



Sanford Z&P Considers Shevin May Withhold Ruling

The Sanford Zoning and Planning Commission will consider recommending changes to reduce off-street parking requirements for new office buildings at its Thursday 8 p.m. meeting at city hall.

Proposed is a 30 per cent reduction of square footage of floor area used for office spaces when computing off-street parking spaces that will be required under city

The city zoning ordinance now requires seven parking spaces per 1,000 square feet of office space. The proposed change would effectively drop the requirement to five spaces per 1,000 square feet of office space. City commissioners can amend the zoning ordinance after proposals are considered by the Z-P board and after a city commission public hearing on the amendment.

Other items on the Z-P agenda include consideration of site development plans for a new building at Seminole Paint and Body Shop, 2540 S. Myrtle Avenue and a 1,500 square foot addition to the 90,000 square foot Harcar Aluminum Products plant at 3500 Orlando Drive (U.S. 17-92

Harcar officials said they plan to construct the small addition on an existing concrete pad for use as covered storage

A public Learing is scheduled on a request to change and amend the zoning ordinance section on conditional uses permitted in general commercial zones. Proposed is addition of the wording "and after approval by the Sanford City Com-

Also scheduled is a public hearing on Condev Corporation's request for medium industrial zoning on nine acres east of Airport Boulevard and north of Jewett Lane for a proposed building components

The hearing may be cancelled since the Z-P board can hold such hearings only after the property is annexed. Monday night Cendev officials had city com missioners table adoption of the annexation ordinance after second reading The annexation ordinance adoption

can be tabled, under the Mooney Law, for six months or less. After that time the annexation can't be accomplished for two years. Commissioners said Condev must give the go ahead on the annexation by May 13 in order to meet requirements for adoption of the tabled ordinance.

John O. Outlaw, vice president of Condev subsidiary Engineered Systems Inc., said the reason for requesting tabling is to give time for coordinating a \$30,000 rail siding which will serve the new plant.

National News Briefs

'Shocking' Sight

WASHINGTON (AP) - When District of Columbia officials gathered to dedicate a bicentennial building, they were confronted with mural-like sketches of Mao Tse-tung, Joseph Stalin and President Nixon in gangster garb.

The artist, H. H. Booker Jr., said no one told him what to draw, "They just said to make faces," he said. Some of the faces, drawn in charcoal around the top of a room in the D.C. Bicentennial Building, aren't likely to survive until 1976.

Payment Fails

SAN DIEGO (AP) - Royal Inns of America, Inc., which worked out a plan to pay creditors and avoid bankruptcy, says it failed to make a scheduled \$300,000 payment this month.

A credit group which arranged the plan blamed the failure on energy-related troubies in the Florida hotel industry and tightened purse strings at Crocker Bank. An official of the troubled hotel chain said Wednesday he hoped the payment would be made by Feb. 15.

Energy Gloomy

WASHINGTON (AP) - An oil industry group has released figures that appear to signal a tightening of the Arab oil embargo and a worsening of the gasoline shortage. The American Petroleum Institute on Wednesday said imports decreased 12.2 per cent last week from the previous week. And the weekly report said U.S. gasoline stocks dropped by 3.6 million barrels.

She said with Brando's cooperation she had been seeing Christian during the past few months. Her son attended her wedding to Los Angeles businessman James Hannaford in Las Vegas last Saturday. Brando and Miss Kashfi were married in 1957 and divorced two years later. She relinquished custody of the boy to Brando in a 1972 court proceeding.

Love Failure

SEATTLE (AP) - John D. Ehrlichman says former presidential energy adviser John A. Love failed in the job because he was a White House outsider who could not get his hands on Washington's levers of power. Love left the job Dec. 3. Ehrlichman, who resigned as President Nixon's top domestic affairs adviser last April, said Love's job as energy adviser required the "pulling together of vying and competing efforts of the executive branch" of government, a job too tough for an

Skylab Hot

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) Skylab 3's astronauts have turned off lights and other equipment and altered work schedules to combat a temporary heat wave in their orbiting station Because of the relation of the spacecraft to the sun, the station began a four-day period on Tuesday in which it whirls through continuous sunlight, with no darkness to cool things down. Temperatures have risen inside the craft from 71 to 81 degrees and are expected to reach 85 to 87 degrees Friday before starting to cool over the weekend.



Change School Hours

Let's Put Children Back In Sunlight

For the second time in a row, the Seminole County School Board has refused to change school starting times to coincide with daylight hours, and by doing so is continuing to jeopardize the lives of thousands of children.

