'Discrimination': Some Officials Aim Blame At State Standards

While spokesmen for two Seminole County departments, under fire from the federal Office of Revenue Sharing for allegedly using discriminatory hiring practices, responded, a black personnel analyst who was fired last week said this morning she would appeal the firing.

Here's where the matter stands today: —Arlene Rowell, fired a week ago by Ron Thames, the county's personnel director and affirmative action officer, said she would appeal her unsatisfactory performance rating, which led to the firing, to the County Administrator Roger Neiswander, who will have 30 days to uphold or overturn the firing.

—Diane Harrell, chief sheriff's deputy, said questions on the sheriff's employment questionnaire for hiring deputies which federal investigators have termed "potentially discriminatory" are determined by the state Police Standards Council — not local officials — and that the questions are the same as those asked of prospective FBI agents.

—Don Flippen, chief of the county's building division, said he'd be happy to hire qualified blacks, but that none has applied since he was hired by the county in April 1974.

—Personnel Director Thames said the county would determine its response to the charges after county officials meet with the county's labor attorney, David Kierreich of Miami, when Kierreich returns from his vacation next week.

The charges of discrimination were contained in a letter from Bernadine Denning, director of the federal Office of Revenue Sharing, to County Commission Chairman Dick Williams which the chairman received Nov. 17.

"Please indicate your intentions and efforts to correct the violations cited" within 60 days, the letter says. The county this year will receive \$1.2 million in revenue-sharing funds. Ms. Rowell, hired in October 1976 as the county's budget officer, has worked under Thames' direction since November to find ways to update and implement the county's affirmative action plan, approved by unanimous vote of the county commission in February 1976.

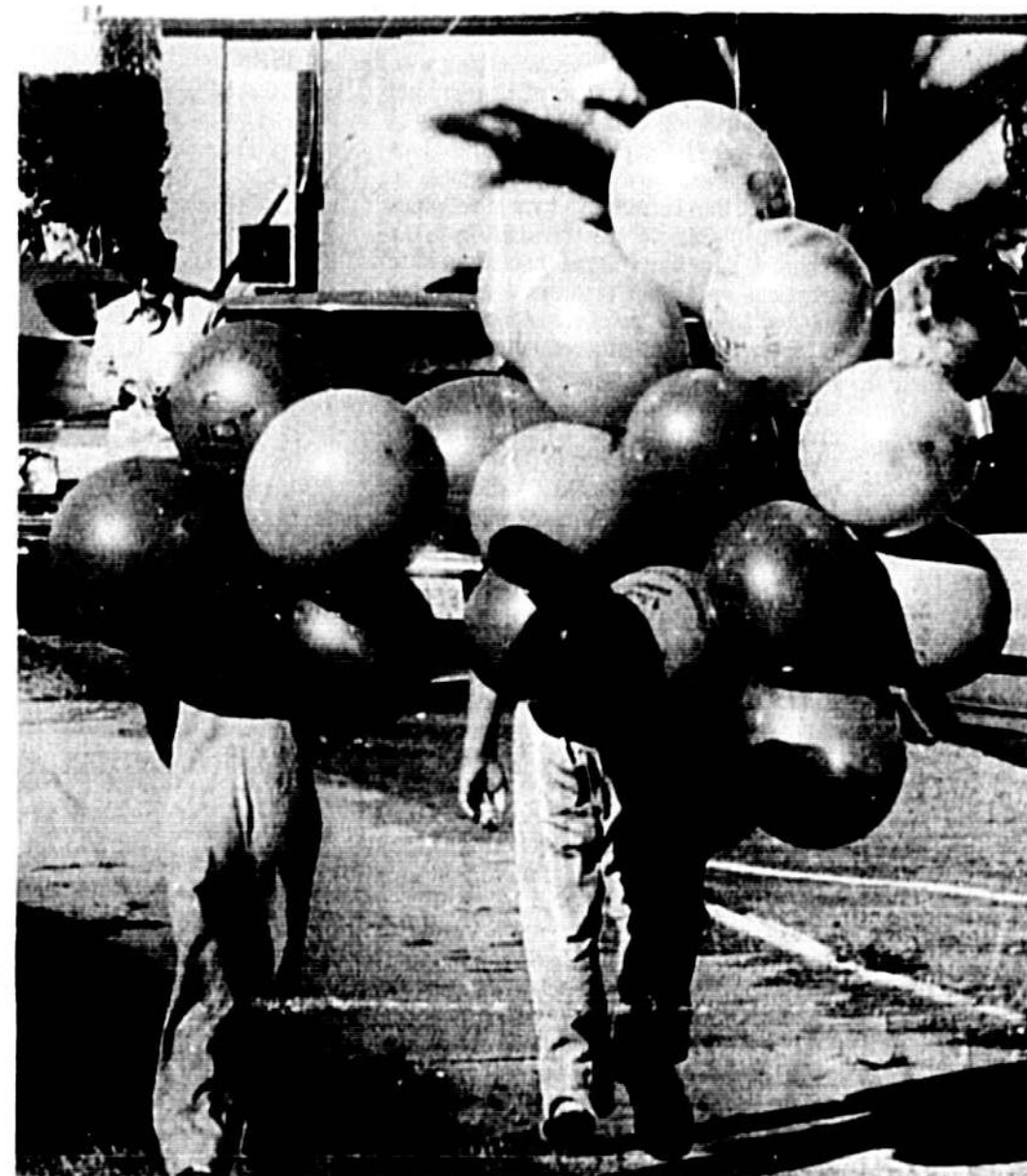
Ms. Rowell — one of three black professionals who work in the courthouse — was fired by Thames after spending a year on probation.

