Pretty women dressed to thrill

Harley is one of the daytime dancers at Club Juana in Casselberry. She says she's dancing her way through school. One day, she'll have another career.

Today, she's concerned about her job.

She will go to her polling place to vote against the Public Decency Ordinance that would force her and several hundred dancers in other clubs in Seminole County to cover up pronto.

Harley said the women who dance totally nude are not ashamed of what they do. She said that some are single mothers, and that others like herself are working their way through college.

They've come to work at an adult club that has been in business for 35 years. Club Juana, they insist, is not some sleaze joint.

"People come here to relax and have fun," Harley said. "They come here to see pretty women dance for them."

Harley said the dancers have been talking to customers about the Public Decency Ordinance.

"We're trying to do our best to keep everything just the way it is," Harley said. "Many of our customers want it that way. A few said they aren't sure."

Owner Mike Pinter had a 35th anniversary party last week for Club Juana, inviting more than 8,000 people. "They told us that they hope we stay in operation," Pinter said.

If the ordinance passes, the dancers at Club Juana and the other clubs in the county, will no longer have nude tops or bottoms. This doesn't mean they'll go out of business but it won't be business as usual any longer.

"You hear everyone talking about 'the nude dancing thing,'" Harley said. "That's all they think this ordinance is about - the nude dancing thing. People with nothing better to do are trying to shut down these clubs."

If the ordinance is voted in, Harley said that she expects law enforcement agents will be visiting Club Juana and the other county clubs very soon.

Vote early

SEMINOLE COUNTY - On Sunday night, Sandy Goard's husband called for her to see a segment of 60 Minutes on television. It was about voter fraud.

"Vote early and vote often," used to be an election day gag. Now, the 60 Minutes crew had evidence some people actually were voting early and often.

"It's a scary thought," said Goard, Seminole County's Supervisor of Elections.

Goard expects 82 percent of the eligible voters in the county will cast the one ballot they are entitled to at the county's 133 precincts. She made her forecast several weeks ago and is sticking to it even though the statewide estimate is 55 percent.

Area voters have a number of reasons to exercise their voting privilege in 1998. The Public Decency Ordinance has created a stir throughout the county, particularly in the Casselberry/Fern Park area. These people want to cover up the nude dancers who work in clubs along U.S. Highway 17-92 and State Road 436.

The public decency ordinance - if passed - will require each dancer to cover at least a third of her breasts and buttocks. County Commission Chairman Randy Morris said the law would be enforced in

no more than two weeks.

Morris said he expected the ordinance would be passed by a wide margin. Others believe the vote will be close. Proponents of the ordinance have been busy persuading churchgoers to vote for decency and to ignore efforts by the adult entertainment industry to confuse the issue.

Sanford voters will decide once and for all if the city should continue its efforts to build a waterfront hotel/conference center at Fort Mellon Park. Wherever one goes in the city, there are signs saying support the conference center or vote "no." The debate has been heated and many are expected to cast their vote.

Republican Jeb Bush is expected to romp in the Seminole County voting for governor. The county is Republican territory and Lt. Gov. Buddy MacKay will do well to capture a third of the votes here. It will be closer statewide. If all the Democrat voters support MacKay, it may be surprisingly close.

The polls show Bush comfortably ahead but he is taking nothing for granted. The son of former president George Bush continued to campaign through the last weekend. If he is elected, Bushes will occupy two governors' mansions. George Bush, Jr., is the governor of Texas and a presidential

Sports complex in Sanford

SANFORD - Sanford Mayor Larry Dale last week released the final plans for construction of the six-field Sanford Central Sports Complex to be located at Chase Park, Zinnbeck Field, and Historic Sanford Memorial Stadium.

Four new fields at Chase Park, arranged in a clover leaf shape bordering Celery Avenue, will be placed adjacent to Zinnbeck Field and the Stadium, giving the complex a total of six fields. Construction on the \$412,000 project will begin in January, 1999, and is expected to be complete later in the year.

"This new Central Sports Complex will diversify the facilities available to attract more activity to the downtown Sanford area and will offer another modern venue for entertainment and event activities," Dale said in a press release, calling the complex "a good idea whose time has finally come."

The two fields at Fort Mellon Park will be moved to the complex. Mike Kirby, Director of Parks and Recreation, said moving the fields on Fort Mellon Park to the complex will not be effected by the results

Deputies move to Oviedo

OVIEDO - The Seminole County Sheriff's Office expanded its ability to provide services for Oviedo by opening up a new Community Service Center on Sunday.

