## County medical examiner resigns

SEMINOLE COUNTY — Seminole County will spend the next couple of months searching for a permanent medical examiner.

Dr. Janet R. Pillow resigned from the job last week to take a similar position in Lake County.

State Attorney Norman Wolfinger appointed Dr. Sashi Gore as the interim Medical Examiner effective March 7. Gore is Chief Medical Examiner for Orange Co. and will continue to act in this capacity as well as work for Seminole Co. on his own time. He was Seminole's medical examiner before Pillow.

Compensation for services will be \$750 per autopsy, plus operating expenses. This is comparable to the county's previous arrangement and within budget.

Deputy County Manager Cindy Cota said that Pillow performed 180 autopsies a year for the county. "In Lake County, the number will be more like 500."

In an interview last April Pillow said she had no such thing as a typical day. "It could start at midnight with a phone call, at 10 a.m. with an autopsy, at 1 p.m. with a court appearance or at whatever

## When politicians tease to please

SEMINOLE COUNTY — At the Seminole County Commission Chambers Tuesday night, Bob West identified himself as the Chairman of the Citizens Committee to fire Randy Morris.

In the midst of the great adult entertainment debate before a full house, Commission Chairman Morris was not overly amused.

"I wanted to get a couple of laughs," West said Wednesday.

"It's too bad he received such a small muted

reaction," Morris said.

Better than applause, West said he had two people come to him after the hearing to say they would put his campaign posters in their yards.

West, a virtual unknown, has high hopes of upsetting Morris in the District 2, commission's race this fall. He raised a few eyebrows, or doubts, when he recently walked out of a Planning & Zoning Board meeting that dealt with adult entertainment.

"My plan was to get at least one other board member to go out with me and there would

## Get ready for the Longwood Spring Festival of the arts

LONGWOOD — Downtown Longwood, known for its historic buildings and quaint shops, is usually a sleepy place, best suited for quiet strolls and unique shopping experiences.

Twice a year, thousands crowd the streets, snarling traffic yet bringing a lot of life to those who make their way around the area. Every autumn for the last two decades or more, the Longwood Historical Society has hosted a huge art festival. And each spring, the Longwood Historical Board puts on a more intimate festival of the arts.

"We're not nearly as big, but we do really well," Bob Lomax, a member of the board, said.

The Spring Festival, which will take place this year on Saturday and Sunday, March 14 and 15, is known as the Founders Day Arts and Crafts Festival, though Lomax said it is not connected to any celebration of the city's founding.

Regardless of that fact, the Historical Board is dedicated to maintaining and improving the downtown historic district. All proceeds from the event are used to help with such projects.

The board has seen to the placement of new bricks along Church Avenue between the Longwood Police Station at Milver Street and State Road 427 and most recently on Wilma Avenue between City Hall and the Community Building. They have placed six benches throughout the downtown area. And they are look-

ing to purchase some street lamps that are replicas of the kind used in Longwood during her heyday.

"We're getting there," Lomax said.

Lomax and his wife Sandy were on the committee that started the Founders Day event three years ago. Residents of Longwood for a quarter of a century, they wanted to find a way to help improve the downtown area. They believe the art festival is the way to do it.

"It is starting small, but Lomax believes they are doing well."

"We're not Winter Park, but we're getting there," he said.

The first event drew about 100 artisans, and a steady crowd. Last year there were a few dozen more crafters and the streets were full from open until close, Lomax said.

"This year we have about 180 crafters signed up for the event," he noted. "And I think we can expect really good crowds again."

In addition to the artisans and crafters, Lomax said, the festival will feature a food court with a wide variety of tasty treats and entertainment provided by Walt Disney World musicians and dancers.

"This should be our biggest year ever," Lomax predicted. "We're expecting big crowds. The vendors should all be happy with this year's event and I think it'll be a big crowd pleaser as well."

The historical board began the event because they wanted to "do something positive" for the historic district and to draw attention to all downtown. Please See Longwood, Page 4A

## Death by stab wound in neck

OVIEDO — Preliminary autopsy reports on the 68-year-old Oviedo woman stabbed to death at her home Tuesday morning indicate that she died from a stab wound to the neck that hit an artery.

Jonathan Arce, 14, a student at Oviedo High School, is being charged with first degree murder. Arce's story, according to Lt. Dale Coleman of the Oviedo Police Department, is that Stillman had asked him to come into her home. Arce said that she wanted to talk to him about her home. Arce told police that the woman pulled a knife, and, in self-defense, he grabbed the knife from her and stabbed her repeatedly.

