Women Should Learn To Carve Turkey

A lot of women who've never carved before are going to carve the bird this holiday season—or not have the bird to eat, unless they just tear it apart, which is a messy and wasteful business. Because turkeys are so scarce, I'm going to tell you how to carve a chicken. It isn't hard, but it does take know-how.

First of all, be sure that the carving knife is sharpened to perfection. Before you start your carving career please take my word for it that a sharp knife is indispensable and thus improve your technique before you've even tried it!

Place the chicken on its platter before you with the legs to the right. Now insert the carving fork about in the center of the bird so its prongs straddle the breast bone. It remains there through the entire carving.

First step in carving is to remove the second joint and leg in one operation. Start through the skin between the thigh and the body, following the seam to the back bone socket. Now grasp the end of the drumstick with your fingers and with the blunt edge of the knife bend the whole piece down toward the platter. At this point you will see the ball socket, which you now cut with the point of the carving knife. Separate the drumstick from the second joint, or serve them as one piece, whichever you prefer.

The second step in carving the chicken is to remove the wing. Insert the carving knife to a nearly horizontal position and insert it in the section of the wing nearest the body. Cut down and force the joint.

Now the chicken is stripped of everything that gets in the way of carving the breast. Slice from the breast bone down and make your slices about an eighth of an inch thick. If you're trying to stretch the bird to serve a lot of people you may make the slices thinner, but if you do they'll resemble paper in flavor as well as appearance, and that's presumably not precisely what you wish to serve your guests.

Have a spoon handy to take out a serving of stuffing for each person. Here, by the way, is a stuffing which will dress in your chicken in holiday style.

SPECIAL STUFFING.

4 slices stale cracked wheat bread.
 1/8 teaspoon poultry seasoning
 1/8 teaspoon sweet marjoram
 Dish of celery seed
 Salt and pepper
 1 cup chopped pecans
 2 slices crushed crisp bacon
 2 tablespoons margarine
 Milk

1. Sift bread crumbs into a bowl. Break remaining slice into crumbs. Combine the two and mix with seasonings and nuts. Add melted margarine, salt and egg, slightly beaten. Toss lightly. Add just enough milk to moisten and hold ingredients together lightly.

I belong to the you-do-it-better-when-you-stand-up school of carving. All the most magnificent men carvers I know stand for the operation. For a woman, particularly a small one, I think it's even more important. Besides, it adds an air of ceremony to the occasion and that's a proper air for one of our most American holidays.