She appealed her firing to Thames' supervisor, Neiswander, who will have 30 days to uphold or overturn Ms. Rowell's firing, under county personnel regulations.

Thames said this morning that if Neiswander upholds her firing, Thames will hire another personnel analyst "whose principal responsibility will be working with me to update the affirmative action plan."

The letter from the revenue-sharing office "requests" county officials to "establish goals and timetables which will enable the workforce of Seminole County government, including the sheriff's office to reflect the county's labor market, which is composed of 16.4 percent blacks and 38 percent females." The letter also requested the sheriff's office to eliminate "potentially discriminatory" employment questionnaire questions regarding

Altamonte Boy Struck By Several Cars

Youth Misses Ride, Hitches From Rock Concert, Killed

Orlando police today are seeking public aid in locating the driver of a yellow Volkswagen that struck and killed an 18-year-old Altamonte Springs boy as he walked along 14 early Sunday morning.

Killed was Robert Mazzula of 410 Auburn St., as he hitchhiked along a well-lighted section of the interstate above Robinson Street in Orlando about 12:30 a.m., according to Orlando police.

Investigating officer Clarence Bass said police are looking for the early model fatback said by an eyewitness

to be the vehicle that first struck the youth.

Bass gave this account of the accident: Mazzula was walking along the eastbound lane of I-4 when, according to the female motorist who said she saw the accident, the yellow Volkswagen went around her eastbound car in the passing lane, swerved back into the outside lane in front of her car and slammed into the boy.

Mazzula, according to Bass, was killed instantly, but dragged 350 feet. However, Bass also said several other vehicles struck the boy after the Volkswagen, "but we're convinced from the evidence

that he was killed in the initial impact."

Officer Bass said among the other vehicles which struck the Mazzula boy was a car driven by an Orlando city commissioner.

He was identified as Commissioner Robert Keith, cousin of Sanford City Commissioner Eldred Keith.

"It was a very sickening sight to see a body lying in the road like that," said Commissioner Keith today. "I have a CB radio

in my car and I reported the incident. Before I could get off I-4 and back on again to see if I could

help, the Orlando Police Department and the ambulance were already there. I did hear

the police found a portion of a beer can and a light at the scene," he said.

Bass urged anyone who might have information about the heavily damaged Volkswagen to contact Orlando police immediately.

Mazzula had driven to Lakeland with a friend Saturday night to attend a rock concert, but he and his friend became separated sometime during the night and he had to hitchhike back to Altamonte Springs, according to Bass.

It was Mark Bascomb of 221 O'Brien Rd., Fern Park, a good friend of Mazzula's who had driven them to Lakeland. Bascomb pieced together the

series of events leading up to their separation at Lakeland.