A handyman, who was a close friend of Stillman and was coming over to conduct repair work at her home, found Arce in the murdered woman's car. Arce supposedly went home to change his clothes and then came back to the scene. The handyman then held Arce once he saw the body of the slain woman.

Arce is said to be a quiet, slight young man by his peers at Oviedo High School. A fellow student described Arce as "not physically in-

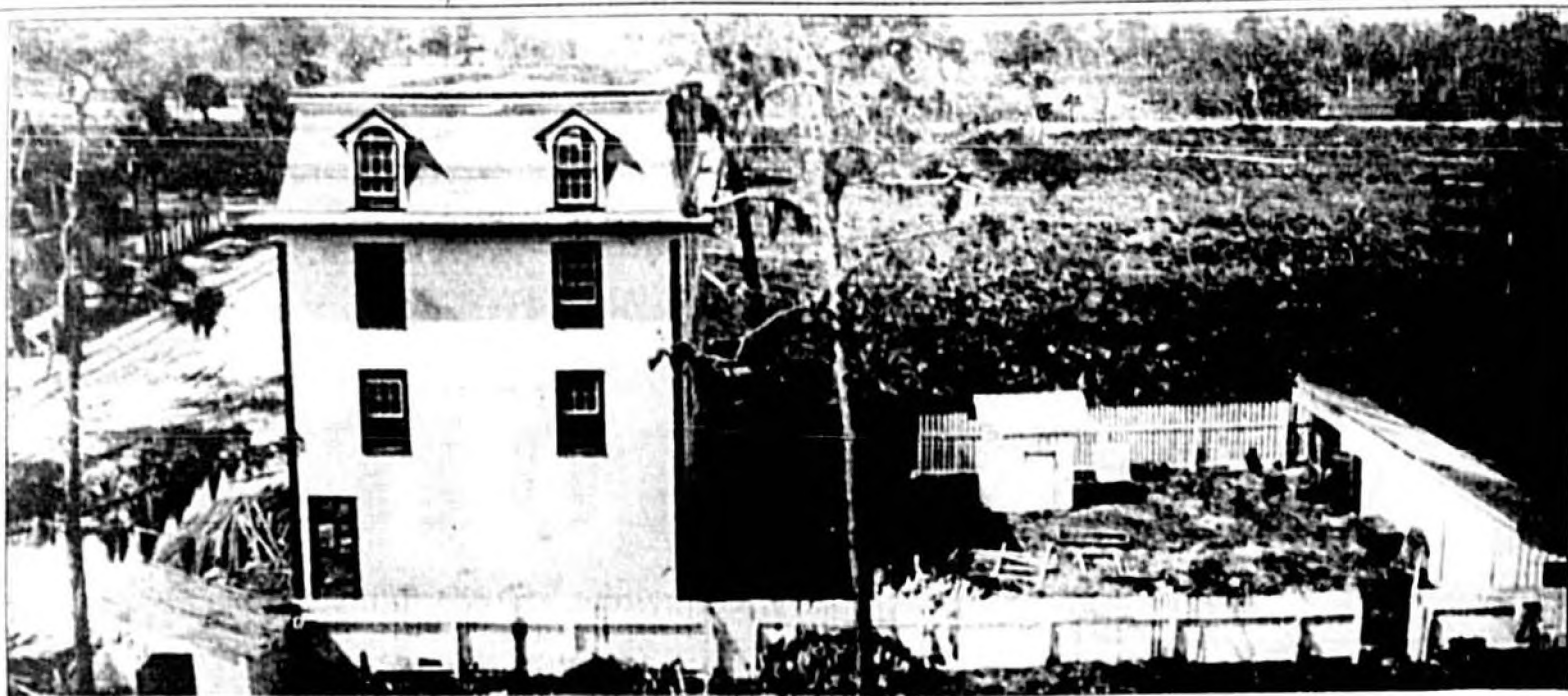

## Drowning prevention How to protect your child

In Florida, drowning is the leading cause of death from injury for toddlers. Florida's drowning rate is almost 150 percent that of the country as a whole. Unfortunately, these grim statistics have qualified Orlando Regional Healthcare System (ORHS) staff as experts on drowning and submersion injuries.

Tammy Horvath, R.N.C., B.S.N., C.P.N., ORHS Coordinator for the Greater Orlando SAFE KIDS Coalition, offers the following tips for preventing water tragedies:

- Always supervise children in and around water.
- Stall four-sided, five-foot-high fencing with a self-closing, self-latching gate around pools and spas to prevent direct access from the house.
- Always wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) when on a boat or natural bodies of water.
- Never leave a young child alone or with a sibling in the bathtub, not even to answer

the phone or get a towel. If you must leave, take the child with you.

• Although they can't "drown-proof" a child, swimming lessons are a must.

