FOOTBALL TO THE FRENCH

Headlining his story, "On Ohio Football Field—A Whole Series of Boxing Matches Where the Knockout is King," Gaston Bense, special correspondent in New York City for the Paris Soir, largest afternoon newspaper in France, covers a football game as seen through the eyes of a Frenchman.

"Lay Off, Or Else"

The receipt of an anonymous letter by Assistant States Attorney L. F. Boyle, who has been directing the Grand Jury's investigation into the lottery racket, warning him to "lay off," only serves to substantiate the belief that the "local boys" engaged in operating Cuba and Bolita here are not the "big shots" in the racket at all, but are merely members of a gigantic ring fleecing the public in every part of the state, and perhaps all over the country.

The introduction of gangster methods in attempting to intimidate the Assistant States Attorney and the members of the Grand Jury from performing their sworn duty is foreign to the peace loving citizens of Seminole County, even that portion of our people who might upon occasions engage in minor infractions of the law. The "lay off, or else" attitude, however, is quite characteristic of the New York and Chicago racketeers whose use of the "trigger man" is as much a part of their daily chores, as bribery of high public officials.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation has recently disclosed the operation of huge dope rings, controlled by a few men in New York, but reaching out over the entire country, with agents in almost every town, and scores of salesmen, disposing of millions of dollars worth of drugs and narcotics to thousands upon thousands of weak-minded persons whose lives are thus destroyed. It is hardly less improbable that the Cuba and Bolita games which we have seen operated here in Sanford are but parts of the great nationwide lottery racket controlled by a few crooks in New York or Chicago.

Japan Seizes Wire Control Over Shanghai

All Communications Even In International Area Are Held By Japanese Armies Advance Against Chinese Matsui Intimates Advance May Continue Far Beyond Nanking

SHANGHAI, Nov. 26.—(AP)—Japan tightened her grip on Shanghai today by taking over the control of all communication facilities hitherto held by the Chinese government in the International Settlement as well as in native parts of the city.

Post offices, telegraph and radio administrations and broadcasting stations were all placed under Japanese rule. Many of the principal offices of these services were in the International Settlement.

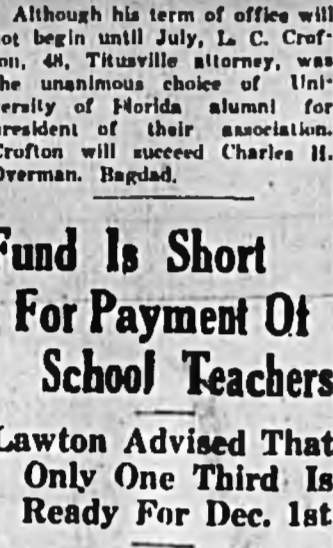
The spearhead units of Japan's Shanghai advance today in a drive their commander-in-chief declared would force the speedy collapse of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek's regime.

Field officers sent back word to Japanese headquarters that their troops had crossed Lake Tai, the great natural barrier between Shanghai and Nanking, for a push against the virtually evacuated capital.

General Wang Matsui, commander of the Japanese forces, is expected to be in Nanking today, that his advance might be forced to invade the interior for the Yangtze from Nanking, unless Chiang's government offers its resistance. In Nanking Chiang appeared undaunted.

Fund Is Short For Payment Of School Teachers

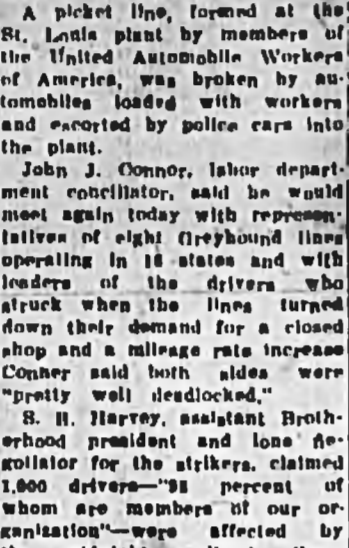
Lawton Advised That Only One Third Is Ready For Dec. 1st

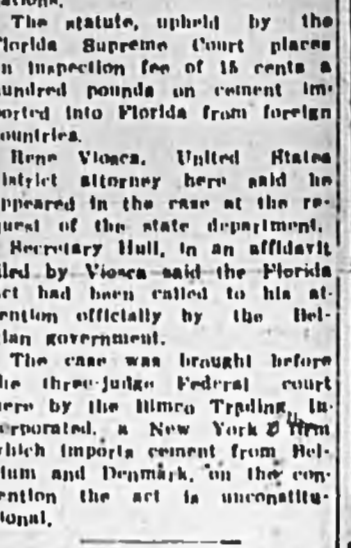

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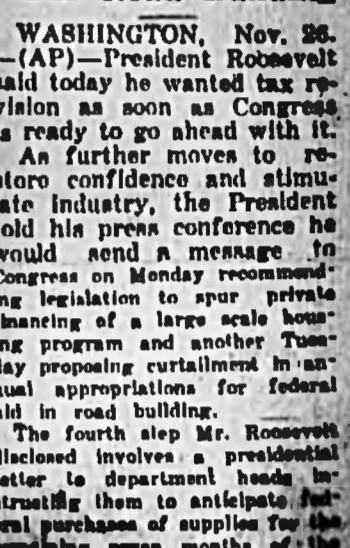