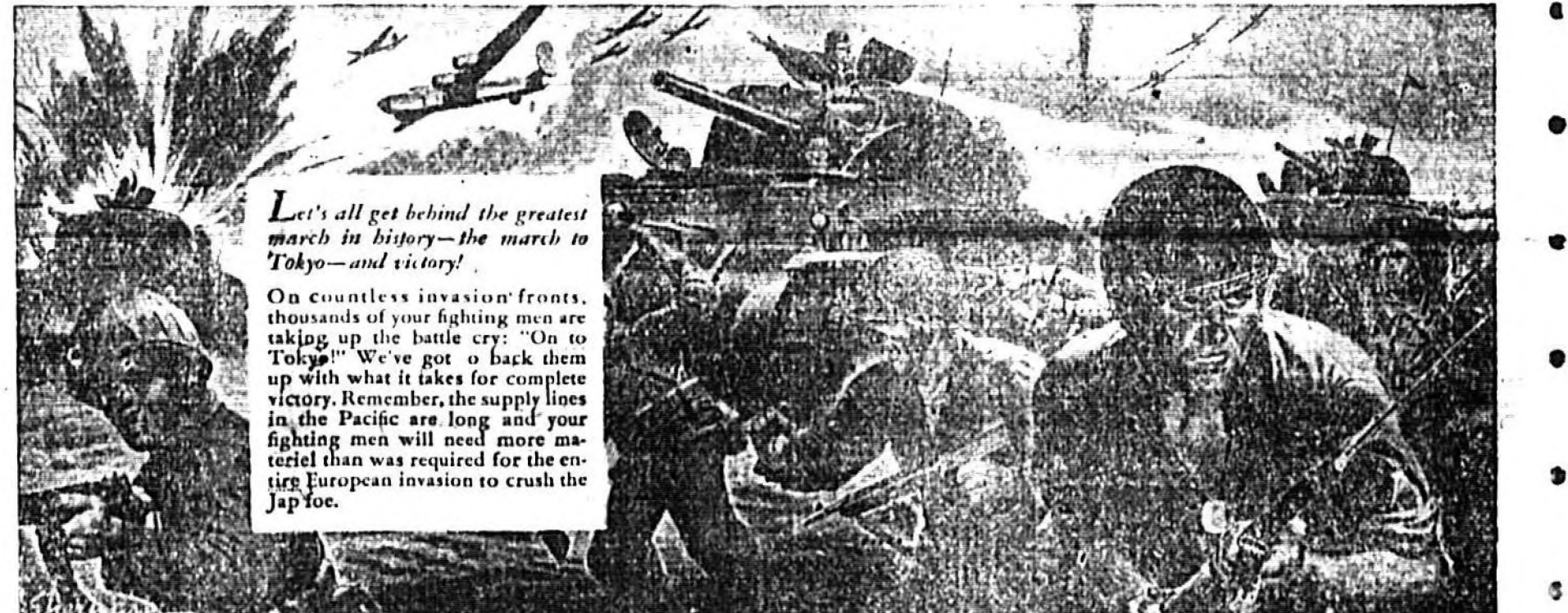

(Continued From Page One) ranging up to ten miles, were made in the center along a 26-mile front inside Germany's Saar Basin.

Other Americans in the Cologne plain east of Aachen fought for every house, and cellar in the ruin villages of Inden, Langerwehe, Lamersdorf and Grosshau. Some are within 23 miles of Cologne.

Surging along the full breath of eastern Slovakia, the Russians captured 60 localities after fording the flooded streams, and setting within 25 miles of the strongholds of Kassa and Presov.

Civilians Evacuated. A front dispatch from Lewis Hawkins, Associated Press correspondent, said some prisoners reported non-essential civilians already were being evacuated from the three cities, as well as from the French border cities of Sarreguemines and Forbach.

At the same time, the Ninth Division moved up to the Saar border at a new quarter beyond Geratling, eight miles southwest of Merzig.

On the Alsace front in the south the U. S. Seventh and French First armies were clearing the remaining Germans from the Vosges mountains and Alsatian plain and strengthening their northern flank after solving the Saverne-Nisourg corridor to 20 miles.

The doughboys in Kirchberg and Barmen had to wade through knee-deep water from the flooded Saar. They captured an entire German battalion and its headquarters in the outskirts of Merzenhausen.

The Third Army however, continued to score notable advances. Its Ninety Fifth Division plunged over the German border from the vicinity of Villing in a two-mile advance that carried a mile inside Germany and three and one-half miles from Saarlautern.

The federal pocketbook supplied grants and loans for projects.

No obligation. Furthermore, congress has declared clearly that it is assuming no obligation to provide any construction cash just because Prairie Ridge gets a \$5000 loan from FWA to draft plans for a \$100,000 waterworks.

FWA estimates \$8,000,000,000 of construction may be needed if public works projects are to carry their proportionate share of the employment load in the first post-war year.

But states and their subdivisions thus far have plans ready for only \$1,000,000,000 of building. The \$75,000,000 asked of congress today would let them blueprint another \$1,500,000,000.

Counts On Them

Beyond that, FWA is counting on them for still another \$1,000,000,000 of construction to help make-up the \$5,000,000,000 total. Thus their portion of it would be \$2,500,000,000.

State and federal aid highways are relied on for \$1,000,000,000 and all federal developments, such as flood control and river and harbor improvements, are listed for \$500,000,000.

FWA officials already are advising potential applicants for blueprint loans that they won't have to bring their cases to Washington. Their applications will be handled almost entirely through field offices and regional directors.

And they are being told that a football stadium will receive less favorable attention than some project making a more direct contribution to community welfare or health such as a school or sewer-system or hospital.

Statistics Show Cost Of War To Great Britain

Total casualties of 733,000, including 156,115 civilians killed and wounded and 29,829 merchant seamen killed; the export trade, basis of Britain's wealth and power—virtually abandoned; overseas gold reserves spent on war materials; one home in three damaged and one in 31 destroyed; more than 5,500 factories damaged; monotonous diet, strictly rationed clothing, high taxes.

"We have sacrificed most of our Victorian inheritance," said Minister of Information Brendan Bracken in a press conference after the release of the documents. "What was the treasure of our grandfathers has gone, and it has been well and gladly sacrificed."

Britain, he said gave up her export business at the start of the war and converted the whole of her manpower to the making and using of war goods. Her workers since have produced more than 102,000 planes, 25,000 tanks, 35,000 guns, 5,700 ships.