• Never swim in unguarded areas, such as quarries, canals or ponds.

• Know CPR, and how to reach your Emergency Medical Service; keep a phone outside near pools and have emergency numbers posted.

• Children should follow the four key rules for swimming: 1. Swim with a buddy, never alone; 2. Don't dive or jump into bodies of water, always wade in first; 3. Don't push or jump on others; 4. Be prepared for an emergency.

"Of course swimming pools are where most submersion injuries occur, but small children can drown in less than an inch of water—in a matter of seconds—making even 'kiddie pools,' bathtubs, buckets and toilet bowls a potential hazard," said Horvath. "By simply taking a few simple safety precautions, parents can significantly reduce their child's chance of tragedy."

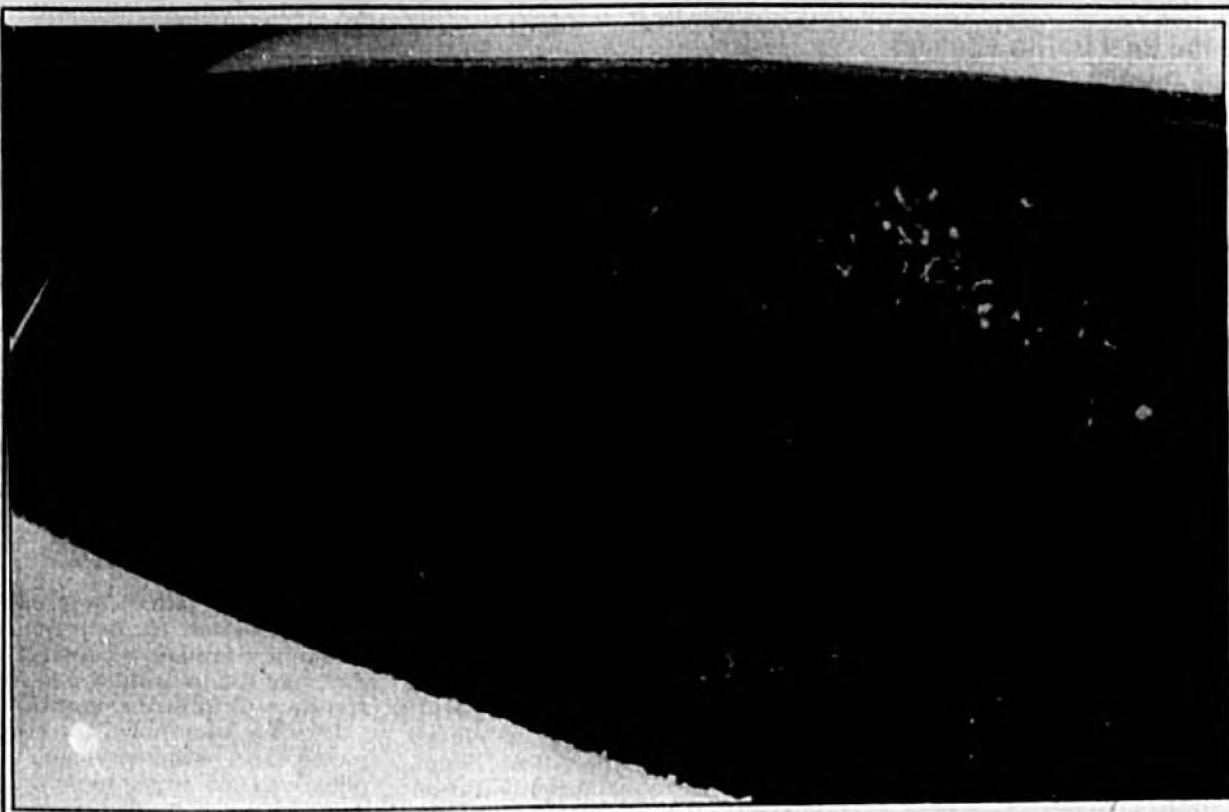

not be a quorum," West said. "There was no need to rush this grandfathering thing," West exited alone, however. The four remaining members voted, 4-0, to move forward.

Again at the Tuesday public hearing, West asked the commission to vote against grandfathering the five adult businesses in Fern Park. When he mentioned relocating them near the Orlando Sanford Airport, he met resistance from Commissioner Daryl McLain. "We have never seen eye-to-eye," West said.

Morris stayed out of the fray, saying, "It's sad Bob West and his pals Grant Maloy and Dick Van Der Weide are so predictable."

The commission's 3-2 vote to allow the Fern Park clubs to stay put will undoubtedly stir up juicy opinions on Morris and West, who obviously don't see eye-to-eye, either. An ally of West says the race between the two will be a lot closer than Morris' may think. Those in Morris' camp say forget it.

