Well, they discovered that in certain particular lines "big business" is just about all the business there is. For instance, when it opmes to the manufacture of cigarettes instance, when it spines to the manufacture of cigarettes, they found that 91.4 percent of all the wage carners or ployed in the making of cigarettes work for one or another of just four companies. In other words in the cigarette industry four big corporations practically cover the entire field. Big business is about all there is to it.

On the other, hand, these same statisticions further discovered that when it comes to the manufacture of wom-

en's clothing the six largest manufacturers in the country employ only 3.7 percent of all the wage carners making such clothing. In other words "big business" in the clothing industry doesn't amount to much. Most of the clothes in the country are made by the little fellows. A law requiring "big business" to pay big wages, thus would not help much in the clothing industry.




