Grim-Faced Nurse Who Saw Autopsy Blamed For Death

WETUMPKA, Ala. (AP)—A middle-aged nurse, accused of poisoning her two small nieces, injured herself by slashing her wrist with a razor blade Tuesday night, and a few hours before she was to go on trial for murder.

Sheriff Lester Holley said Mrs. Earle Dennison managed to slip a piece of razor blade under the cover of her bed at nearby Tutwiler Prison for Women where she has been held since her arrest three months ago.

Gray-haired Mrs. Earle Dennison is accused of feeding arsenic to Shirley Dinn, who died May 1, and also to her tiny sister, Polly Ann.

Shirley was only a few days old when Polly Ann died two and a half years ago after a sudden, violent illness. Only the death of Shirley Dinn was on the court docket for today.

The widowed, 34-year-old nurse who worked at the hospital where the child died was arrested a week later after the parents, Mr. and Mrs. O. O. Weldon of the nearby Claud community, swore out a murder warrant.

Sheriff Lester Holley said Mrs. Dennison admitted, without a show of emotion, that she gave Shirley Dinn arsenic in a soft drink and took her to the hospital when she went into convulsions. The child died five hours later.

State Toxicologist C. J. Rhelling said the autopsy, performed with Mrs. Dennison present, showed arsenic.

Still suspicious about the death of Polly Ann nearly three years before, the Weldons arranged to have her remains analyzed. Dr. Rhelling said she, too, had traces of the deadly metallic poison, and another warrant was signed against the aunt.

Sheriff Holley said Mrs. Dennison denied intentionally poisoning Polly Ann, but admitted giving a salt shaker containing arsenic at the Weldon home after a visit. She said she used it to make an insect killer.

The sheriff said the woman told him, however, that she collected \$5,000 on an insurance policy after the first child's death. She gave no motive for the admitted slaying of Shirley Dinn, but Holley said she reportedly had two policies on her totaling \$4,000.

Reynolds' Island Retreat Revealed As Gilded Spot

SAPELO ISLAND, Ga. (AP)—R. J. Reynolds, tobacco heir, is having a big time displaying to his attractive suburban bride their home here in the Golden Isles.

If you got the idea from stories of their wedding here last Friday that the place is a gossamer palace of gold splashed with diamonds, forget it.

The place is big and it is fine. But there is nothing superficial. It's solid and substantial.

Reynolds, whose many pursuits include building boats and skipping them, running a shipping line, flying, photography, forestry, cattle raising, farming and road building—to mention a few—looked hours away from his honeymoon Tuesday to show an Associated Press newsmen and photographer around the island plantation.

No newsmen were present at last week's wedding of the 46-year-old Reynolds and the former Mrs. Muriel Greenough, 35, the third marriage for each. But the newlyweds pointed out the spot under the aged oaks in front of the 23-room main plantation house where they repeated their vows before the Rev. Gordon C. King, Methodist minister from Darien, Ga.

Contrary to popular belief, Reynolds doesn't own all of this Southeast Georgia coastal island. Several Negro families, whose ancestors were slaves here, still hold 10-acre tracts devoted them after the War Between the States by Thomas Spaulding, owner of the island, which is 15 miles long and three miles wide.

While the island can be reached only by plane or boat, Reynolds has several cars, trucks and jeeps. He drove one of the jeeps on the island, and conducted over the five miles of asphalted and many more miles of sand roads on the island.

Within a few months the couple will start on a world cruise aboard their yacht "Aries" being built in England.

Reynolds ended active operations in the R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company to become a Navy officer in World War II. He remains a director of Delta Air Lines. In the field of flying where he was a pioneer.

RED LIGHT INDUCES EGG

STORRS, Conn. (AP)—Put a red light over your hen nests, and watch the eggs roll in.

C. S. Hall, Rutgers University egg expert, said in a paper for the National Poultry Association meeting, that air raid regulations blacked out the brilliantly lighted poultry houses along the Jersey coast during the war. So farmers turned on the dim red lights to let them see.

The red light had a tendency to keep the hens longer on the nests. Egg production rose, and since then experiments have confirmed the red light's effect on hens.

METAL REVEALS BILIS

STAFFORD, England (AP)—A Staffordshire smelter worker stated Tuesday at the cauldron of molten lead he was stirring—wads of money were rising up through the bubbles.

The astonished worker snatched 52 one-pound notes (\$145.60) from the seething cauldron. The money apparently had been hidden in a bag of lead scrap which later was sent to the smelter for re-use.

Forecasters Of Rise In Prices Criticized

WASHINGTON (AP)—Secretary of Commerce Sawyer says those who predict sharply rising prices are just guessing, and that their unfounded forecasts could help speed up inflation.

