HOUSE READY FOR SHOWDOWN ON NAVAL BILL

Solons, Resentful Over The Refusal Of France, Italy To Join Arms Conference, Would Build New Cruisers

President Is Still Opposed To Measure

Speaker Longworth And Representative Tilson, Lined Up With "Big Navy" Group

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—With resentment sweeping Congress over the refusal of France and Italy to join an arms conference, the House today prepared for a showdown over the proposal to begin construction of three new \$100,000,000 cruisers. The Senate has already passed the bill.

"Big navy" advocates, frankly doubtful of the result, were hopeful that the international situation would turn the tide in their favor.

Despite the apparent failure of his conference plan, however, Mr. Coolidge has reported to be undecided on the cruiser amendment.

The only major piece of legislation upon which Congress has acted since its annual message.

The reopening of the fight found an old alignment in the House with party lines knocked away and the President's titular spokesman opposing his Speaker.

Speaker Longworth and Rep. Tilson of Connecticut, Republican floor leader, were again ranged on the side of the "big navy" forces.

In a previous fight, the cruiser proposal was lost in the House upon 207 votes, 177 to 175 and 183 to 161.

Rep. Butler (R) of Pennsylvania, chairman of the House Naval Affairs Committee, declared that the rest of the nations of the world will not disarm.

"Two of the big nations of the world will not even meet with us in conversation on the subject of limiting smaller ships," he said.

"Japan informs us that she will build a minimum of cruisers and does not want the 4-3 ratio extended."

"The United States will have to build, if the other nations will have to destroy ships until our standard can be adopted."

Mine Workers Quit Miami To Begin Drive To Bring Peace In Soft Coal Field

MIAMI, Fla., Feb. 24.—(INS)—The United Mine Workers today began a far-flung drive to bring peace in the soft coal industry.

Members of the union policy committee, speaking from today were under instructions from John L. Lewis, president, to arrange separate settlements with all operators who will accept the union demand for no wage reduction.

The first settlements are expected to be with the operators in the outlying districts of Montana, Wyoming and Washington.

Mine leaders also declared that a majority of the owners of Illinois and Indiana have indicated they would sign up for the \$7.50 a day present wage.

The union is hopeful that the leading Ohio and Pennsylvania operators will fall into line.

Armed with individual agreements, Lewis then will attempt to force another joint wage conference to negotiate a contract for the entire bituminous field.

Lewis is well satisfied with the prospect for the future. He believes he can win because of the unorganized resistance of the operators.

The operators who attended the unsuccessful joint wage conference here were not unanimous behind the compromise by Ohio and Pennsylvania operators.

No Protest To Come From U. S. Unless Great Britain Tries To Land Soldiers

America Follows Vera Cruz Policy

English Warship Will Serve As A Refuge For British Subjects

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—Great Britain's dispatch of a warship to the west coast of Nicaragua to protect British interests was viewed with equanimity today by the State Department.

No protest against the British man-of-war's presence in Nicaraguan waters will be made by the government, as long as the vessel acts merely as a "place of refuge" for the 200-odd British subjects in the country.

Any attempt, however, to land British troops on Nicaraguan soil, or to take any punitive action against the Nicaraguans for injuries suffered by British interests, will be met with a most emphatic American protest, under the well understood Monroe Doctrine.

Great Britain fully understands this attitude on the part of the American government and is prepared to respect it, according to information here.

The American policy in this respect is the same as that followed in Vera Cruz in 1914, when the warship, or half a dozen landing parties, were sent to Mexico to protect British interests.

Instead of viewing the presence of the British warship in Nicaraguan waters with alarm, British officials today, it is believed, are relieved.

The State Department officials apparently view this government's policy of providing a "place of refuge" for British subjects, should conditions become serious, and at the same time it strengthens the state department's contention that the Nicaraguan situation is really serious.

With an occupational force of American marines and blue-jackets rapidly attracting the country's political elite and the country's one railroad, American intervention is expected to be permanent. 


