Jury Probe Reactions Vary

A grand jury probe of county government has affected top officials of that body in different ways — for some it's "strange" while others see the investigation as politically inspired.

Commissioner John Kimbrough says the judges' sealing of four alleged indictments "can have a lot of detrimental effects" on county government from the commissioners on down to morale of county employees.

Because the indictments were ordered sealed, Kimbrough feels the board's "credibility with the public has been damaged. Also, there's a certain amount of unrest within the body."

"People reject the idea that public officials be treated any differently — that went out with Nixon," said Kimbrough.

Asked for a quote, Commissioner Dick Williams said implications of the probe and subsequent sealing of the indictment are "tragic." Williams and Kimbrough are the two Republicans on the board.

Commission Chairman Mike Hattaway and Commissioner Harry Kwiatkowski point to harassment by a Republican state attorney as part of the rationale behind the investigation.

"It's been a constant probe since the Democrats have been in office by a Republican state attorney. What's new about that?" Hattaway asked.

Kwiatkowski said the grand jury's investigation of county operations is the fourth such investigation since he was elected to the board.

"I personally feel we've got an overzealous Republican down there and a predominantly Democratic county commission," Kwiatkowski said.

Commissioner Sidney Vihlen Jr. wasn't as verbal as his fellow Democrats.

He said there have been "rumors" that the probe was political, but "I don't know. There have been rumors to that effect but we'll just have to wait and see."

Vihlen, Williams and Hattaway are up for re-election next year. So is State Attorney Abbott Herring, a Republican.

Though Kimbrough feels employee morale is low as a result of the probe, Hattaway says it's "business as usual."

"Everything looks the same," Hattaway said.

"People would be foolish not to react in an unfavorable manner," Kimbrough added.

Vihlen, remarked on the morale of the commission and county government employees.

"I think the morale of the commission is somewhat down. No doubt, tensions seem to be up," he said.

However, Vihlen said "business is moving at a regular pace." He also said he feels the "controversy will be up" once a decision is made on the grand jury report.

Asked about the political implications of the report, Kwiatkowski summed it up: "I really don't know," he said.

"We'll just wait and see what that report," commented Vihlen.

Two Say They Aren't Named

Seminole County Commissioners John Kimbrough and Dick Williams today issued a formal statement saying that they are not the subjects of the current grand jury probe.

"Because of the secrecy, the public does not know who has been indicted and who has not. This is a public statement to make it absolutely clear that we have not been indicted, nor have we been named as unindicted co-conspirators," the statement said.

Signed by both commissioners, the statement was in answer to Wednesday's Evening Herald editorial which said those persons reportedly indicted by the grand jury are being protected from public exposure while the innocent are under suspicion.

"After reading the editorial which raised the question of who has been indicted, it is imperative that we make an official statement," said Kimbrough and Williams.

The two commissioners went on to say that county residents are "growing cynical and distrustful" of county government.

The issue centers on the sealing by circuit court judges of reported indictments issued by a grand jury. For four weeks, the grand jury probed county governmental operations. After the report was issued, it was ordered sealed.

State Attorney Abbott Herring has appealed to the Florida Supreme Court for a reversal of the decision by 18th Judicial District Judges Volie A. Williams, Jr. and Joe Cowart Jr.

"The most damaging implication" according to Kimbrough and Williams, is the effect on "future government" because both commissioners say persons with high ideals will refuse to run for public office.

"The times call for disclosure, not secrecy," the joint statement says.

The statement also calls for the immediate release of indictments reportedly contained in the report.

"To release them (names of persons indicted) in several months will not remove the suspicions of past secrecy — the damage will have been done."

"You can't 'unring a bell,'" the statement said.

Arson Evidence Sought In Crooms School Fire

LAKE MARY — State fire marshals and Sanford police and fire department investigators today were probing gutted portions of a building at Crooms High School looking for evidence of arson and burglary.

Police reported two black males eluded a police officer just after midnight, running from the school into a nearby heavily wooded field.

Patrolman Tony Brooks Jr. said he returned to the school area to find the frame building, that formerly housed the home economics department, in flames.

Brooks said the burglars apparently entered the building by pushing out a window sash on the west side of the 45-year-old structure.

Police said there was evidence of attempts to burglarize a soft drink vending machine in the teacher's lounge in the building.

