

MIAMI SPRINGS IS TOWN OF FEW BOOM PROBLEMS

Current Budget Lists No Administrative Costs For Officers

Editor's Note: Another of a series on Florida Communities, prepared by the Miami Herald and released to Florida papers.

TOWN OF MIAMI SPRINGS
MIAMI, May 4.—Originally named Country Club Estates during the enthusiasms of the boom, the town of Miami Springs took on its more widely title by spe-

side from its residential qualities, as the location of the well-sited election in 1930, and is known from which water for most of the Miami area is drawn.

This town, like Opa-Locks, was an outgrowth of the Curtis-Bright development of that territory in and around Hialeah, and like its twin to the north, survived the boom without any suffocating debt. Sanitary sewers installed by the Country Club Holding Company were bought in 1931 and certificates of an indebtedness given in payment. The amount has been reduced from \$15,500 to \$10,000, payments on the balance being made at regular intervals.

Miami Springs also is distinctive for the fact that its current budget lists no salaries or expenses for the administrative officials. Its principal outlay is for police protection, maintenance of parks street lighting and operation of a municipal water system, which returns from \$1,000 to \$1,500 annually in profit. The remainder of the town revenue is derived from taxes on property and from licenses and incidental fees.

It is interesting to notice that this community of 400 people once valued its taxable property at \$6,275,837, or about \$15,000 worth of houses and lots for every man, woman and child. That was at the time of its birth, in 1920, and in the intervening years the value have dropped to one-eighth of that amount. About \$121,000 of the present taxables will be removed if the state exemption of home-steads valued at \$5,000 or less is approved, leaving most of the balance in vacant lots to bear the operating taxes which last year

were reduced to \$9,700. Because of its freedom from funded debt and its proximity to Miami, this town should not be particularly embarrassed by the homestead exemption, as will many others in the state. It has no expensive habits to change and in any building boom such as some see peering over the horizon, Miami Springs and its low tax rate will be up near the head of the line in welcoming new residents.

Ministers Believe In Reformed Capitalism

NEW YORK, May 4.—A co-operative commonwealth is preferred to capitalism by 18,324 ministers out of some 20,000 queried by Kirby Page, editor and author, in a questionnaire on politics and economics.

In the questionnaire, published yesterday, capitalism was defined as "rugged individualism" as in the United States prior to 1929.

The ministers expressing their desire for a co-operative commonwealth were asked:

"Which political system seems to you the most effective method of achieving this end?"

Their answers: A drastically reformed capitalism, 10,681; fascism, as in Italy, 111; communism, as in Soviet Russia and as presented by the Communist party of the United States, 123; socialism, as represented by the socialist alignment in which the present socialist party would be included, 5,879; some other political system, 1,695.