At the same time, the West-Morris race kicks in, the District Four race between incumbent Win Adams and former commis-

sioner Carlton Henley bears even closer watching. Many residents in the district aren't pleased that Adams voted for grandfathering.

"They feel I let them down - that I was the district commissioner and should have voted to move the clubs," Adams said. "My answer is that I serve all the people in the county."

"Will it cost me votes? Who knows? It's still a long way from the election and by that time I expect people will better appreciate what this commission has done and is doing to regulate the adult entertainment industry," Adams said.

Henley was at Tuesday's hearing and has attended just about every commission hearing this year. The principal of Lyman High School for 31 years, he has chosen to observe rather than comment about the doings at the chambers.

Henley's early campaign pledge was that he "could do a better job" than Adams.

Adams has said, "All I ask is that people compare what he did as a commissioner to what I have done. The record will show who has done the better job."

"Intimidating" and that Arce "skipped school a lot". It has been speculated that Arce came out of a gang situation in his previous home, Miami. One student commented that Arce wore his collar up in school which is, supposedly, a sign of gang activity. Police are presently checking into the boy's background.

"Florida Department of Law Enforcement Blood Spatter experts are arriving today to try and recreate the scene," said Coleman. Investigators are trying to determine where Stillman had been before the incident by calling her family members. Coleman said that the crime occurred sometime around 8 a.m.

Stillman had made a list of items that were missing from her home while she was on a trip recently. She noticed that things were not right within her home like the television being plugged in when it should be unplugged and doors being closed when they should be open. Coleman said that a search warrant of Arce's home revealed items in Arce's possession that Stillman reported missing.

## Partnership protects land at top ranked site

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the US Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) announced on Friday a major step forward in their coordinated effort to preserve the largest intact piece of ancient scrub forest at Carter Creek in Highlands County.

Worldwide Investment Group, Inc. sold 1,535 acres of uplands and wetlands for \$3.281 million to The Nature Conservancy, which will transfer portions of the land to DEP and the USFWS. "Worldwide knew this land had conservation significance and was glad to help protect such an important part of Florida's Lake Wales Ridge," said Howard Steinberg, Worldwide president.

"This company really deserves credit," said Bob Bendick, director of The Nature Conservancy's Florida Chapter. "In the interest of conservation, Worldwide suspended potentially lucrative sales and development plans to allow us the opportunity to protect this endangered natural community."

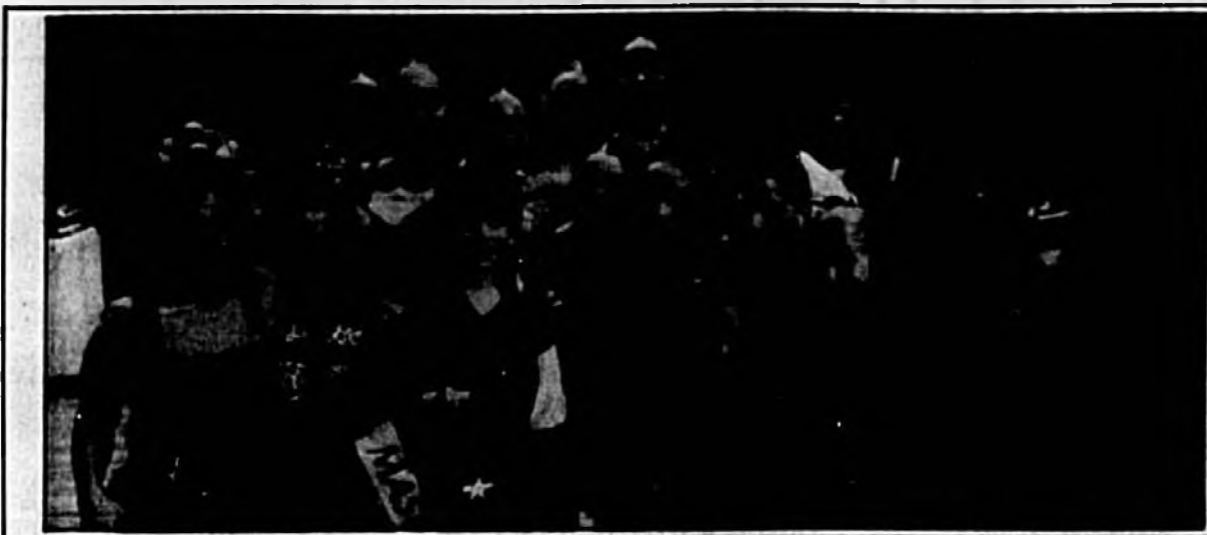
The Nature Conservancy currently holds the property title. At a later date, the USFWS will purchase 629 acres as part of its Lake Wales Ridge National Wildlife Refuge. According to Tom Follrath, USFWS senior realty officer, protecting this area has long been a top priority for the Service. The state of Florida will use Preservation 2000 funds to purchase 890 acres, which will be managed by the Florida Game and Freshwater Fish Commission. The Nature Conservancy will retain and manage 18 acres.