Firemen were able to contain the flames to the lounge area but said the tin roof on the building helped spread heat and smoke to other areas including two unused classrooms and a Neighborhood Youth Corps office and school clinic.

Fire Chief G. M. Harriett said the fire was "of suspicious nature" and that state fire marshals would conduct an arson investigation today.

County School officials were reported meeting with insurance adjusters to determine if the building is to be torn down or repaired.

No dollar estimate of fire damage was available at press time.

Pot Bellies Are Common Today

DEAR DR. LAMB — Why do so many people, young and old, men and women, have protruding stomachs nowadays?

I'm over 60 and have rheumatoid arthritis. My feet, legs, and knees have become very painful to use, hence my exercise is limited. Until I acquired arthritis some years ago, I had a very flat stomach. Now it protrudes — feels swollen.

My problem is different because of my rheumatoid arthritis. Incidentally, those who want information on rheumatoid arthritis can follow the same procedure I mentioned for the information on the big middle, only ask for The Health Letter, number 4-11, Rheumatoid Arthritis. Your abdomen is distended with fluid from your medicines. Prednisone and other cortisone medicines tend to cause abdominal obesity.

Because of the complications of cortisone medicines, they are used only in selected cases. I can't say whether your case required cortisone or not, but as long as you are under the care of a specialist in rheumatoid arthritis, he can guide you to the best current therapy.

I am not hopeful that exercise will help reduce your abdomen any more than it will a person who has abdominal obesity which is not corrected. You may get some advantage by strengthening your abdominal muscles to a limited degree. You can practice tightening and relaxing your abdominal muscles while lying down, while sitting or even while standing. Repeated contractions will help you maintain the strength of your muscles. Don't overdo it at first.

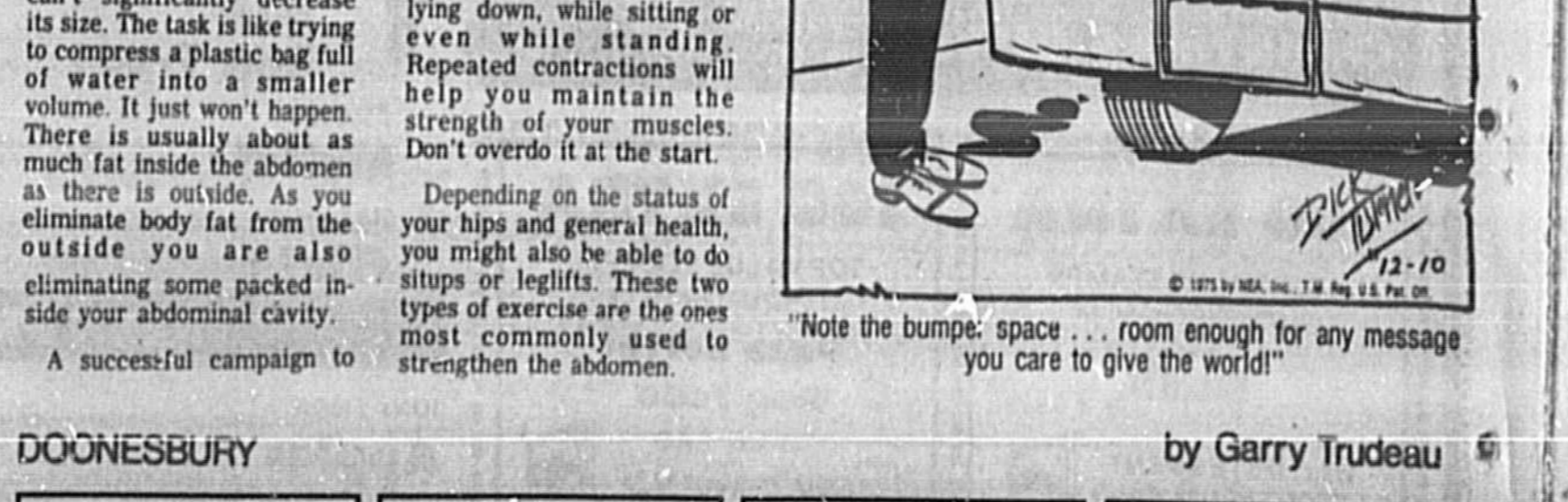
Depending on the status of your hips and general health, you might also be able to do situps or leglifts. These two types of exercise are the ones most commonly used to strengthen the abdomen.