"We had left Saturday about 4 p.m. to see Styx at the Lakeland Civic Center. We got there about 8:30 p.m. It was so crowded, we got up front as far as we could, but that

crowd pushing, shoving, I guess it was about 9 p.m. when I discovered Bob wasn't with me anymore. I hung around outside after the concert for about an hour and a half, but couldn't find him, so I drove home."

"The next day my father, he's the one who told me that someone was killed on the interstate. I don't know, I got such a funny feeling inside. I figured I'd give Bob's family a

call.

"When I did, they said Bob hadn't returned yet. Then I really sensed something wrong, so I telephoned Orlando police and they told me to come down so they could ask me some questions to see if I could help. I went, and later I identified his

body. I headed for home after that and then I saw Mazzula's brother and told him about it. I guess his brother had to go home to tell Bob's mother."

Bascomb said Mazzula was employed at the Sheraton Inn on Lee Road in Winter Park.

It'll Be Kris, Not Christ, As Music To Some Ears

The name of Christ has been X'd-out of holiday observances in the public school system of Seminole County this year. The school bands will not play Christmas carols, choruses will not sing religious songs and classrooms or schools will not be decorated with anything denoting the birth of the Christ child, under a directive sent to the local public schools by the school administration.

"We sent out a memo to the effect that the schools should be very careful and not depict the Nativity," said Ralph Ray, administrative assistant and public information officer of the school system today.

Turlington's memo concludes: "I would respectfully request that each public official in this state re-examine the practices in his particular school district and attempt, in all good faith, to respond to the courts' interpretation of the Constitution by developing and implementing policies and practices consistent with these interpretations."

The Turlington memo pointed to court decisions banning the use of school premises after school hours for religious instruction, except on a temporary basis, in keeping with the principle of separation of church and state; the banning of the showing of films to students which depict various religious happenings and are thereby religious in nature and thus constitute a form of religious teaching; the distribution of free Bibles in the schools; and banning of baccalaureate programs on school premises even on an optional basis outside of school hours.

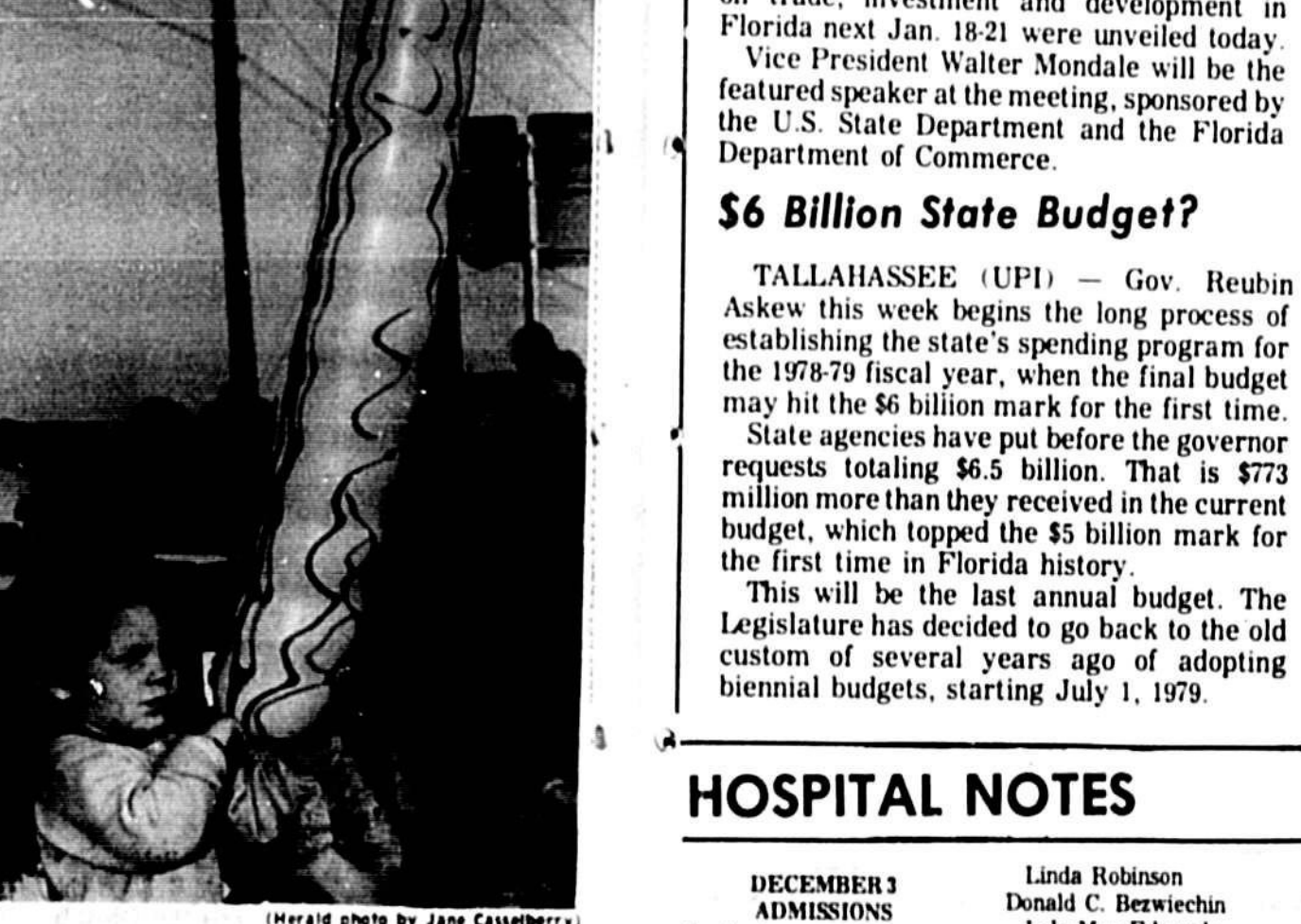
"We interpret this to mean a 'Christmas tree' is not to be set up in the school building," said Ray.