"The leadership of DEP and USFWS made this project possible, resulting in the protection of this rare habitat unique to Florida," said Bendick.

Carter Creek is part of the more than 35,000-acre Lake Wales Ridge Ecosystem project, which has been at the top of the state's Conservation and Recreation Lands Priority Projects List for three years. Located northeast of Sebring along Arbuckle Creek Road, the 4,700-acre Carter Creek site comprises rolling hills of ancient scrub forest, depression marsh, sandhill lakes and a seepage stream system. The area provides habitat for 22 of the 28 state and federally endangered or threatened species found on the Lake Wales Ridge. Species include Bald eagles, sand skinks, Florida scrub-jays and rare plants like the Avon Park rabbit bells (*Crotalaria avonensis*), Garrett's scrub balm (*Dicerandra christmanii*) and Carter's warea (*Warea carteri*). These plants occur nowhere else in the world outside the Lake Wales Ridge.

The mission of The Nature Conservancy is to preserve plants, animals and natural communities that represent the diversity of life on Earth by protecting the lands and waters they need to survive. To date, the Conservancy and its members have protected more than ten million acres in 50 states and Canada. With the support of 46,000 individuals, foundations and corporations, the Florida Chapter has protected more than 700,000 acres across the state since 1959.

## Dancers score big

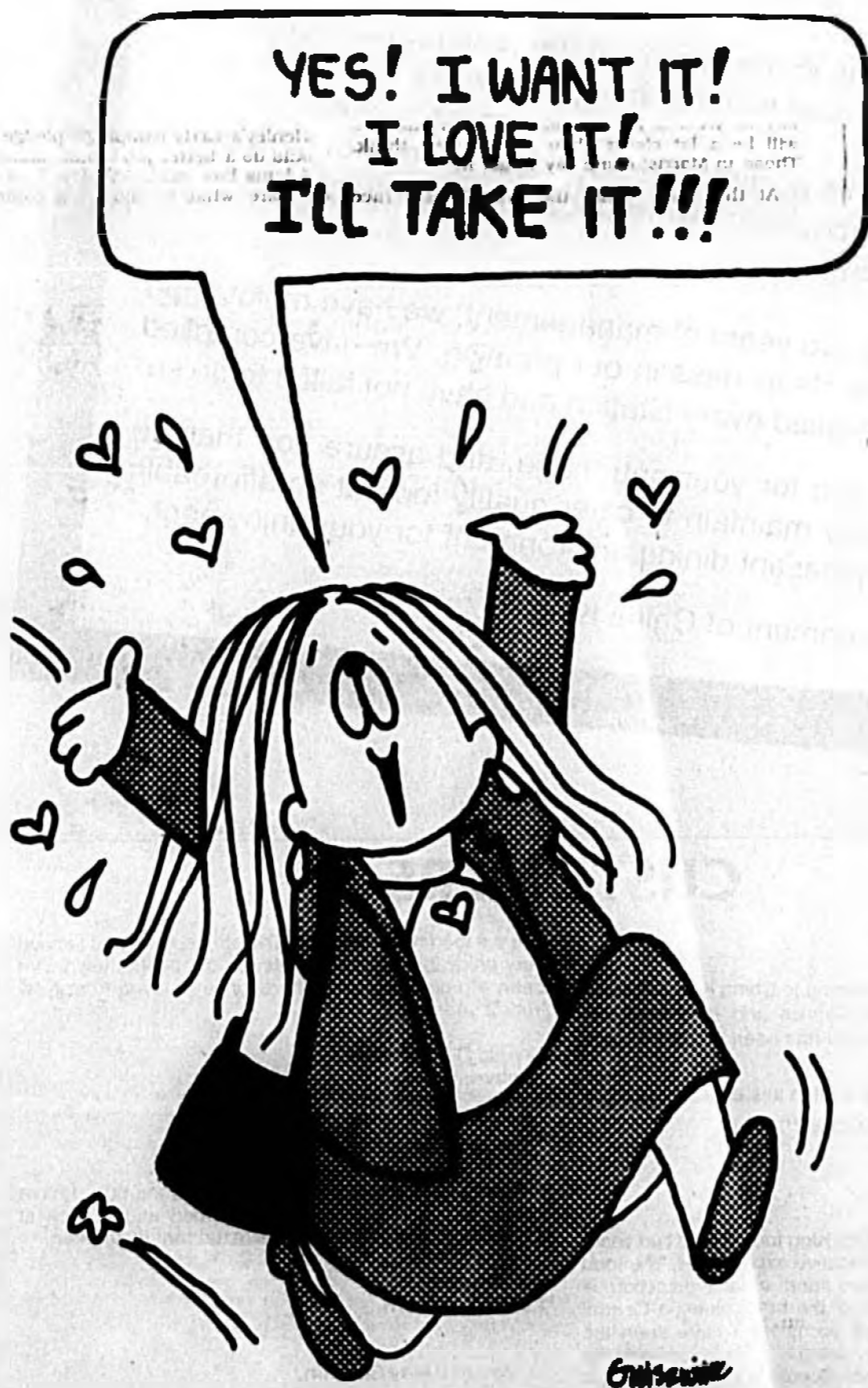

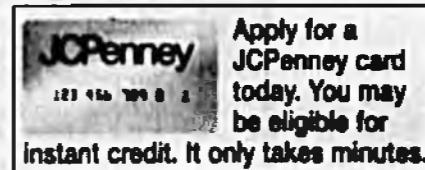

## "Lax" a hit with kids

**SANFORD** - If you haven't been out to see a lacrosse game, get out.

You're missing the best-kept secret in sports.

First, let's get the terminology down. If you want to be a lacrosse fan, you have to say the right things, otherwise people will think you're a Southerner.

You have to call it lax, not lacrosse. If you go up north, and of course everybody loves to know how they do it up north, people will think you are some sort of rube if you call it lacrosse.

Secondly, lax players don't carry lax sticks. They carry their guns. You shoot with your gun.

That's just a little bit of it. Don't want to give you too much too quickly.

Anyway, for those of you who still think they are crab nets kids are carrying around, not lax guns, here's some information that may turn you on to the best game in the world that doesn't have 18 holes.

Did you know that more kids are involved in lax that any sport in Seminole County? and that's in the first year it's been offered county-wide. Some schools have played it in the past few years, including Lyman which won the unofficial championship last season for the boys. Now, everybody's getting involved including football players looking for a spring activity where they can hit somebody.