It's bad enough that Daylight Savings Time was imposed in the first place, but childrenstrolling to school in the dark is, in our opinion, simply ludicrous.

The board's overriding objections to changing schedules seem to be that it would wreak havoc within the system by altering busing timetables, and some children on double sessions would miss out on certain school ac-

Only board member Mrs. Jean Bryant has thus far shown the foresight to try and change the starting times. School Supt. Bud Layer also tried to move starting times ahead 30 minutes, but his idea was rejected because it wouldn't remove the children from the darkness anyway.

To the first objection, we say so what if the school system's personnel had to come up with a workable changeover? After all, isn't the school system supposed to be run for the children and not for either the faculty or staff?

And, having some children miss a few school activities is a small price indeed to pay for expanded safety.

And if changing school hours inconveniences parents who have to go to work, why not have the school system start a plan to keep students occupied for an hour or so until their parents can

Board member Stuart Culpepper said he is against changing the hours because too few people now are experiencing difficulties. This might be so, but what about the danger

inherent in walking in darkness? Counties throughout Florida have been changing school hours almost like clockwork (Brevard, Orange, and Duval for a few exam-



The cost estimates were made by an independent Stanford research group, which studied Occidental's pilot project in Colorado. The final cost of delivering the oil to suppliers, after all the pumping and piping has been figured in, would run between two dollars and three dollars a barrel.

Nixon's Sound System: Despite President Nixon's extreme sensitivity over the Watergate tapes, he now wants to install a new recording system in the White House.

It won't be used, however, to make secret tapes of the conversations in the oval office, a la Watergate, but to record the crooners and comedians who perform at official White House functions in the East Room. The President's communications experts want a sound

system so sophisticated it may never be built. Motivated perhaps

by those "sinister forces" that wiped out an 18-minute segment of a crucial Watergate tape, they also want a back-up unit. The specifications, sent confidentially to potential bidders, call for "two mixing consoles" capable of taking the sounds from 16 different microphones and then mixing them onto a two-track

QUALITY STRESSED

Although the system is supposed to be used in the White Hous which is buffeted only by the President's tirades and has been cooled down only to 68 degrees, the two identical consoles must survive "a shock of five G's" and temperatures 80 degrees below zero. Indeed, they must be able to "operate" at freezing temperatures and in a thundering downpour.

The men who operate these electronic marvels, furthermore, nay have to do it in the dark. Declares the document: "The console will, at times, be operated in the East Room . . . under extremely low light conditions. 11-lumination must now allow any noticeable spill over of light over the front of the console as this will be in view of both the East Room audience and the per-

Unlike Rose Mary Woods' tape recorder, the new sound system is also supposed to be designed with the best failsafe features that modern technology can provide.



One expert described the proposed sound system as "spaceage technology." Another called it "a highly professional system equiring extremely sophisticated engineering." A third declared flatly that "no one in the country can build the thing the way they

Some of the engineers we consulted made comments that might interest the Watergate prosecutors. They cited the highly detailed specifications as evidence that the White House communications experts are far too professional professional to produce tape recordings marred with erasures and excessive

Commander Tom Coats of the White House Communications Agency, who prepared the solicitation offer, explained he was trying to obtain "the best and most economical system" available. Having giving us his "position on this," the commander decalred he could not "talk about it anymore" and refused to answer further questions.

The crisis: a little in it for everyone

One of the most impressive events of recent weeks was the dimming of America's Christmas lights because of the

While the energy saving is mostly symbolic in those areas where electricity is manufactured from coal and where there is no real crisis, it was an important symbol. It

Americans are ready to do what has to be done. It remains for their leaders and for the experts to guide them truthfully and wisely. And therein lies a growing problem as we go deeper into the age of scarcity, how to separate facts from phoniness, the crisis from a spate of "crises."

On congressman, for example, Rep. William H. Harsha, R-Ohio, says he has discovered that at least one oil company







World News Briefs

Channel Storm Kills 14

DOVER, England (AP) — Hundred-mile winds whipped up 50-foot waves in the English Channel Wednesday night and today, drowning at least 14 persons and sinking a 781on Danish coastal freighter. Another ship, the 2,447-ton Cypriot freighter Marta, was on fire, and her captain adjoed that the 20-man crew could not launch lifeboats because of the high seas.