In five years her people have paid approximately \$15,900,000,000 in income tax and other direct taxes and have turned over to the government approximately \$19,248,000,000 in personal savings.

"The Victorians' Bracken observed, "were proud to be called a nation of shopkeepers, but there never have been such shopkeepers as the British. No shopkeepers ever before sold out their entire stocks in order to fight."

Bracken said that Britain's large gold reserves in the United States at the beginning of the war "have all been paid over and the money spent in building up American munitions industries."

"This expenditure," he added, "helped America come into the war with her industries already in a position of a wartime footing. We are glad to have rendered this service to the United States as a small return for her tremendous generosity to us."

The white paper related statistics relating to the war effort of the United Kingdom, disclosed that Britain has mustered 80 per cent of all her men in uniform, 16 of 40 in the armed forces and has called up 55 per cent of her women of the same ages for the military services or for munitions work.

Argentine Militarism

D'olier Lists Statistics On Help Investors Receive From War Bonds

By Colonel Franklin D'olier (Chairman, New Jersey State War Finance Committee, and President, Prudential Insurance Company of America.)

In addition to giving those of us who must stay at home a chance to assist in the prosecution of the war, our investments in war bonds enable us to help ourselves in many ways, not the least of which is in the control of inflation. The money we put into these bond purchases is temporarily removed from our control and may, therefore, not

be used in bidding up the prices for the things we actually buy. As in life insurance where progress in supplying the needs of the community for protection is measured by the increase in the amount of insurance in force on the backs of the companies, so in the fight against inflation real progress is measured by the actual increase in the amount of war bonds outstanding. Series E bonds, which have been referred to as "People's Bonds" are, of course, most important in this connection. These bonds have been

specially designed for ordinary everyday people who have money to spend, money which if not invested in bonds might easily become inflationary money. The following figures, which have been supplied by the Treasury Department, indicate the growth in the outstanding total of Series E bonds, by quarters, since the beginning of 1943. The increases are due not only to sales, but also to the increment in the value of the bonds outstanding.

It will be noted that substantial progress has been made in the fight against inflation as the figures indicate that the amount outstanding has shown a consistent increase each quarter year. In the first six months of this year alone there has been an increase of more than \$5,000,000,000. Naturally the increase would have been greater if there had not also been an increase in the redemptions due to bond purchasers surrendering their bonds before maturity. In this connection it is important to remember that before there can be any real increase in the outstanding bonds each bond redeemed must be replaced by another sale. Therefore, the amount redeemed each quarter year would increase even if the rate of redemptions remained the same because of the increase in the amount outstanding.

While, as intimated above, there has been a substantial increase in bond redemptions it is also important to consider the fact that these increased redemptions arise from the increased amount of bonds outstanding. In other words, the amount redeemed each quarter year would increase even if the rate of redemptions remained the same because of the increase in the amount outstanding.

Actually there has been an increase in the rate of redemption as well as in the amount redeemed, although the increase in rate has been small as compared with the increase in amount. This is shown rather clearly in the following table:

while the actual amount of redemptions in the second quarter of 1944 were almost three times the redemptions in the first quarter of 1943, the quarterly redemption rate increased only about one-fourth.

It will be recognized that increasing redemption efforts have been made in each of the loan drives to secure a larger number of subscribers. As more and more new subscribers have been brought in it is obvious that they are reaching the levels where families and individuals have small, if any, cash reserves. As these levels are reached redemption rates must necessarily be expected to increase. The family, for example, which places every dollar not needed for current living expenses in bonds, must obviously turn to these bonds when funds are needed in an emergency.

Somewhat similar results have long been noted in the experience of life insurance companies. The lowest rate of termination of life insurance policies is found in the ordinary class of policies which are written for amounts of \$1,000 or more, usually with annual premiums; industrial policies which are sold for small amounts, up to about \$500, and paid for by weekly premiums, have consistently shown higher termination rates than ordinary policies; and intermediate policies for amounts up to \$1,000 with monthly premiums show termination rates in between industrial and ordinary. In the case of one company, for example, the termination rate as a percentage of the business in force at the beginning of the year was 1.7 per cent for ordinary policies, 2.1 per cent for intermediate policies, and 2.9 per cent for industrial policies for the full year of 1943.

These life insurance lapse rates are among the lowest on record and they are the result of many years of effort on the part of the company to enlighten its policyholders on the advantages of keeping necessary life insurance in force.