Lax is big in the Northeast and kids from Baltimore and Long Island start carrying sticks before they are out of the crib. In Baltimore, lax games routinely draw many more people than attend prep football games and the NCAA lacrosse tournament drew nearly 40,000 people last season at the University of Maryland.

In fact, the game, which started out as an Indian game played with wooden sticks over never-ending playing fields, has influenced other games since its inception. Lax was where Wayne Gretzky learned to start an offense from behind the net, something that was unheard of in the past. Football great Jim Brown was voted the greatest lacrosse player of all-time by the Lacrosse Hall of Fame for his heroics at Syracuse in the 60s. Now, he may not even be the greatest player ever at Syracuse as the Galt brothers - Paul and Gary - have become cult heroes inside the lax world.

It took awhile for the game to move to Florida, but it's the new "in" sport and the game is starting to receive notice in Florida. The game isn't up to national standards yet - each team in the county tends to have one or two players that dominate the action - and most coaches aren't full of the strategy that comes with years of being in the game, but it's getting better.

So check out the local team, whether it's girls or boys. One guarantee is you'll never want to see another double overtime soccer shootout after you see your first close lax game. People actually score sometimes in lax.

# Greyhounds growling

## Lyman nine thrashes Lake Howell, takes 6A-3 lead

**WINTER PARK** - Two weeks ago, the Lyman baseball team was still looking for its first win while everyone else in Seminole County was off to a big start.

Two weeks later, the Greyhounds are in first place in the Class 6A-District 3 and the Seminole Athletic Conference and are one of the hottest teams in Central Florida.

The Greyhounds pounded host Lake Howell last night, 10-0 in a six-inning game stopped by the 10-run rule. Evan Loacono went the entire way, allowing only two hits while keeping the Silver Hawks off balance all night with his sidearm delivery that he developed last summer.

til the Greyhounds recovered from some early losses in some difficult tournaments. Now, the Greyhounds have sent notice that they are a team to be reckoned with, especially as the only undefeated team in the 6A-3.

Last night, Lyman traveled to Winter Park take on a Lake Howell team off to an impressive start and a team that included a strong pitching staff, but the Greyhounds lit up the Lake Howell staff and jumped out early.

Josh Hazen homered off Hawks' pitcher Luke Lockwood in the first and the Greyhounds never looked back. In the top of the third, Lyman blew the game open and the only question that remained was whether everyone would have to sit through seven innings of what passes for Arctic temperatures in Florida, or if Lyman would end it early.

