State Road Department Tells ICC To Move Slowly In Determining Action

TALLAHASSEE UP - The State Road Department today advised the State Improvement Commis sion to move slowly in considering the building of a Florida tollpike

system. In a formal report to the commission, the road board said it is not "altogether in agreement" with the recommendation of a New York consulting engineering firm that a toll turnpike project should be started immediately. The proposed road would run down the East Coast from Jacksonville to Minmi with a spur to the Tampa St. Pe tersburg area.

We are of the unanimous opin ion that further study of a positive nature should be made concerning a Florida turnpike system." the road department report said The road board told the com-mission that the next step in consideration of the turnpike proposal is "a careful analysis" of the con-sulting engineers' report by the governor, the improvement com-mission and the Cabinet Board of Administration which supervises county and district road and bridge

"After this study, if it appears that there is a reasonably finan-cial soundness for considering a limited access toll facility in Flor ids, the next step to be taken would be to obtain a traffic and carning report, which should establish be yond any reasonable doubt the fi-nancial soundness of such a limit ed access toll facility," the roat

Once this had been done, the next step would be consideration of possible financing of the project through revenue certificates. The road board said its present

membership has only four and a half months remaining in office and "it will be impossible for us to consider and receive during this administration any of the addition al reports that would be needed to determine what approach should

Before the row! board report was submitted to the commission, Gov. Warren put himself solidly behind the turnpike proposal. He told the commission he feels the proposed turnpike "offers the greatest po-tential for Florids" of any project

ever suggested.

Shirley was only a few days old when Polly Ann died two and a half years ago after a sudden violent illness. Only the death of Shirtey Diann was on the court docket for today.

murder warrant.
Sheriff Lesier Holley said Mrs. Dennison admitted, without a show of emotion, that she gave Shirley Diann arsenic in a soft drink and took her to the hospital when she went into convulsions. The child died five hours later.


