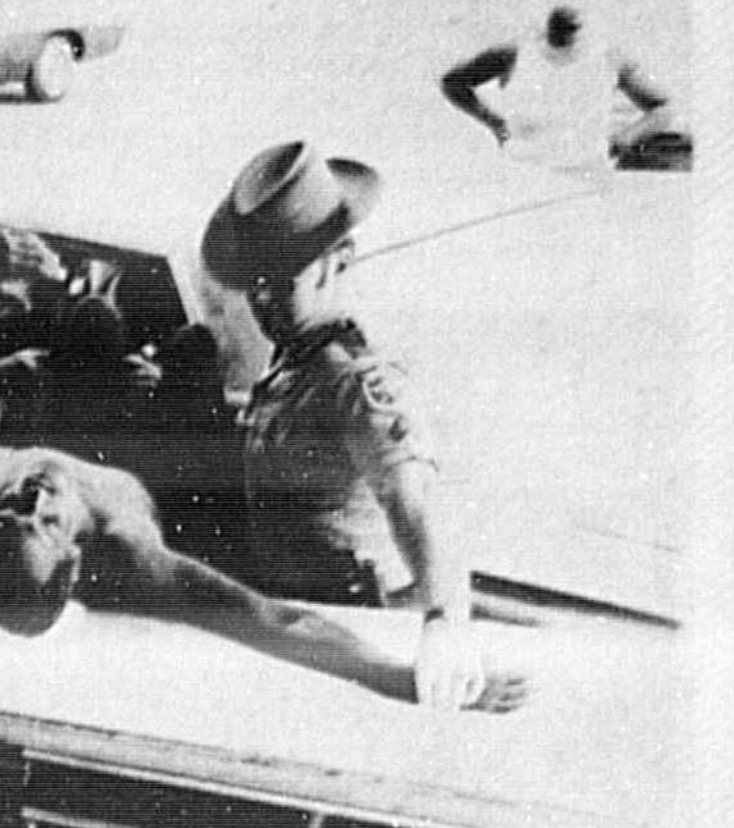

County Board To Talk Dog
A county wide dog control ordinance is first on the agenda for today's morning workshop session, before commissioners swing into preliminary discussions of the Lake Monroe Utilities problems.
Drawn up by Assistant County Atty. Howard Marsee, Jr., the ordinance will provide penalties for owners failing to have their pets inoculated, but adds incentives in the form of decreased licensing fees for owners who have vaccines applied.
Also included in the draft ordinance is a tough "anti-poll" provision which would make it a misdemeanor for owners to allow their pets to foul public streets and property.
After a scheduled discussion of efforts to tighten the ordinance's existing classification, the board will resume hearings begun last week on efforts by Lake Monroe officials to clear up effluent problems.