Motivated partially by the high rate of failures of 11th graders taking the new functional literacy test, Secretary of State Bruce Smathers proposed today that teachers be required to take an examination to prove their competency in reading, writing, communication and math.

"I would hope that the vast majority would pass without any problem and I assume that they would," he added.

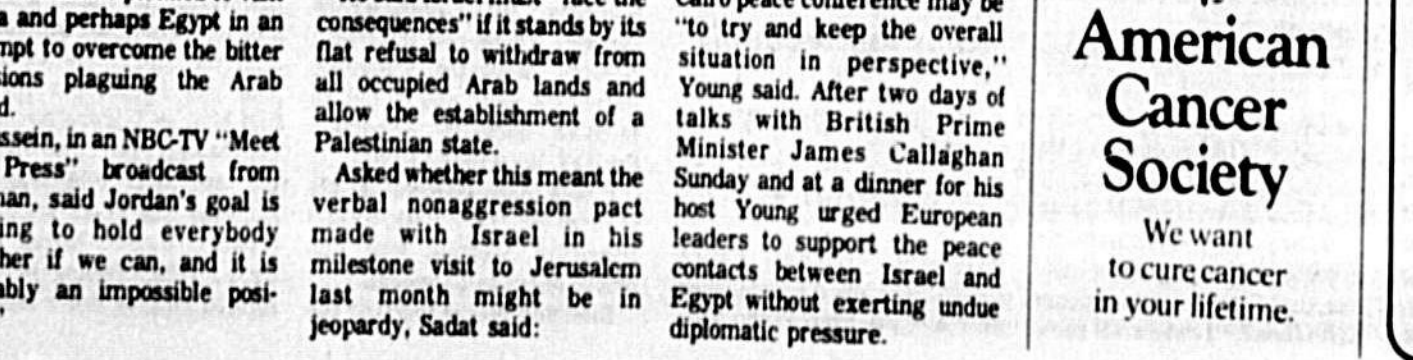

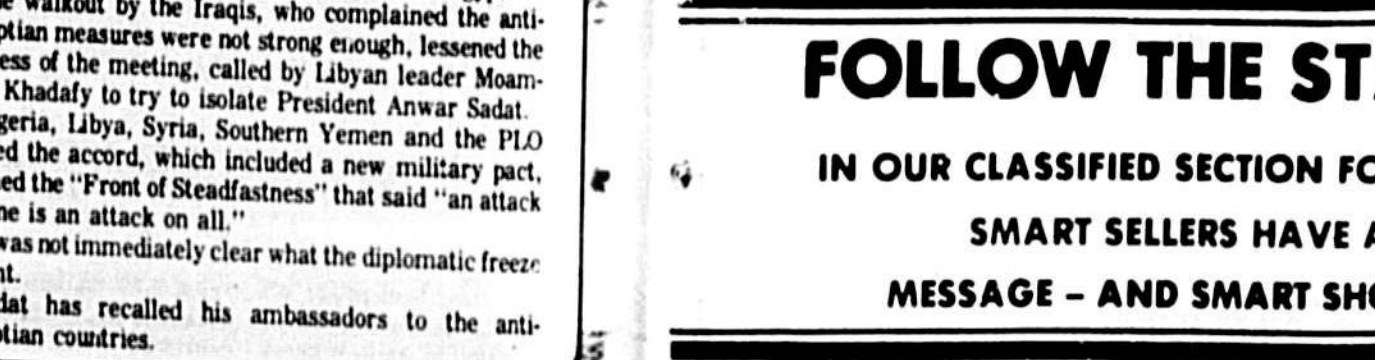

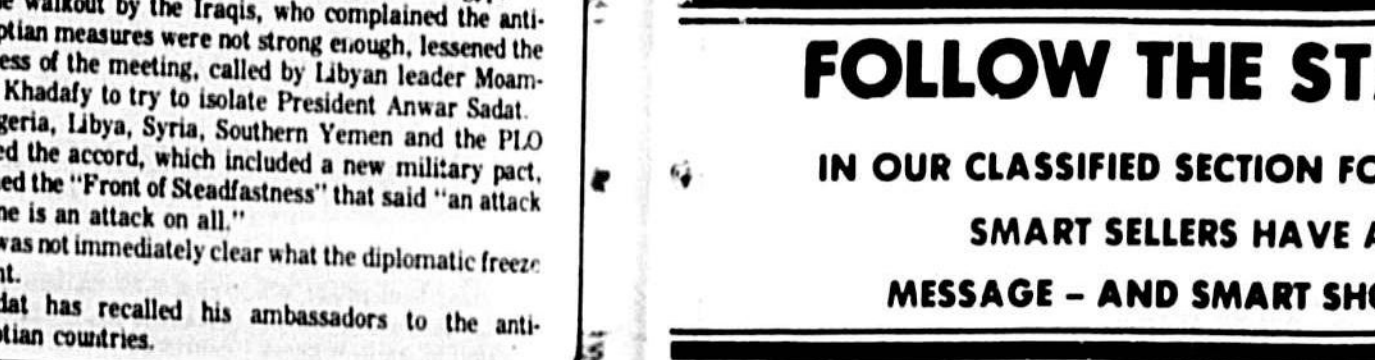
Sadat Shuns Arab Barbs, Appeals To Israel For Moves