Chinese Beachhead Formed

SAIGON, South Vietnam (AP) - The South Vietnamese government reported today that two Red Chinese warships are guarding a settlement established Wednesday by Chinese fishermen in the disputed Paracel Islands. Saigon's chief military spokesman said the trawlers anded the fishermen on one of the coral islands in the South China Sea Wednesday, and the men set up huts and planted their flag. Then the warships began to patrol in the area, the spokesman said. Both South Vietnam and China claim the Paracels, which are a chain of coral reefs about 250 miles east of Hue, South Vietnam, and 175 miles southeast of the Chinese island of Hainan. The spokesman said a South Vietnamese unit is stationed on one of the slands about nine miles from the one the Chinese landed

16 Cubans Leave Jail.

NASSAU, Bahamas (AP) - Sixteen Cuban fishermen who spent a week in jail after being charged with illegal ishing in Bahamian waters are free to sail for home

Magistrate Emmanuel Osadebay imposed fines anging from \$500 to \$1,000 on three fishingboat captains Wednesday after being told by prosecutors that Cuban officials, paying a rare visit to the Bahamas, promised that boats from Cuba would not again violate the 12-mile fishing-rights zone claimed by the Bahamas. Osadebay cautioned and then discharged the 13 crewmen of the captains.

Kissinger Ready To Rest

JERUSALEM (AP) - Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger says he's getting ready for a letdown if his shuttle diplomacy between the Israelis and the Egyptians produces the agreement he has been working to achieve. "People think that when it's all finished you feel exhilarated," he said somewhat glumly as the jet he has practically lived in for a week flew him to Egypt again on

"My experience when I'm finished with a negotiation is that I'm usually let down. Kissinger has been getting less and less sleep as he flies back and forth between Egypt and Israel and confers long hours at each end. His normal quota on the road is about

five hours a night. He made his trip to Egypt on Wed-

sday after only 31/2 hours sleep.

Mideast Peace Pact Near Final Solution

JERUSALEM (AP) - An agreement to separate Israeli and Egyptian forces along the Suez Canal is about 90 per cent comlete and none of the obstacles remaining is a "gut issue," a highranking U.S. official said after Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger returned from more talks with the Egyptians.

Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban conceded after talking with Kissinger Wednesday night that the American mediator had made "certain progress" on his latest visit to Egyptian President Anwar Sadat. But he cautioned that there remained "some substantial points to be clarified."

Israel's first snowstorm of the winter delayed the resumption of dissinger's talks with Israeli leaders an hour today. Security guards decided Jerusalem's traffic was too chaotic because of the slushy streets for Kissinger to venture out of the King David Hotel, so army jeeps brought Deputy Premier Yigal Allon, Eban and Defense Minister Moshe Dayan to him.

Egyptian newspapers wrote of a disengagement agreement today in terms that also indicated one was near. "The wording and clauses of each provision will be clear and precise in such a way as to avoid ambiguity or misinterpretation by any of the parties," said Al Gomhouriya. "Each of the Israeli pullback stages will be implemented ac-

cording to a timetable and will stipulate minute details on the transport of equipment and thinning out of Israeli troops, the number of these forces and the kinds of weapons."

However, no one gave any indication of how the various points of disagreement previously reported were being resolved. These include Israel's demand that Egyptian forces on the eas ank of the canal be reduced and rocket and antiaircraft missile unchers on that side of the waterway be removed. Also included is Egypt's insistence that Israel commit itself to the position that

its withdrawal of troops from the canal is the first step in a with-

drawal from other occupied Arab territory. Meanwhile, Premier Golda Meir's Israeli government was under fire at home. Its chief political opposition, the rightwing Likud bloc that made sizable gains in the general election New Year's Eve, charged that the government was negotiating a "onesided retreat of our forces, not disengagement.

Editorials in Israeli newspapers were also largely critical. U.S. officials mentioned the possibility of private unwritter understandings between the two sides, and many Israelis be lieved these might include an Egyptian promise to end the formal state of war against Israel that has been in existence since the 1948 Palestine war. But the Israeli government has been under pressure from critics not to accept verbal promises from the

Jakarta Rioting Ceases; Tanaka Goes To Japan

JAKARTA, Indonesia (AP) — Indonesia's capital was quiet once again today as Prime Minister Kakuei Tanaka of Japan ended a visit that sparked two days of student riots.

A helicopter took Tanaka, his daughter Makiko and President Suharto from the presidential guest house to the airport. There cabinet members and foreign diplomats said goodbye, but no students were on hand.

Tanaka arrived Monday night and spent his entire visit in the heavily guarded presidential palace compound because of the violence Tuesday and Wednesday.

At least seven persons were killed in the disorders, which started with airport demonstrations on Tanaka's arrival Monday and expanded into street rioting Tuesday and Wednesday. Some 10,000 demonstrators joined in the protests, and more than 200

The demonstrators, like those at other stops on Tanaka's tour of Southezst Asia, accused the Japanese of economic colonialism.

