# Are To Be Opened Today; Roads Report Tomorrow

Seminole Counties, were to be opened in Tallahassee today. Originally scheduled to be opened

yesterday in the Florida Department of Transportation (DOT) auditorium, the opening was delayed one day according to DOT officials. The present sub-standard width facility will

be replaced with a 44 foot wide bridge, 2,426 feet in length as it covers the St. Johns River, and would be a part of the 1.6 mile overall

Starting in tomorrow's Herald there will be a three-part series dealing with the roads system in Seminole County. The report is based on an extensive interview with

Bridge bid contract allows 400 work days for completion of the project. After the issuance of the work order, the firm is allowed 60 days n which to secure all necessary material and equipment to construct the bridge.

The bridge was the site of a tragic accident last November at which time five persons lost their lives when the van in which they were passengers was bumped off the bridge into the murky St. Johns River.

Local civic leaders have been trying for the past 30 years to have the span replaced.

There were occasions when the bridge replacement was included in that year's scheduled road budget, only to see it removed due to lack of funds, or a change in road needs

#### **Congress Nears Decision**

#### On Troops For Evacuation

WASHINGTON (AP) - As Congress nears decisions on whether U.S. troops can be used to help evacuate Americans from South Vietnam, officials say U.S. diplomatic efforts are aimed at saving the city of Saigon from the ravages of war. If a cease-fire and a political settlement can be achieved before Hanoi's troops enter Saigon, U.S. officials say they are confident that many thousands of South Vietnamese can be evacuated. Up to 131,000 Indochina refugees will be permitted to enter the United States under emergency steps approved by Atty. Gen. Edward H. Levi.

#### Quints Chances 'Quite Good'

CINCINNATI, Ohio (AP) - "We knew there were at least three. We were amazed. They just kept coming," says the doctor who delivered quintuplets to a 28-year-old Fairfield, Ohio, woman. The three girls and two boys, an estimated four weeks premature, were born Tuesday to Pamela Levy, the wife of an advertising aide for Procter & Gamble Manufacturing Co. Pediatricians at General Hospital said the prognosis for the five infants, as yet unnamed, "is quite good."

#### Prison Riot Kills One

JOLIET, Ill. (AP) - State officials are considering criminal prosecution of inmates involved in a six-hour takeover of a Joliet Correctional Center cellblock that left one prisoner dead and eight persons injured. Inmates held 12 persons hostage at the outset of the rebellion. Prisoner Herbert Catlett was found in a cell with his throat slashed by another unidentified inmate, prison officials said after the disturbance was quelled Tuesday night.

Viet Cong Rejects First Bid For Negotiated Peace

SAIGON (AP) - President Tran Van Huong, thrust into office two days ago by the resignation of Nguyen Van Thieu, made a bid for negotiated peace today. "The proposal fools no one and will hardly help the Americans out of their defeat," said the Viet Cong delegation is Saigon, refusing the offer. The Saigon command admitted that the South Vietnamese army had withdrawn from Ham Tan, capital of Binh Tuy province on the coast 7 miles east of Saigon. Binh Tuy was the 21st of South Vietnam's 44 provinces lost this year. Heavy fighting also was reported south of Tay Ninh, and field reports indicated the government was preparing to write off that provincial capital 55 miles northwest of Saigon.

#### Cambodian Leader Flees

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) - Another Cambodian leader on the Communist death list has fled to Thailand, eaving only two of the seven unaccounted for. Thai officials said former Premier In Tam fled across the border last Saturday with three other persons as they were being pursued and fired on by Khmer Rouge soldiers. Of the other six men the Khmer Rouge said they would execute as traitors, only former Premiers Long Boret and Sisowath Sirik Matak are believed to be in custody in Phnom Penh, or they may have been executed.



If you want to have your trip mentioned in any publication, do it AFTER you get back. And, when you go on vacation, either stop delivery or have a friend or neighbor pick up your newspaper and your mail. Stop other deliveries and make arrangements for someone to keep your lawn