The center, at 1100 E. Broadway Street, Suite B, in Oviedo is a centrally located place for residents to report crimes and meet with deputies. It is staffed by a commander, four sergeants, deputies, reserve deputies, range and water officers, citizens on patrol, and other staff. The space is provided for free by a local businessman.

"We're relocating to be more centrally located," Captain Randy Pittman, commander of the North Region's Neighborhood Policing program, said. "There have been a lot of fires out there that we're worried about. A Community Service Center is equivalent to what used to be called a zone or sector. It's an area a deputy will cover as part of our Neighborhood Policing program. It's a partnership with the community."

The Sheriff's Office will pay for garbage collection, pest control, and maintenance costs. The center replaces a 600 square foot complex at Geneva Elementary School

the Sheriff's Office had been using as a Community Service Center.

"We outgrew the space in Geneva," Pittman said. "The Seminole County School Board had been kind enough to let us use the space, but it became inadequate for our needs."

Deputies and investigators will continue to use the Geneva Elementary complex, Pittman said. The existing computers and desks will remain in the complex, while it is used as a sub-station.

City lets residents off the hook

LONGWOOD - The Longwood City Commission is allowing two residents to withdraw from their agreement to sell property to the city, ending what had become a bitter dispute.

Joe and Sarabecca Rosiers had signed a contract with the city agreeing to sell lots appraised at a value of \$128,500. But, the appraisal price was below what the Rosiers believed to be worth, and did not wish to sell at that price. The commission had become divided over the necessity of purchasing the property, located on Florida Avenue west off Wilma Street.

The commission voted 5-0 to draft a letter saying the city would be willing to give the Rosiers a release from the contract if the Rosiers pay for the \$2,400 appraisal fee and the \$150 title search the city had completed on the property.

"Let's go our separate ways," Joe Rosier said in a public hearing Monday. "Let's just let bygones be by-gones."

The city's interest in purchasing the Rosier Property stemmed from the potential of locating a new community center on the land. There was also discussion of placing a new fire department building on the land.

Commissioner Annamaria Vacca, who had

Graduation rate is up in Seminole County

Mentors contribute as personal cheerleaders for struggling students

SANFORD - The graduation rate is up in Seminole County Public Schools and mentors have played a critical role in this improvement, according to Jane Lane of Seminole County Public Schools.

There are still students struggling for school and life success. This is where mentors, also known as personal cheerleaders, come into the picture.

The most urgent needs are for mentors to help in the following programs: Compact and Take Stock in Children.

Compact is a second chance program created by a group of business and chamber of commerce leaders in Boston in 1982. The Seminole County Compact began in 1990 at

Seminole High. The program is available at Lake Howell, Lake Mary, Lyman, Winter Springs, and Seminole High School. Seminole County's Compact includes student exposure to and mastery of career assessments, job shadowing, personal responsibility, critical thinking, employability, use of technology, and communication (public speaking and interpersonal skills).

Currently there are 725 students in the program and only 120 mentors. Mentors help these students recognize self-defeating behaviors, attitudes, and work habits; and assist them in identifying their talents and develop strategies to maximize their talents/skills and intervene in their deficiencies.

Twenty-four students have

been selected for the Take Stock in Children Scholarship Program thus far. TSIC provides a 2+2 college scholarship (two years community college and two years university). These income-eligible students are selected in the eighth grade. The students and families sign a contract that the student will maintain their eligibility by staying drug/crime-free, maintaining good grades, and exhibiting good behavior in class. The mentors insure their continuing eligibility by meeting with the students at school on a regular basis and addressing real, or perceived obstacles to school success. The mentors commit to staying with the student until high school graduation.

There is an initial training and background check re-

quired for each new mentor. The next training is scheduled for Nov. 12, 9 a.m. at the Seminole County Public Schools Educational Support Center, 400 E. Lake Mary Boulevard, Sanford.

Dugan's better qualified

Twenty years of experience handling a variety of cases and a solid record of community involvement make David Dugan the preferred choice.

David Dugan knew when he was 10 that he wanted to become a lawyer. He did that - with remarkable success. Now he wants to serve as a judge in Florida's 18th Judicial Circuit. The *Sentinel* believes that he would do equally well at that.

