MEETING PROTESTS against continued shipments of UNRRA supplies to Yugoslavia plus the Russo-American tension at the Paris conference have suddenly focused attention on the vast amounts in relief and loans given to nations with which the U. S. is having difficulties.

U. S. Civil Rights Plea

WASHINGTON—The Justice Department says new legislation is needed to strengthen Uncle Sam's hand in protecting your civil rights.

If local officials fail to protect your civil rights, the federal government is powerless in most cases to intervene.

Suppose, for example, that you are the victim of a mob attack. The federal government cannot prosecute the mob under normal circumstances.

Suppose, again, that you are beaten or murdered by a police officer after being arrested on a false charge.

The Supreme Court has ruled that in such a case the federal government can prosecute you if the police officer at the time he committed the offense had the clear purpose of depriving you of a specific federal right.

This means a right made specific either by the express terms of the Constitution or laws of the United States or the decisions interpreting them.

The Justice Department maintains that the federal government should have the power to act when local authorities fail to protect your civil rights.

Says Assistant Attorney General Luntar Caudle, head of the department's Criminal Division: "New legislation is needed. The federal government now has little power of authority to deal with the social and government situations which give rise to civil rights problems."

Caudle gives this summary of the situation: The United States Constitution did not mention civil rights. But the first Congress, fearing interference by the federal government with basic rights, passed and submitted to the states the first 10 amendments.

After the Civil War the 13th, 14th and 15th amendments to the Constitution were adopted. The reason was that certain states would not or could not protect the liberties of all persons.

Five laws were passed providing penalties for state officers and individuals who violated the rights set out in these amendments. The

or property without a fair trial. Congress later, repeated most of these civil rights laws. Two sections are left. They constitute the sole authority under which the Justice Department can act in the civil rights field.

They deal with conspiring to harm citizens in the exercise of federally secured rights (section 5) and with depriving persons of civil rights under "color" of law (section 24).

Section 24 does not protect you against mob violence—that is, federal or state—abuse. Yet most civil rights complaints are against an act of one person against another person, or of a group of persons (like a mob) against one person.

Section 5 does protect you against private individuals as well as public officials in these rights: To be free from involuntary servitude; to be a witness in federal courts; to be protected in carrying out federal court decrees; to be protected from violence while in the custody of federal authorities; to have access to the federal courts; and to vote for a federal officer and to have that vote counted as cast.

Section 52 empowers the federal government to prosecute a state or federal officer who willfully misuses his office or power to deprive a person of the rights guaranteed by the Bill of Rights and the 14th amendment.

Congress on several occasions has been asked to pass anti-lynching legislation. But a bill of this type has never been enacted. Such a bill, says the Civil Rights Commission, would be a new civil rights

statute. The section says all anti-lynching bills were aimed at enforcing the 14th amendment, which says an individual cannot be deprived of life, liberty or property without due process of law, which means a fair trial.

The standard anti-lynching bills of the past have been aimed at state officials rather than at members of mobs, says the section. They would make state officials primarily responsible for failing to take necessary measures to protect an individual from a mob, to act to ascertain the identity of mob members and to prosecute mob members.

The recent lynching of four Negroes near Monroe, La., by 20-odd white men spotlighted the problem of civil rights. FBI agents are investigating the lynching, but they can't make arrests unless they find that some Georgia official conspired with the lynch mob to kill the Negroes.

This and comparable cases prompted Attorney General Clark to say in a speech at Cambridge, O., that federal action to protect

civil rights "hangs upon a very thin thread of law."

"It is like trying to fight a modern atom-bomb war with a Civil War musket," he said.