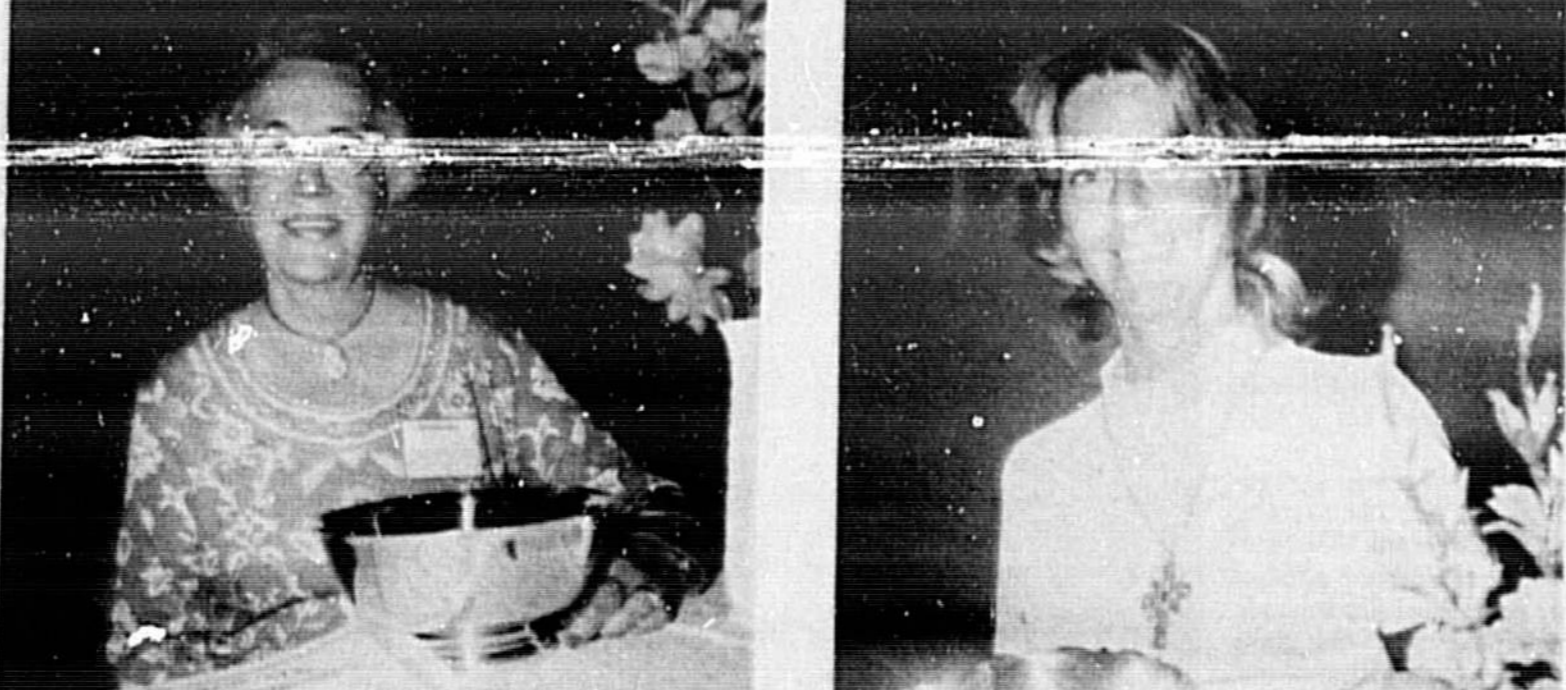

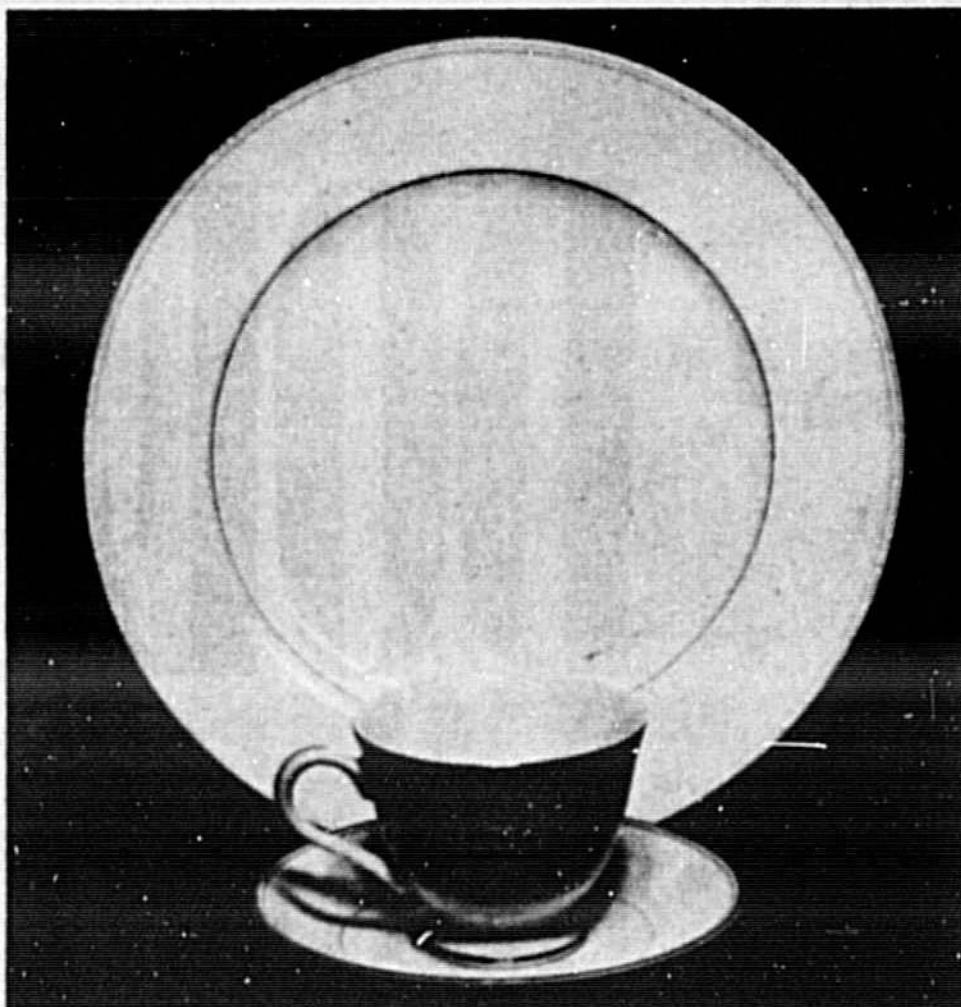

Senate Endorses Obscenity Pickets

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP)—Citizens would be encouraged to picket bookstores or movie houses "for the purpose of upholding community standards" under a tough anti-obscenity bill adopted by the Senate.