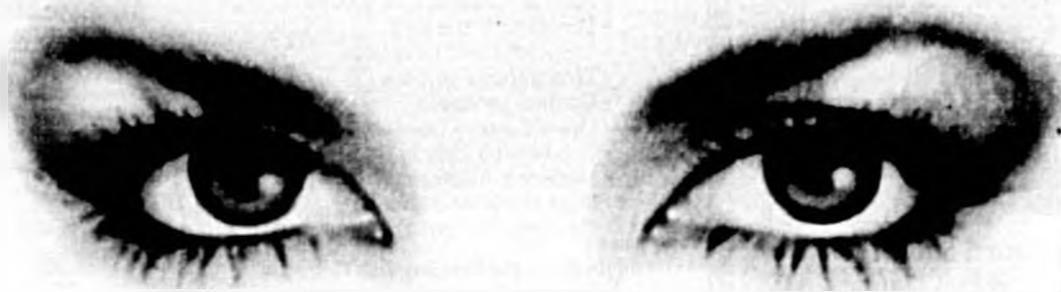

previously been a proponent for purchasing the property, said she was voting to permit the Rosiers to withdraw because residents in the historic district, business owners, and members of the Parks and Recreation Board were against locating a community center in a residential area.

"I don't think putting a community center in the middle of a neighborhood is advisable," Vacca said.

Commissioners Steve Miller and Paul Lovestrund said the city does not need to purchase the property.

"I don't think it's an appropriate place to build on," Miller said. "I really don't think we need the property. I'd like to plead with the commission that I don't see the need to bludgeon these folks (the Rosiers) on the head."

Commissioner Ron Seargent voiced concerns about potentially setting a precedent for future disputed contracts the city signs.

"We signed a binding contract," Sargent said. "What about the next time someone doesn't like a contract they've signed with the city. Are we going to just buckle under with another contract, too?"

Miller said the city is canceling a contract by "mutual agreement," and that the action does not set a precedent.

City Administrator Greg Manning said the city should wait until the results of a needs assessment study for building a new community center can be analyzed before purchasing property for a center.

"We don't have a direction yet with a needs assessment," Manning said. "We're not going to do anything until the needs assessment results are in."

Continued from Page 8A teammate Belinda Bargmann lately, but is still the class of the county. She started running as an elementary school student at Forest City, then gave it up to work on basketball.

That didn't work out, so, as a freshman at Lake Brantley, she was talked into running again and started to work out.

It didn't take long for her to make an impact on a very good team. The Patriots visited the annual race at Walt Disney World and Cornell, who started the freshman season running junior varsity, finished 19th overall and started pushing Ashley Nasser, one of the state's best.

She also learned to love the sport. "When I don't run I get moody," Cornell said. "My mom can tell if I haven't been running by my moods. Sometimes she tells me to just get out and run and I love to do it."

Cornell trains with her teammates about 40 miles each week, but racks up more on her own. It's also become a year-round sport since she'll be racing in national meets throughout the rest of the year. She said she only gets a week off once in a while, but is looking especially forward to the Foot Locker national qualifier in North Carolina a few weeks after the Florida state meet.

With all of her success, she knows there's usually going to be an entire field of runners gunning especially for her. "At the smaller meets there's not a lot of pressure," Cornell said. "It only matters how we do at the end of the season and, well, were at the end of the season now."

She said Harris stresses the regular season as a tune-up for the later races, but a race at Disney last month, where Cornell finished third overall

and second among Class 6A runners, provided her with as much gauge as to where she stands in the states.

Last year, she finished ninth in the states, but that might not be enough this season with expectations for herself and the Patriots running so high.

It's still early, and Cornell always has next year. In fact, almost all of Lake Brantley's runners - Kristen McCarthy and Dara Wise are the only seniors - will return next season, but Cornell said this has to be the year the Patriots make it over the top.