'Mantle At Bat'

Number 7 Still Dreaming

NEW YORK (AP) - It's been five years since Mickey Mantle has gone to the plate and officially taken one of his classic swings at a baseball, but he stills dreams about it. "That's the truth," insists the newest member of baseball's Hall of Fame, "but you might call it a nightmare instead. I am always dreaming about trying to make a

"In one dream, I drive up to Yankee Stadium and can't get n. In the background, I hear the loud speaker blaring, 'At bat, number 7, Mickey Mantle.' I try to squeeze through a hole, but there I am stuck. It's a terrible feeling.

"In another dream, I am at bat, batting left-handed, and all the balls are blooping off to the left. I can't get the bat around. It's awful." Mantle and his longtime closest friend and roommate with the Yankees, pitcher Whitey Ford, were chosen by vote of

baseball writers Wednesday to be honored at Cooperstown, N.Y., taseball shrine. It was a happy coincidence for the two very closely allied diamond greats from opposite backgrounds - the raw, backward Mantle, out of the zinc mines of Commerce, Okla., and

the brash, cocky Ford, a product of New York's teeming sidewalks. "I miss New York," Mantle said. "I miss people yelling out at me when I get into a cab, saying, 'Hey, Mick, wadda ya know, Mick?' In Dallas, nebody knows I'm there. Sometimes I catch a plane in Dallas and people will say, 'Hey, Mickey, what are you doing here?' and I'll say, 'I live here - I've lived here 17 years.""

He also misses the thrills of the game. "Baseball was just a series of thrills for me," he said. "There were so many and they came so fast I didn't appreciate them. Now I do. People are always sending me scrapbooks. I must have 29 or 30. I keep one by my bed all the

Mickey isn't sorry he quit after the 1968 season. He wouldn't want to be a designated hitter. Managing doesn't appeal to him. "I couldn't have gone on," he said. "Sometimes when I was playing my leg pained me so much I said to myself, 'What's it for? Why don't I go home and quit?' But I stuck it out.

"I could never be a manager. Can you imagine me telling a bunch of guys to get to bed at 12 o'clock?' Ford, 45, who is a Yankee pitching coach but who like Mantle has lucrative insurance, banking and real estate interests, said he never recalled a cross word between himself and the Yankee home run slugger.

"Mickey was really country when he came up," Whitey said. "He was shy, backward, afraid to say anything. I was pretty cocky. So we hit it off." "People thought I was aloof," Mickey said. "I wasn't aloof.





Florida Cooperative Extension . . Can all sleeping bags be washed? I am getting ready to store anymore until spring, I would like to be certain they are clean. This question is frequently asked since camping has become the great American sport of so many families. Some bags are

washable, some require dry cleaning and some cannot be cleaned at all. Hopefully, you kept the hang-tag and label with information concerning the fiber content and care instructions which should have come with your bag. This should give you directions for care and storage. If you do not have these, your best solution would be to write the manufacturer for care instructions, or go back to the store where you purchased it and check similar bags. If you do have a sleeping bag that requires dry cleaning, be certain to air it interior decorator and part car The most promising of these cleanability and can be surance is not required to cross well after it returns from the dry cleaners. If you do not qualify at either of these places, investigate the terms offered by reputable finance companies and other lenders before you consider accepting terms

## Detective Sleuthing

Is Needed By GEORGE W. CRANE. PhD., M.D.

Prof. Jay needed some detective sleuthing! For he was a popular, articulate speaker until two years ago. Then students began complaining that they couldn't understand him as well. Can you diagnose his problem? Ten million readers have it, too!

"Yes," he admitted, "for I got full dentures a couple of years And that was when his ficulty understanding him. After people obtain false teeth they often fail to use their upper lip as freely in forming the consonants of speech.

Thus, they keep an immobile upper lip and develop gutteral Their words thus remain in the throat, like the conversation of Orientals.

Indeed, they subconsciously slip into the ventriloquist's habit of keeping their lips as quiet as possible while talking. The main difference between Prof. Jay and a talented ventriloquist is the fact that the ventriloquist consciously keeps his lips immovable. Prof. Jay unwittingly does

much the same thing. And that should be a warning to all of you folks who wear To offset this tendency to use

gutteral speech, practice before your bathroom mirror every day as you brush your teeth. Recite poetry or improvise little speeches so you can watch your image and then make sure that upper lip moves freely in forming the many consonants. Deaf lipreaders often complain that people wearing false teeth are difficult for them to
