A New Life

One of the most prominent recent arrivals in this country, not as a refugee from a foreign land but as a transfer from one fighting front to another is Lord Louis Mountbatten, a cousin of King George VI of England and close friend of the Duke of Windsor. Mountbatten arrived in New York the other day with his wife by Dixie Clipper from Lisbon, Portugal, on his way to Singapore where he will command a British warship.

One of the most notable members of London's famous 'Cliveden Set," Lord Louis Mountbatten was hardly the type of be expected to make an outstanding record for himself in war time. He had spent most of his life at garden parties, sipping tea, and dancing all night. During of Wales and accompanied him on his memorable visit to the United States in 1942. While a guest at the J. S. Cosden estate on Long Island, he made newspaper headlines when \$250,000 worth of his wife's Jewels were stolen.

Came the war and Mountbatten was placed in command of a destroyer. For distinguished exploits in the English Channel he has been created a Companion of the Distinguished Sussia Order My ship the Javelin, while on convoy duty, was struck by a German torpedo and persistently aftacked for several hours by dive-hombers while it limped back to port. He was then placed in command of the Kelly and transferred to the Mediterranean.

For several days during the Battle of Crete Lord Mountbatten was given up for lost. His had been one of a group of British warships which broke up a German convoy of men and supplies bound for the island from the Greek mainland. For several hours it plowed back and forth through the transports and torpedo boats, smashing some in head on collision, wrecking others with gunfire, and under constant attack itself from torpedoes and airplane bombs.

Finally one of these bombs hit the Kelly in a critical spot while making thirty knots and hour. She turned over on her side and sank in seventy seconds. Lord Mounthatten went down with his ship and for several days was reported lost, as indeed practically everyone on the Kelly was. A powerful swimmer, Lord Mountbatten was later revealed to have been picked up by a Greek fishing boat and carried to Egypt.