The Greyhounds opened the third when Kevin Graves scored on a wild pitch, then Tyler Carr hit an opposite field homer that put Lyman up, 5-0.

The pounding continued. David Milton doubled and scored on a Brandon Epple double.

He and Jose Torres came in on a two-run double by Kevin Grace to make it 8-0.

In the Lyman sixth, a single by Carr led to the final run after a series of wild pitches and the Greyhounds ended the game by executing a double play.

Next up for Lyman is home game against district foe DeLand Friday. Lake Howell hosts Gateway Friday. Both games will start at 7 p.m.

"I saw 30 seconds left and knew I had to score," Burgess said. "Everyone was encouraging me, telling me I was fine

and coach (Mario Miranda) told me how much I needed the match."

When Burgess pulled out the victory, he guaranteed Lyman a fourth place finish for the meet and a second-place finish behind Oviedo among Seminole County schools and ahead of seventh-place Lake Mary, the district champions.

Not bad for a team that Burgess said was shooting for seventh overall. Burgess, along with teammates Joe Gioia, who was ranked third in the state before losing in the finals last week, Carlos Pineda and Alfonso Escalera took off for Lakeland and the state tournament starting Friday.

Now Burgess, who wrestles at 112 pounds, is looking forward to winning the whole thing and becoming the first Greyhound wrestler since 1991 to win a state title. The prospect makes him a little bit nervous, but it's nothing he

hasn't faced 33 other times this season.

"I get nervous before every match," Burgess said. "I get sick all the time over them."

Burgess will hit the mat with his thumb still discolored and dislocated. He's had ultrasound therapy ever since the injury occurred last Saturday, but he was able to ignore it during that epic final period in the regionals.

"I didn't feel it while I was wrestling," Burgess said. "I was so into my concentration, but it really started to hurt afterward."

Burgess has been wrestling since his freshman year when he was convinced by a friend to come out for the 103-pound slot on the team. Like his teammates, he's gotten better and better every season.

He's thinking about keeping the Lyman tradition alive after he graduates this season. There have been some letters from colleges, but Burgess said

he enjoys what is happening with the Greyhounds.

"I wouldn't mind coming back to help out at Lyman," he said. "Our staff is great and they always encourage us."

Miranda is the head coach, but Burgess said he gets a lot of help from assistants Kyler Davis and John Alterzier. Miranda tends to work more with the wrestlers in the larger weight classes and Burgess said Davis and Alterzier have worked a lot with the smaller wrestlers since he joined the Lyman program.

The whole team celebrated - "but not too hard," Burgess said - after last week's surprising finish in regionals. Now the Greyhounds have at least two wrestlers with the talent to bring state championships back home.

By the end of this week, maybe the Greyhounds will be able to celebrate as hard as they want.

