# Reds Hammer Yank Column

SAIGON (AP) — Blazing away with flame throwers and hurling dynamite bombs, about 150 North Vietnamese troops attacked an American armored column in the northwest corner of South Vietnam early today. The U.S. command said at least 34 of the enemy were killed by American artillery fire. The attacking force was reported to have crashed through the outer defenses of the camp before the attack was repulsed, a U.S. spokesman said. The remaining enemy troops pulled back about an hour before dawn.

The fighting raged five miles from the Laotian border, after the death of President Rene Barrientos in a helicopter crash. Vice President Luis Adolfo Siles Salinas backed Barrientos after military leaders gave him the backing of the Bolivian armed forces. However, the man with whom Barrientos shared the reins of government for a time after the military coup in 1964, Gen. Alfredo Ovando, was not consulted. 
# B52s Hit Reds Anew





### 'Fixed Base Operator' Explained

By BILL SCOTT

Sanford Airport Manager J. Cleveland today issued a statement defining the duties of an airport manager, fixed base operator and outlining other responsibilities of nations leasing property at the former Navy Air Station.

Cleveland said it was evident from the many inquiries received from people asking questions about the airport operation that a misunderstanding over the duties of a fixed base operator.

For these reasons and to insure that the general public is aware of the manner in which the Sanford Airport will operate, Cleveland said the public should know that the airport is wholly owned by the City of Sanford and that Sanford Industrial Commission has been delegated the task of developing programs and policies for the airport's operation, which will be revenue producing in form, thereby becoming a self-sustaining operation.

Cleveland further informed that he, as airport manager, was charged by the SIC with the responsibility for placing into effect these programs and policies which the SIC believes to be in the best interest of the airport and the community as a whole.

Included are rules and regulations with which all tenants must comply; aviation programs and activities, construction, improvements, and repair and maintenance of airport facilities.

"Probably the most misunderstood area of operation concerned the fixed base operator, who in no way exercises any management control of the airport, he said.

In simple terms, Cleveland said every major airport in the United States has facilities for aircraft cleaning, engine overhaul and repair, aircraft rental, aviation spare parts and accessories, a means of supplying fuel and other lubricants to aircraft owners and operators, and many other revenue producing activities.

"Since this type business is a commercial enterprise and the city would, if it attempted to provide these services, become a commercial enterprise in competition with legitimate business concerns, it is necessary to contract for these services by a lease agreement for a considerable sum of money and a percentage of the gross sales," the manager said.

Cleveland stated that the organization of person who obtains the right from the city to provide these services is called the fixed base operator.

The FBO is, in general terms, a commercial entity providing general aviation services in one or more following areas: Aircraft sales, fuel sales, aircraft service and repair, instructional flying service, air taxi operations and aircraft rentals.

The airport manager voiced his opinion that Sanford was fortunate in acquiring the services of Page Airways as a fixed base operator in its search for an FBO.

"Page," Cleveland said, "has vast experience in FBOs and is financially sound with a progressive business outlook."

In order to develop the airport, Cleveland said it would require much capital investment to realize the full potential of the facility.

"Although the airport probably will operate at a deficit the first few years, it is expected that the city together with Page Airways will develop the facility into one of the best general aviation airports in the country," Cleveland concluded.
