

Jet Over Singapore?

SINGAPORE (UPI) - Who were the gunmen who hijacked a Malaysian Airlines jetliner and fought a gunbattle aboard the plane before the craft exploded and plunged into the swamps of southern Malaysia? That was the question being asked today

after the deaths of all 107 aboard the Boeing 737 that was seized Sunday. Some sources said the hijackers were members of the Japanese Red Army guerrillas.

2,000 Protest Madrid Death

MADRID, Spain (UPI) - An estimated 2,000 left-wingers smashed shop windows and hurled fire bombs Sunday night to protest the death of a youth shot by police in a new outbreak of violence in the Costa del Sol capital of

The violence was sparked by the death of Manuel Garcia, a 19-year-old factory worker who was shot by police earlier in the day during a demonstration by some 200,000 persons in favor of home rule for Andalusia.

TRIPOLI, Libya (UPI) - Iraq walked out of an Arab hard-liner summit today but the remaining Arab leaders and the Palestine Liberation Organization signed an agreement freezing diplomatic relations with Egypt. The walkout by the Iraqis, who complained the anti-Egyptian measures were not strong enough, lessened the success of the meeting, called by Libyan leader Moammer Khadafy to try to isolate President Anwar Sadat. Algeria, Libya, Syria, Southern Yemen and the PLO signed the accord, which included a new military pact, termed the "Front of Steadfastness" that said "an attack on one is an attack on all."

It was not immediately clear what the diplomatic freeze Sadat has recalled his ambassadors to the anti-Egyptian countries.

\$6 Billion State Budget?

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) - Gov. Reubin Askew this week begins the long process of establishing the state's spending program for the 1978-79 fiscal year, when the final budget may hit the \$6 billion mark for the first time. State agencies have put before the governor requests totaling \$6.5 billion. That is \$773 million more than they received in the current budget, which topped the \$5 billion mark for

the first time in Florida history. This will be the last annual budget. The Legislature has decided to go back to the old custom of several years ago of adopting biennial budgets, starting July 1, 1979.

Smathers: Let Teachers Be Tested, Too to make any change in the certification program, it would

By BARBARA FRYE TALLAHASSEE (UPI) Motivated partially by the high rate of failures of 11th graders taking the new functional literacy test, Secretary of State Bruce Smathers proposed today that teachers be required to take an examination to prove their competency in reading, writing, communication and

Smathers conceded that the idea may generate law suits against the school system in cases where a teacher whose students flunked their literacy tests did poorly on the exam. "If we're not doing the job, there is a need to correct it right away and if, in the process, we get sued, that is a side effect," BRUCE SMATHERS he said. "I would hope that the vast

majority would pass without any problem and I assume that they would," he added. Early returns from the 11th grade tests, required this year for the first time, indicate that about one-third of the students

The letter from the revenue-sharing office noted, "The overall workforce of the sheriff's department . . . is 184, and includes 14 7.6 percent) blacks and 52 (28.2 percent) females." "We know we've got a lot of problems," said Chief Sheriff's Deputy Duane Harrell, "but what goes in our application is specified by the state police standards commission. We have no choice. And when we select somebody for employment, the commission gets the application and sees if it's in proper order." The questionnaire used in Seminole is the same as that used by every sheriff's department in the state, and the application asks the same questions of potential employees as does the application for FBI agents, Harrell said.

In addition, he said, "you cannot by law hire anyone who's been convicted of a felony. We have to know a lot about an applicant's background to certify he's of good moral character, another state law requirement," said the chief deputy.

"I think the state's right. You can't be too particular about who you hire to be a police officer. Sheriff Polk was largely responsible for the state legislature's requiring all hiring in all sheriff's departments in the state to be done on a civil service basis," said

The chief deputy said the sheriff's department for over a year has had "an active recruitment program for blacks and females. We have contacted various black-oriented agencies, and we've appealed to black leaders in the county for help. They've been most cooperative, but you can't force anybody to apply for the job of sheriff's deputy if they don't want to. Someone might feel they can make more money elsewhere." When federal investigators were here in August, Harrell said,

"We told them all of this. The investigators did what they felt they had to do. We aren't up to the desired level of minority hiring. We know it, and we're trying to improve the situation." Harrell said promotions in the sheriff's office were made "without regard to race, sex or anything like that. Progress Sans ERA

The 12,000 delegates to the National Women's Conference met in Houston recently and passed a number of recommendations for achieving parity with men: these in due course will be forwarded to Congress and President Carter.

The construction of these recommendations for congressional and presidential contemplation was the point of the conference, for which Congress

shelled out \$5 million in 1973. Yet Betty Friedan, one of the high priestesses of the women's movement, has declared that if the Equal Rights Amendment does not make its way into the Constitution, the conference will prove to have been held in vain.

Very well, suppose the conference does prove to have been held in vain, by Betty Friedan's definition. What then of the 26 recommendations? Is one to suppose that they will lie about collecting dust, on their way to becoming, like

Susan Anthony's gavel, something to be picked up in another century? Or one by one, and in the time of decades, not centuries, will they be considered on Capitol Hill, in statehouses, in courthouses, and in city halls?

The latter it will be.

For example, the conference passed a proposal calling for an end to discrimination against disabled women; in 1973 Congress passed legislation outlawing discrimination against any disabled person, and this past May the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare drew up the requisite regulations. Even the conference's most controversial proposal — the one calling for the elimination of discrimination based on "sexual preference" - is at the committee stage in

Not only has all this been happening, but also it has been happening without the proposed 28th Amendment to the Constitution - the ERA. And this fact should give considerable pause to Betty

Friedan, and those who similarly view the ERA as millions? the precondition for the realization of women's The ERA says: "Equality of rights under the

States or by any state on account of sex." Would women be subject to military conscription? Would women be restricted from combat in time of war? Would they be treated differently with regard to alimony and other divorce matters?

Would the ERA invalidate laws prohibiting nomosexual marriages? Thus, have the questions been raised, and thus

have no answers been reached. None, except the obvious one: the judiciary would have to decide the answers to these and scores of similar questions.

Ideally, the judiciary should not have this power; the Legislature should. The preservation of republican government depends upon this arrangement and, happily, the achievement of the noble goal of women's equality is not incompatible

That is why the 26 specific recommendations drawn up by the Houston conference make that gathering strategically worthwhile. They speak to the political process.

And very probably they will have more to do with effectuating women's equality than the ERA. whose future grows more doubtful by the day.



Test Teachers? No Way, Says Grooms

3rd Graders Score Best

Seminole County educators today announced preliminary results of the third, fifth and eighth grade statewide assessment examinations taken by local students during October. Third grade students throughout the county had the highest scores on both communications and mathematics sections of the test, with 91.3 percent passing communications and 92.0 passing


On the fifth grade level, 90.9 percent of the students passed communications and 89.8 percent passed mathematics. Students in the eighth grade also scored higher than the 70 percent estimated by Florida's Department of Education ofificials. In that grade, 81.7 percent of the students passed the communications test, and 79.1 percent passed the mathematics

section of the test. Weak points on the student scores have not yet been specified, but each child's test results will show specific problem areas. That information, along with test scores, should be sent home t parents by the end of the week, according to school officials. Beginning with the June 1979 graduating class students in Florida schools will be required to pass an 11th grade Functional Literacy Test in order to receive a graduation diploma. The third. fifth and eighth grade tests are designed to locate problem areas before a child reaches high school, so that remedial education may be offered - MARILYN SHEDDAN