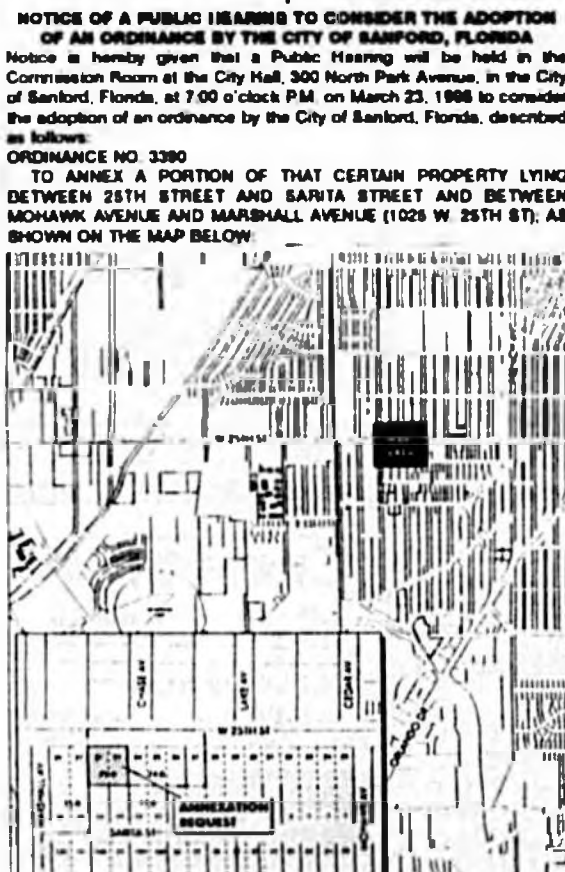

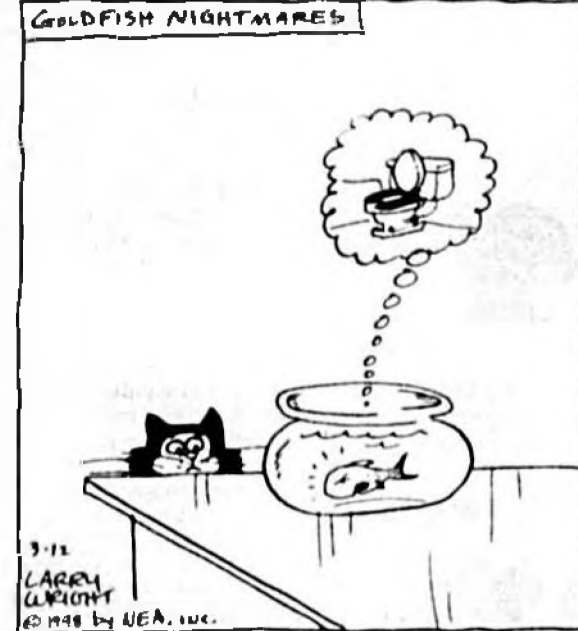

**Energy healing won't do much**

DEAR DR. GOTT: I haven't felt well, but medical tests fail to show that anything is wrong. Would I be advised to try energy healing?

DEAR READER: Including a variety of techniques called "biofield therapies," energy healing is one of the newest forms of alternative medicine. Its proponents believe in a "healing force," which is channeled through healers to patients by an unearthly entity, such as God, the cosmos or prayer. For example, using a method called Reiki, practitioners are convinced that they can funnel spiritual energy into a person by placing their hands on the person's body. Similarly, practitioners of therapeutic touch think that all people are vibrating fields of energy that must be brought into balance with the energy fields that surround them. This is accomplished by a ritual of hand movements, such as holding pressure points and using their hands to connect "entities" or "polarities" within the patient's body.

Energy healers are not licensed in the United States, a sensible approach because the whole theory is pure hogwash — a scientifically unproven way to good health, more useful in separating the sucker from his bucks than in improving the quality of life. If you want to try energy healing, go ahead. It's not dangerous, but neither will it accomplish much. You'd do better by going in a house of worship to pray and meditate.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I read your article about the woman who was sexually attracted to her doctor. I wonder if she is my wife.

My wife dolls up before her appointments, tells her friends how handsome her doctor is (and he is), and causes me great concern. Did my wife write you?

DEAR READER: As you know if you're a regular reader of this column, I bend over backward to ensure the anonymity of my readers. I will never mention people's names, nor would I break a confidence. However, in this case, I can quite honestly reassure you that your wife did not write me — at least from the address you gave.

Several other readers have written me, though. They're sexually attracted to their doctors and want to know if it's all right for them to show it.

My answer is an unqualified "no." A sexual relation between doctor and patient is illegal, unethical and totally inappropriate. Moreover, it's a no-win situation that is a recipe for disaster.

Are doctors attracted to some of their patients? You bet. Is it abnormal for a woman to be "fired up" by her doctor? No. But as adults, we have to draw a line. While you may think and

Chronic headaches are often the result of stress and muscle tension, which can be helped by massage, acupuncture and pressure-point therapy. Therefore, if your doctor has tested you for serious causes of headache — for instance, high blood pressure, migraine and sinus infection — and has diagnosed muscle contraction as the cause of your problem, you could try pressure-point therapy.

**WIN AT BRIDGE**

**Stay to the right**

Sir Fred Hoyle, a British astronomer, claimed, "Space isn't remote at all. It's only an hour's drive away if your car could go straight upwards."

But when in space, do you drive on the left side of the road, or on the right? Also — on which side of the road do they drive in Japan?

Today's deal occurred during an international tournament in Tokyo. Since East is a top oriental player, it was surprising that he made this error, but it was nonetheless instructive.

After a Stayman auction in which South showed four hearts and North, by inference, four spades, South was in the driver's seat in three no-trump. West started the defensive trip by cashing four club tricks. East had to

make two discards. Seeing little future in his low spades, he threw a pair of those, clutching his red-suit cards. However, now South had nine tricks via four spades, two hearts and three diamonds.

Which discards should East have made and why?

It is a reliable rule of the bridge road that you should keep equal length with an opponent, especially when that opponent is on your right. Here, there were four spades and four diamonds in the dummy, to East's right. So, East should have clung to four spades and four diamonds and discarded two hearts, hoping partner could hold that suit. Here, that defeats the contract.

Surprisingly, it seems to me, the Japanese drive on the left side of the road. Is this the only country not originally part of the British Empire for which it is true?
