.

The soldier died the next morning and, at his request, was buried in full dress uniform at attention standing up. His grave may still be seen in the Old Burying Ground in Beaufort. To this day he stands facing England in salute to King George II. The house now has its ghost and the blood stains on

the stairs resist all attempts at removal even with modern day chemicals. It is said that the dread cries of battle and dying men can be heard on a dark night and if you listen carefully, you can sometimes hear the sounds of music and laughter coming from the house.

## Redman Cops Formula 5000 Go At Glen

WATKINS GLEN, N.Y. (AP) - Brian Redman of England and Mario Andretti of Nazareth, Pa., have been taking turns winning Formula 5000 races this year, and Sunday was Redman's turn. Redman cruised to victory after dueling half the race with Jackie Oliver of England, who finally skidded off the course and out of the race. Andretti, meanwhile, had ignition trouble at the very start of the 30-lap, 101.31-mile race over the winding 3.37mile Watkins Glen road racing course and fell to the back of the

Redman earlier won the Formula 5000 at the Pocono circuit in Pennsylvania, the first in the nine-race series, after Andretti blev an engine. But Andretti won at Mosport in Canada, nipping Redman by only 6-10 of a second.

And so, the stage was set Sunday for a showdown between th pair in the third race of the nine-race series. Unfortunately, Andretti had to leave the battle to Redman and

And quite a battle it was, with Oliver leading for 14 laps and Redman right on his tail. Redman said later that he knew Oliver was going to have trouble because of leaking oil from the engine. "I couldn't pass him" Redman said. "He wouldn't let me. He weaved, and he shut me off."

Redman's opportunity finally came on the 15th lap, and he shot ahead of Oliver on a straightaway. Four laps later it was all over for Oliver, who blew his engine and skidded off the course at a 90-

and Andretti had both shattered previous lap records for a race here in preliminary heats. Andretti, after getting his faulty ignition fixed, fought his way back through the field and finished six. He even had one lap at

122.774-miles-an-hour that surpassed Mark Donohue's old record of 122.096 set in a Porsche during a 1973 Can Am race. Earlier in the day, Tom Bagley of State College, Pa., won a 19lap, 64.16-mile race for speedly little Super Vees which, like the Formula 5000 cars, are open-cockpit, single-seat, rearengine

Bagley zipped around the course at an average speed of 102.54-The weekend of racing at the Glen began Saturday with a Six Hours of Endurance race for sports cars.