He said Tuesday he plans to make a survey to get at the facts. Retiring Office of Price Stabilization (OPS) Director Ellis Arnall has said the drought will have "disastrous" effects on prices and that the \$5.35 ton steel price increase will cost the average family \$100 a year.

Without mentioning Arnall by name, Sawyer said inflation often is stimulated by public fear that prices may go up—he mentioned the fear buying following the Korean invasion.

But Price Boss Arnall has contended the situation is no serious. President Truman should call a special session of Congress to pass anti-inflation laws. Truman said last week he is considering the idea.

Louisiana Election Officials Indicted

NEW ORLEANS (AP)—Five Plaquemine Parish (county) election officials were indicted by a federal grand jury on conspiracy charges following an investigation of the 1950 election of U. S. Rep. F. Edward Hebert.

The five were named in the indictment as supporters of Hebert, who last month was re-elected from the Louisiana First Congressional District.

Indicted were: Eugene Trumbull, Henry Gehbauer Sr., Emile Humphrey, Anthony Humphrey and Joseph Bazile.

Hebert said the indictments were "politically inspired and designed to embarrass those who have stood up for states rights and constitutional government."

The investigation began after J. Ben Meyer, who was an unsuccessful candidate in 1950 and lost again to Hebert last month, complained recently that names of persons were listed as having voted when they actually did not cast ballots. He also said some of the voters in Plaquemine first ward were registered in New Orleans.

Records show that Meyer received only three votes in that precinct in 1950.

Meyer took his complaint to Atty. Gen. McCreary, who ordered the grand jury investigation.

ESCAPEE CAPTURED

ABERDEEN, Scotland (AP)—John Ramensky, such a good safecracker the British government once hired him to do it, was recaptured Tuesday night after breaking out of grim Peterhead Prison near here.

His escape Monday was his second from Peterhead. He's serving a five-year sentence for robbing a postoffice.

During World War II the British Army remembered Ramensky's reputation as Britain's No. 1 crackman and parachuted him behind the German lines to blow open Nazi safes containing secret documents.

EXPLOSION KILLS 6

FROSINONE, Italy (AP)—Police reported today that an explosion in a clandestine firecracker factory near here killed six persons and crumpled a two-story building.

The explosion, while the firecrackers were being manufactured secretly, set off a large store of fireworks.

"The Boy Scouts is an organization for capitalist wars!" read captions emblazoned on the covers of this literature. "Smash the Boy Scouts! Join the Young Pioneers!"

The document was larded with slogans that "Boy Scouts are for bourgeois wars" and "Boy Scouts take part in murder of striking workers."

Matusow said that as a Communist he saw a high powered plan evolved to infiltrate high schools, community and even church clubs, and labor unions. He turned about infiltration a part of this plan.

Another witness, Herbert Romerstein, Brooklyn, N. Y., told of being recruited into the Communist front as a high school student at the age of 15½. Romerstein said he finally divorced himself from communism.

He said Communist youth work first was handled through the Young Communist League, then through American Youth for Democracy, and finally split into two new fronts.

One of these, Romerstein said, is "the Young Progressives of America" a brand youth organization that could rape in many young people who didn't know what communism was. They get people who are not yet Communists. The idea is to get people workers into a labor union.

**Says Action At Home
Level Would Stop
"Tidal Wave" Of
Centralized Power**

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — Democratic presidential nominee Adlai Stevenson called on the 48 state legislatures today to give such good government to their people that they would halt the "tidal wave" of centralized power sweeping toward Washington.

In the first major speech since his nomination, Stevenson warned the shift will go on unless the dikes "perform those necessary functions of government which don't have to be performed by Washington."

Then he said: "The people will demand the services and if they don't get them at home they will turn to Uncle Sam. And the state are the dikes which we can build more strongly against the flood waters sweeping toward the District of Columbia."

Stevenson gave his views in speech prepared for delivery at Democratic rally at the Illinois state fair in introducing the main speaker of the day, Vice President Alben Barkley of Kentucky.

Stevenson gave his own philosophy of government, defended his record as governor of Illinois, ripped into his Republican critics, turned some of his critics against former President Herbert Hoover and also posed some questions of each presidential nominee Dwight D. Eisenhower.

He packed this wide swinging array of topics into about 2,000 words which he had written and polished for the past two days or until mid-morning.

Stevenson gave the hard core of his speech in a few paragraphs in which he listed with pride his achievements of his administration in Illinois and then went on to say:

"It has been said that perhaps no state in our time has done so much so quickly. I don't know whether you call it a 'New Deal' for Illinois or a 'Fair Deal' or

"Square Deal", but I know that has been a no deal state government.

"It is important because H&M states are important. We talk about them and deplore incessantly the increasing centralization of power over our lives in Washington but that total drift toward the capital will go on and on unless those necessary functions of government which don't have to be performed in Washington are performed and properly performed at the state or a local level.