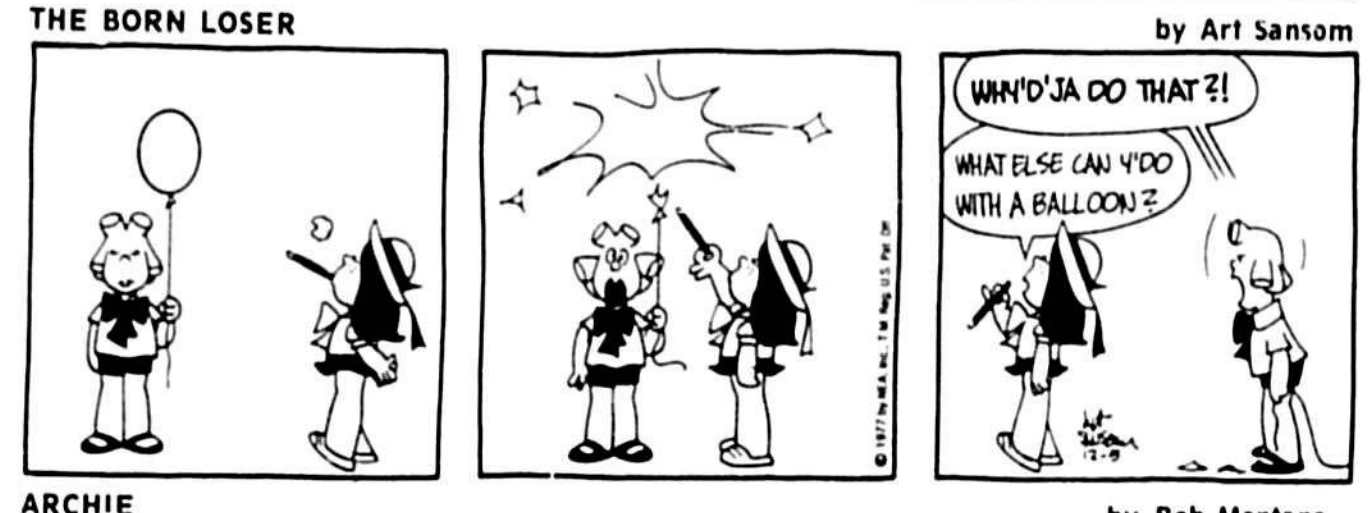

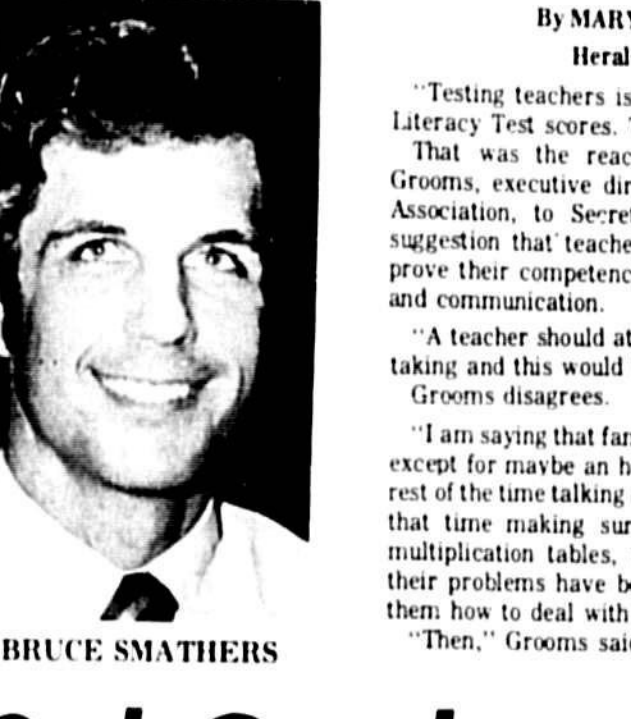

Minorities, Women Targeted County, U.S.: A Hiring Huddle



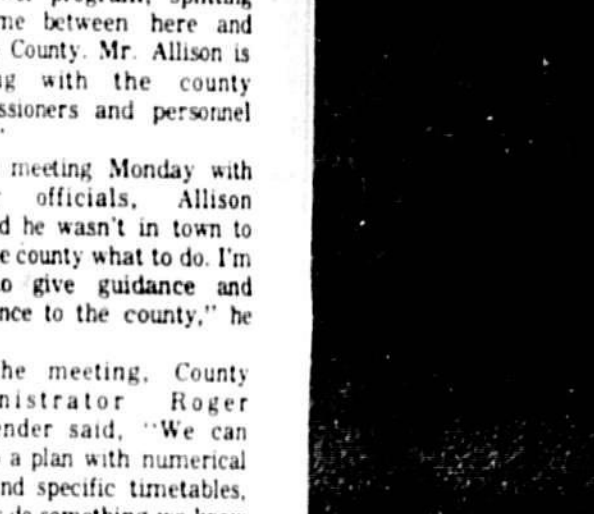
Two federal officials are in Sanford today and Wednesday to assist Seminole County officials in updating the county's plan to increase hiring minorities and women.