Requested by Gov. Reubin Askew, the bill also would make felons out of twice-convicted pornographers, subjecting them to possible five-year prison sentences.

It would prohibit any display or distribution—even privately—of material demonstrating "a shameful or morbid interest in nudity, sex or exhibition."

The bill was approved by the Senate 92-3 Tuesday and sent to the House where a more liberal version is awaiting floor action.

All three senators who voted against the bill, Miami Democrats Jack Gordon, Kenneth Myers and Richard Pettigrew, argued unsuccessfully that it was unconstitutional.

The demonstration amendment was added, said sponsor W. D. Childers, D-Pensacola, "to encourage local church groups and civic clubs to picket" when they objected to a local X-rated movie or adult book store.

"They could sing or pass out tracts," said Childers.

Orlando Holding Key To Pollution Problems?

Orlando may hold the key to solving pollution problems in Lake Howell and Jessup, but key decisions are not expected for several weeks, Seminole County commissioners were told Tuesday.

President Confesses Limiting Investigation

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Nixon, acknowledging "apparently wide-ranging efforts" to cover up the Watergate burglary, said he intervened only to bar the FBI from looking into secret "national security activities."

Declaring he will not resign, Nixon issued two statements Tuesday disclaiming any knowledge of or participation in illegal activities.

While conceding he is under heavy fire, Nixon said: "I will not abandon my responsibilities. I will continue to do the job I was elected to do."

The longer of the two presidential statements sought to deal, point by point, with much of the testimony and other disclosures widely deemed to be potentially most damaging to the chief executive.

In a 4,000-word defense of his conduct, Nixon argued repeatedly that "grossly misleading impressions" concerning his role can be explained by his concern for protecting national security interests.

"In citing these national security matters, it is not my intention to place a national security 'cover' on Watergate," he said, "but rather to separate them out from Watergate."

He said this is necessary because "national security matters are now threatened with disclosure."

Nixon Linked To 'Clemency'

WASHINGTON (AP)—John F. Caulfield justified today that when he offered executive clemency to Watergate burglar James W. McCord Jr., it was with the understanding that only the President of the United States could deliver on such a promise.

But Caulfield told Senate investigators once again that he had no knowledge President Nixon "made such an offer, endorsed such an offer or in fact had extended such an offer."

Caulfield said he viewed himself as a messenger between John W. Dean III, then White House counsel, when he met with McCord to offer executive clemency in exchange for silence about the Watergate conspiracy.

Samuel Dashi, counsel to the Senate's Watergate committee, questioned Caulfield in detail about the offer of executive clemency.

Nixon said Tuesday he authorized no offer of clemency and was not aware of any.

Caulfield said he talked with "the White House" but Mr. Dean "before relaying the clemency message."

Nixon first Dean on April 30. Caulfield agreed that he was guessing when he believed the "high White House source" referred to by Dean meant John D. Ehrlichman, then a top Nixon adviser.

But Caulfield repeated he never talked directly to Ehrlichman about executive clemency, although he did continue to have occasional contact with Ehrlichman on other matters.

Sen. Sam J. Ervin announced at the outset of today's hearings, the fourth day of the televised inquiry, that questions were being limited to the executive clemency matter.

This precluded questioning about secret investigations that Caulfield supervised on orders of former presidential adviser John D. Ehrlichman. The committee intends to question Caulfield about this at a later time.

Lt. Aubrey Oprey of Orlando, acting Troop D commander, who Capt. H. A. Weaver is on vacation, presided over the

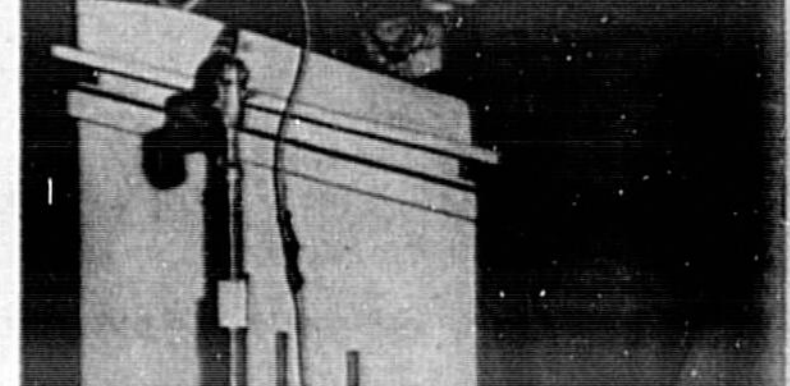
ceremonies, and presented certificates to the graduates.
