## Lone Eagle" Is Slated For Job

Fiancee's Sister Also  
Guest At Residence  
Near Penny's Home

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Feb. 14—(INS)—Belle Isle, the tiny 20 acre island nestled up against the Venetian Causeway, which has been pre-inaugural headquarters for President-elect Hoover for the past three weeks, took an added significance today in the world's spotlight.

Making their headquarters on the minute coastal formation were not only Mr. and Mrs. Hoover, but Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh and Elizabeth Morrow, as well. Elizabeth Morrow is the daughter of Dwight Morrow, American ambassador to Mexico, and a sister of Anne, whose engagement to American flying hero has just been announced.

Lindbergh, who arrived at Miami from Cuba, and Miss Morrow who came from Nassau by boat, were on the Joseph E. Atiles estate, adjoining the Penny winter home where the Hoovers are staying. It was probable the President-elect and the young Colonel would get together during the course of the day. He has been mentioned rather consistently as an under-strengthing-in-the-Hoover-cabinet in charge of aviation.

There was another flyer on Mr. Hoover's engagement list today, Ting Lai Yung, known as the Chinese Lindbergh. It was an aviator of the Chinese air force, mostly to pay his respects. Other callers scheduled included George W. Chamberlain, publisher of the Minneapolis Journal, and William Moore, publisher of the Mason City, Iowa, Globe-Gazette.

The engagement will be held over yesterday as a result of inability of the four members of the delegation to reach Miami Beach in time. This morning the Presidelect will hear the informal report of a sub-committee of four on recent economic changes in the United States. Mr. Hoover more than a year ago, while still secretary of commerce, appointed a commission of experts to review the entire economic situation and he already received information on these phases—the relation between unemployment and government construction work, and a survey of the general business cycle.

Edward Hunt, of the department of commerce, Clarence M. Shaw of the A. W. Shaw Company of Chicago, and Adolph Miller, of the Federal Reserve Board, will render an unoffical report.

Mr. Hoover and his staff began the task of dismantling fishing rods and packing up files preliminary to the return to Washington which probably will start next Tuesday morning. Tomorrow morning early, the President-elect embarks on a two-day tour of inspection of the Everglades and the Lake Okeechobee region, the return from which will leave him much time to dismantle his equipment.

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## Boxing Commission Will Try To Determine Who Is Schmeling's Real Manager

Jess McMahon Appears To Have Best Claim To Boss German Fighter Who Has Held Spotlight Lately

NEW YORK, Feb. 13.—The good old army game of tying Max Schmeling up like a cravat goes forward apace and with increasing fervor today, Jess McMahon having declared himself in on the racket with a contract duly signed, sealed and not yet delivered. He promises to make delivery not later than this afternoon before the meeting of the state athletic commission and, unless that harassed body wishes to reverse itself officially, it may have to string along with McMahon and give the garden's two-year lien on Maximilian the old nolle prossse, meaning the chill.

McMahon's hole card looks the part of a possible winner because he claims that his contract was signed on behalf of Schmeling by Arthur Bulow, the boy friend's former boy friend, the joker in this statement being the fact that the commission is on record as recognizing Bulow not only as the Max's manager but his only manager. **Output Of Motor Has  
Been Increased 24  
Per Cent, Is Claim**

While the new Essex, the less priced of the two cars built by the Hudson Essex Motor Car Company, is tagged with a list of 20 different mechanical and body improvements, the makers lay so much stress on the car's outstanding performance that the new issue has been given the official name of "Essex the Challenger."

There is speed, of course, and more—and abundant power. Because the output of the motor has been increased 24 per cent, to an actual 55 horsepower. "Something entirely new," is the popular verdict accorded the line, with emphasis placed particularly upon the unique and different body lines, which rank the Oakland Motor Car company as a style creator as well as a pioneer of engineering and chassis refinements.

The new grill front of the larger cross-flow radiator, arranged in chevron design with a chrome plated bar extending vertically through the center, gives the car an identity easily distinguishable in traffic. The radiator shell higher this year with an unbroken outside curve line, gleams with a finish of chrome plate, as do all lamps and other exterior hardware.

