### Your Slow Cooker Can Yield A Fine Fig Pudding

Makes 10 to 12 servings.

Among the most popular recipes we have offered is one for VALUE aponata that came from a good Italian home cook. Heat to boiling, then simmer uncovered, stirring occasionally, until eggplant is completely tender but still holds its shape - about 26



"We're Americans, and we're good citizens," Anthony Leffler's correspondence was in reply to a letter from

the Galbos asking that jury summons cease being mailed because their names were taken off the voter registration rolls in 1974. The reason, according to the Galbos, they had their names removed was that Anthony is a carpenter and

#### Patricia Hearst Claims Psychiatrist Bullied Her

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Patricia Hearst, taking the witness stand 12 days before her trial for bank robbery, has accused a government psychiatrist of bullying her to a point of tears with pointed questions about the hold:

"He asked me if I felt proud about robbing a bank and I said 'no.' Everything was like an accusation," the newspaper heiress said in a clear but soft voice. "He didn't care what I said or didn't say." The special pretrial hearing was called Wednesday to determine whether the psychiatrist, Dr. Harry Kozol of Boston, would be permitted to continue his examination of

One of Miss Hearst's attorneys, Al Johnson, characterized Kozol as an "FBI interrogator." He said he ended the jail examination after Kozol's questions forced Miss Hearst to leave the room in tears.

#### Soviet Navy Scrutinized

WASHINGTON (AP) - Based on recent movements by Russian warships, U.S. intelligence sources say the Soviet Union may be preparing a further buildup of its naval strength off the West African coast within cruising distance of Angola.

The concern of U.S. analysts is sharpened by the reported presence of four Russian naval tankers, which U.S. experts say could enable the Soviet navy to sustain a larger force than is now located within a few day's Meanwhile, U.S. intelligence has been tracking a 19,000-

ton Sverdlov class cruiser, which has moved through the western Mediterranean toward Gibralter in recent days, and a 5,200-ton Kashin class guided-missile destroyer which has been spotted southeast of Portugal.

\$36,000 in cash from bankers in 1970 and unspecified sums in LaSpada charged that



### West Losing In Angola

Recent developments in Angola, in which the Soviet-sponsored group of revolutionaries — the MPLA - has grasped the military and diplomatic initiative from competing groups favored by the West, was not unexpected, albeit the rapid pace of the demise of a free Angola is stunning.

So far as the war is concerned, the MPLA was left with a nearly clear field when the U.S. Congress voted not to spend any funds in Angola. Diplomatically, the way is being cleared for the MPLA by the inaction of the United Nations which is looking the other way during the most recent Soviet intervention into Africa, and by the Organization of African Unity which is preparing to recognize the MPLA early next month. Twenty-one of the OAU members have recognized the MPLA as the legitimate government of Angola. None has recognized the other two claimants.

In short, the handwriting is being written on the wall legibly and in large letters. The West is losing ground rapidly in Angola while the Soviet Union is well on its way toward extending its influence throughout all of southern Africa. It is no accident that the policy of humiliating

white residents remaining in Mozambique began almost at the precise moment that the tide turned in Angola. Nor is it an accident that guerrillas in South West Africa killed whites for the first time during the same time frame. The OAU conference which convened on Jan. 8, may see a military fait accompli in Angola and strong expressions by Africans against white "colonists" elsewhere.

Undoubtedly it was these hard facts of life that led South Africa to withdraw from Angola. Its decision to pull its troops back has left the United States in a tough position. If we continue to assist those who oppose the MPLA takeover, we may be opposing the majority on the OAU and we will be accused of prolonging the bloody revolution in Angola. If we do nothing we will accede to the imposition of a government, not wanted by an overwhelming majority of people in Angola, to Soviet imperialism and to long range ferment in

In times like these it is principle and right that should prevail over expediency. We cannot cut and run, but must continue to do all that we can to help those in the trenches.

At the same time we must make it very clear to the Soviet Union that its role in Angola does not fit into our interpretation of detente.

### Timor Invasion

resolution was 72-10 with the United States abstaining. Indonesia has rejected the U.N. demand as irrelevant. At the time it was seized, Portuguese Timor had been undergoing a civil war that began last summer when the Por-

tuguese colonial administration lost control. Indonesia has ruled the western half of the island of Timor but the eastern half has been ruled by Portugal for 400 years. There was no real excuse for the invasion and seizure. It was an

act of naked aggression, and once again American arms were put to a use not intended by the donors. Congress should consider carefully the proposal to give \$43 million more in military aid to Indonesia.

### DON OAKLEY Rejecting A Future Of Doom

It is always useful to remind ourselves that what the Soviets commemorate every November as the anniversary of the 1917 "Russian Revolution" was a palace coup in which Lenin and the Bolsheviks subverted the real revolution achieved by the Russian people

Fifty-eight Novembers after that event, whose consequences for the world have been incalculable, the Communists in another country attempted to seize control of another popular lution and, history can happily record.

There is no comparison between Russia and Portugal, of course, and only the weakest analogy can be drawn between what happened in happened in the other in November, 1975. The two countries could not be more different, in size or history or national character or international

Yet for many worrisome months following the bloodless overthrow of the remnant Salazar dictatorship in April, 1974, it seemed that Portugal was fated to undergo the experience of World War I Russia. Many of the same ingredients were present - political instability. unrest in the military formented by a strongly organized left, the drain of a foreign war (Angola), economic dislocation, strikes and riots - if on a far smaller scale.

The crunch came last November when dissident paratroopers seized three military bases and were joined by other rebellious units. It appeared to be the beginning of real civil war, or certainly the final withering of Portugal's

But the centrist government held firm, the Communists backed off, and to the surprise of all the pessimists Portugal emerged without bloodshed from yet another crisis with the country's moderate, democratic forces all the

There is every reason to hope that it may have been the last such crisis. Whether or not men learn anything from history, in this case Russian history, little Portugal at least at this writing offers

### 'Adams Papers' Causing A Stir

### Zoo Park Offered As Nature Center

Central Florida Zoological Society President John Sobik Jr., is offering some 100 acres of wooded property for use in a joint project to develop an educational nature center for children. Sobik's proposal comes after county and school officials Monday agreed on the concept of establishing the nature center at Big Tree Park

East near Lake Jessup. A quorum was reached by the Seminole County Commission approving the concept of a nature center at Tuesday's meeting when Commissioner Harry Kwiatkowski okayed it. School Supt. William P. Layer said today school

officials will "consider all alternatives" and that land at the zoo "at first impulse would seem to be a easible alternative." Initial approval by the county came from commissioner Richard Williams and Commission

Chairman Michael Hattaway. Today, Williams said it is the school's project, and "if they want to put it at the zoo — I think that's great." Williams stressed, however, that he favors the site that would serve the most people for the least amount of dollars. Sobik says the zoo-owned land is the best

possible alternative. "What I do not understand is why it is necessary to develop the Big Tree Park East for such a study since the Central Florida Zoological Society has already spent in excess of \$350,000 on some 100 acres of wooded property, left as natural as possible, adjoining Lake Monroe for just such a purpose," Sobik says.