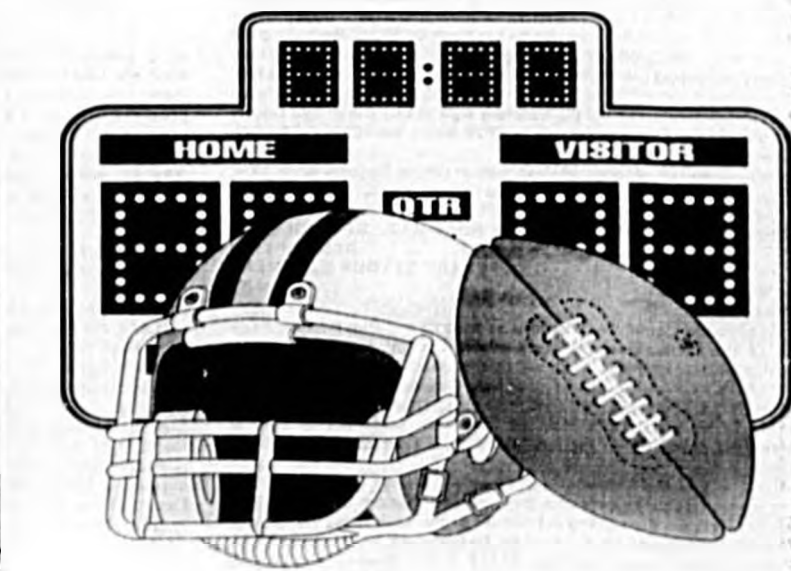

What is Lewy body disease?

DEAR DR. GOTT: After having been treated for several years for Parkinson's disease, my father was finally diagnosed with Lewy body disease. What is this?

DEAR READER: Lewy (pronounced "Louie") body disease is a form of dementia that can resemble Parkinson's disease. It is becoming increasingly more recognized. Patients often exhibit an action tremor (as opposed to the resting tremor of Parkinson's disease), sedation from the anti-Parkinson drugs they often receive, hallucinations and bizarre muscular contractions. At autopsy, peculiar changes in the nerve cells of the brain are commonly discovered.

The cause of Lewy body dementia is unknown and there is no treatment. However, considerable research is currently underway in a number of teaching centers to investigate this affliction.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I have been told that I have multiple aortic aneurysms, filled with clots. I'm not eager for surgery.

DEAR READER: Eager or not, you should have it.

Your condition is marked by several areas where the aorta is bulging and weak. Blood clots have formed in these dilated, stretched areas. If left untreated, at least two serious consequences can develop.

First, the aorta may further dilate, leak blood or rupture. In either case, you will experience life-threatening complications.

Second, the blood clots in the aneurysms may break off and be carried to your brain, causing strokes.

If I were you, I wouldn't hesitate to have the aneurysms repaired. To do otherwise is to risk preventable tragedy.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I'm a 55-year-old woman with polymyalgia, and I'm currently on low dose prednisone to control the pain in my muscles and joints. Even though I'm also taking hormone therapy, I worry that the prednisone will eventually cause me to develop osteoporosis. What can I do to prevent this?

DEAR READER: You are in a tough spot. Although you need the prednisone to control the symptoms of polymyalgia, the drug will almost certainly cause your bones to lose calcium. This, plus the fact that you are menopausal, significantly increases your risk of osteoporosis.

In your position, I'd approach the problem in a stepwise fashion. To begin with, you should have a bone density test now. This simple and relatively inexpensive test will show the

ous consequences.

In my opinion, you should have a bone density test every year. At the time the test indicates significant calcium-loss — or now, if your bones show a deficiency — you may have to consider more aggressive therapy, such as Fosamax, a medication that reverses calcium-loss from bones.

For obvious reasons, you should take the lowest dose of prednisone to reduce your symptoms. You should also take about 1500 milligrams of calcium daily, along with 500 units of vitamin D.

To give you related information, I am sending you a copy of my Health Report "Medical Specialists."

WIN AT BRIDGE

More on the fourth suit

By Phillip Alder

Let's look further at fourth suit forcing. Opener bids one suit, responder a second suit, opener a third suit, and responder closes the square, bidding the fourth suit. What will the opener expect his partner to hold?

Usually, the responder will have one of three hand types. As we saw yesterday, he could have a balanced hand and wants to get into three no-trump, but he doesn't have a stopper in the fourth suit. Alternatively, the responder may wish to make a forcing raise of one partner's suits. Thirdly, the responder may be uncertain where to head, but thinks that after hearing a third bid from his partner, he will know — as in this deal.

On the second round, North might

have plunged into three no-trump, but there was no need to rush. Instead, he used fourth suit forcing. When he learned that his partner had at least 5-5 in the majors, North raised to four hearts, the known eight card fit.

In the play, South used the reliable guideline that if you have a two-suiter and must get the second suit established, play on it immediately. So, declarer won the first trick with dummy's diamond king and pulled a spade to his king. When that won, South played a heart to dummy's ace, then called for the remaining spade.

Understandably, East went in with the ace and returned a diamond to South's ace. (It doesn't help him to duck again.) Declarer cashed the heart king, getting the bad news there, but it didn't matter. He calmly continued with a low spade. However West defended, declarer would lose only one spade and two hearts.