On the hood is a large grouping of four sets of five each, the hood itself giving the impression of increased power and fitness developed by the larger and refined engine.

Sixty body types are in the line, 4-door sedan, 2-door sedan, convertible cabriolet, coupe, sport roadster, sport phaeton, and a new convertible cabriolet and landau sedan. Both latter types bordering on the custom-built, are introduced in the Oakland line for the first time in the 1929 model.

In keeping with the distinctive front end, the new Fisher bodies reveal unique and symmetrical lines unlike those of any other car now on the road. Duo color combinations are new and smart. A beautifully proportioned back panel emphasizes the sweeping low lines of the car, and an oval window in the rear replaces the conventional type.

The rear seat of all five passenger models has been made two inches wider without increasing the tread, to add to the comfort of passengers. Increased width across the dash also makes for greater roominess and convenience in the driver's compartment.

Fisher craftsmen working in conjunction with Oakland engineers built into the bodies eight major improvements: Correct seating position both front and rear, freedom from rumble and rattle, rigid bracing, durability, strength and safety, form fitting cushions, side cowl ventilators, and adjustable driver's seat.

The side cowl ventilators operate by foot control, and add a smart touch to the exterior appearance of the car, at the same time providing for greater comfort in warm weather driving. In addition to the side ventilators the convertible cabriolet has a top cowl ventilator.

Minute attention to detail carried out in every body type extends even to a rear vision mirror, which this year is constructed of colored glass so that at night the reflected glare of a following headlight will not blind the driver.

Heavy and luxurious mohair in solid colors which blend attractively with the exterior Duo finish, upholsters all bodies except the convertible cabriolet, and the open sport types, where leather is used.

All outstanding new feature particularly attractive to women drivers is the adjustable driver's seat in all closed models—it may be set to accommodate the height of any driver. The entire seat, back and all, moves forward or backward approximately three inches, by a conveniently placed and easily operated knob adjustment.

The instrument panel represents a departure from the conventional indirect lighting method formerly in vogue. The new All-American panel, finished in a dignified black, has two direct lamps which illuminate the board with soft, glowing light. Instruments symmetrically grouped and mounted directly on the dash, include an eighty mile speedometer, gasoline gauge, oil gauge, ammeter, ignition switch, lighting switch, choke and master buttons, and windshield wiper control. All instrument dials are black faced with white figures.

The new instrument panel is a distinct improvement over previous designs.

in chrome plate. Headlamps, stop lights, tail lamp and filler cap also follow a new design and carry the same brilliant finish.

Bodies, while in appearance lower and smarter than a year ago have not sacrificed head room, an effect achieved by arching the roof and slightly raising the belt line. Windows are arched and are bordered by reveals set off by a narrow head.

Interior hardware of exclusive Oakland pattern distinguishes every model. Apartments common to various models are the new-type sun visor, walnut finished door panels, amboyna carpet in tones, embossed leather seats, and other expected items of luxury.

All Fisher bodies, of composite steel and wood construction for utmost strength and rigidity, have been built to withstand the high top speed and quick acceleration which the enlarged power plant delivers.

### Federal Judges Are Cited For Good Work

ALBANY, N. Y., Feb. 14.—(INS)—Federal Judge Frank Cooper and Frederick Bryant of the Federal Court of the Northern New York District, with headquarters in Albany, have just been commended in a report of the United States Attorney-General for collecting the largest amount of fines for liquor violations in 1928 than any other federal court in the country.

The fines imposed and collected by the two jurists aggregated \$74,365. This sum is nearly \$100,000 in excess of the fines collected by the next highest district, New York State—the southern district headquarters in New York City.

Liquor law violations brought the largest source of assessment, according to the Attorney-General. Prosecution of this type of case was not only more stringent in meting out punishment but authorities were also more successful in compelling payment of fines.

Increasing the staff of engineers and accountants of the commission.


Repealing a bill which has enabled utilities to set aside decisions of the commissions through appeals to friendly circuit courts.
