## FBI, Utah Officers Probe Four Mystery Sabotage Blasts

SALT LAKE CITY (UPI)—FBI, State and private authorities worked together today trying to solve the mysterious sabotage dynamiting of three important communication facilities in Utah. The explosions set off a National Guard and police alert at other key telephone installations in the nation.

The near-simultaneous explosions at two unmanned microwave stations and a cable relay station at remote Knolls, Wendover and Cedar Mountain in western Utah at about 5 a. m. Sunday was labeled deliberate by a police official.

"It is definitely not the work of a crackpot," said Supl. Lyle Hyatt of the Utah Highway Patrol. "It looks like a professional job. It was too well planned and too well coordinated and each blast was in a critical area."

Hundreds of National Guardsmen stood watch today at American Telephone & Telegraph stations in six states—Utah, Idaho, Colorado, Nevada, Wyoming and New Mexico. State police sheriffs' deputies and private guards kept special watch at stations in California, Michigan, Arkansas, Illinois and perhaps other states where officials were reluctant to discuss the dangers involved.

There had been fears that attempts would be made to cut off communications elsewhere in the nation, but reports of bombs at Denver and Maine proved unfounded.

National defense communications affected by the blasts were switched to alternate routes immediately.

The FBI moved in on the case with a "very intensive" probe. Although 800 pounds of dynamite was stolen Thursday at Elko, Nev., officials made no mention of any apparent tie-in with the blasts.

### Republicans Win First Texas Vote

DALLAS, Tex. (UPI)—Republican John G. Tower's victory-making election to the U.S. Senate over Democrat Sen. William A. (Corky) McNamara touched off GOP claims today that Texas was in a temporary state.

Tower's election Saturday made him the first Republican ever to win a Senate vote in Texas. The Republicans have not had a party member in the Senate from the state since Reconstruction days when the last GOP senator was appointed by the legislature.

Tower, 55, who is considered a conservative in the style of Sen. Barry Goldwater, said he considered his victory "reflects a dis-

satisfaction with the new frontier in Texas."

A college professor, Tower defeated McNamara for the seat vacated by Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson. McNamara was the interim appointee to the post.

Tower will leave for Washington Wednesday for talks with Senate minority leader, Thurston Morton, (R-Ky.), national GOP chairman, and Goldwater, (R-Ariz.).

Unofficial returns from the Texas Election Bureau in Dallas were almost complete. Tower held an 8,000-vote lead over McNamara with only 7,800 ballots to be counted. Tower piled up 444,718 votes compared to 438,818.

# FBI, Utah Officers Probe Four Mystery Sabotage Blasts

SALT LAKE CITY (UPI)—The FBI, Utah State police and other law enforcement agencies are probing the mysterious blowing of four bombs in the Utah National Guard armory in Salt Lake City last week.

The bombings, which occurred on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, destroyed valuable equipment and damaged the armory building. The cause of the explosions remains unknown.

The Utah National Guard armory is one of the largest in the United States. It houses a variety of military equipment, including rifles, machine guns, and tanks. The building is also used for training and administrative purposes.
