Commission Meets**
The Winter Springs City Commission will hold two meetings Monday, August 28. In addition to the regular meeting scheduled to begin at 6:30 p.m., the commission will have a continuation of the August 14 meeting. The continuation, to begin at 5 p.m., includes a public hearing on the non-ad valorem tax assessment for street lighting in Country Club Village, speeding on Shore Road, sign permits, and other matters.

Among a number of items on the agenda for the regular meeting is a discussion on a request from Centex Homes to allow the issuance of over 100 building permits, prior to the construction of the park area within the Parkstone PUD.

Other discussions and considerations will deal with such areas as Dyson Drive, Golfside Villas, Tusawilla and the proposed Winter Springs Summer Day Camp Program.

Both meetings will be held in the commission chambers of Winter Springs City Hall, 1126 East SR-434.

Former Church Bookkeeper arrested

A former bookkeeper for the Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church, 1217 Trinity Woods Lane, Maitland, was arrested Thursday for allegedly embezzling more than \$100,000 from the church.

Evelyn Mary Russell, 39, of Valencia Road, DeBary, turned herself in at the Seminole County Sheriff's office Thursday. She is

accused of skimming cash collected from congregation members. The money was collected during Sunday services, but was never deposited. Sheriff's spokesman Steve Olson said Russell would apparently cover the shortfall of cash by using other pledge monies donated by members.

The church is said to have discovered the theft in February, and Russell was fired from her job. According to the incident

report, Russell was confronted by the church president in May and admitted to him that she stole \$3,000 during January and February of this year. The church did a further accounting check and found missing funds dating back to 1996, which totaled more than \$100,000.

The Seminole County Sheriff's office was contacted in June and the case was turned over to Investigator Dan LaFleur. LaFleur was able to document the theft and establish probable cause to effect the arrest.

According to a June report, after Russell was contacted, she paid back \$3,000 to the church. She had been employed as the church's bookkeeper since 1993.

Mrs. Russell was subsequently contacted and arrangements were made for her surrender. She was booked into the Seminole County Jail with a bond set at \$7,000.

According to the offense report, Russell has been charged with embezzlement, and grand larceny, first degree, of more than \$100,000.

Homecoming for a distinguished son of Sanford

SANFORD — The year was 1944. The winds of war could be felt here at home in Sanford where airman trained for duty in the Pacific. Oswald P. Bronson was finishing his senior year at Crooms Academy. He was determined, he said, to "learn, learn, learn."

Learn, he did. At the start of the 21st Century, Dr. Oswald Bronson is one of Sanford's most accomplished sons. He has been a pastor, a teacher, the president of a seminary and for the past 25 years, the president of Bethune-Cookman College in Daytona.

It is with great joy, Dr. Bronson said Thursday, to be coming home to Sanford Saturday for a Bethune-

Cookman College Booster Club Rally/Prayer from 1 to 3 p.m. at First Shiloh Baptist Church on Elm Street.

"Oh my, I remember most of my youth — particularly at Crooms Academy," Bronson said. "It was a mile or so from the house where I was born. It's still standing — with help I'm sure — at 10th and Locust. All of us walked in those days. There were no school busses."

Bronson's father, Uriah Bronson, was a school teacher, as was his birth-mother, Flora, who died when he was four.

"I was young but I remember her and I remember how they taught me about needing a moral and spiritual foundation to my education," Bronson said.

Gator season opens Sept. 1

The annual alligator harvest hunting season begins Sept. 1 in Florida. This year's harvest will give 2,082 selected alligator hunters the opportunity to take two alligators each from specified harvest sites which includes lakes, rivers and wetlands.

"This year, 7,222 people applied for the 2,082 slots available" said Joy M. Hill, public information coordinator for the

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. "The selection process began back in June when prospective hunters applied for the lottery-style drawing used to pick participants."

This year, each hunter will be allowed to take only two alligators, instead of five, and have been assigned to hunt for only one week in specified areas in September, and again for one week in October. Hill said the

split week will give more hunters an opportunity to participate. Hunting may begin one-half hour before sunset, and end one-half hour after sunrise.

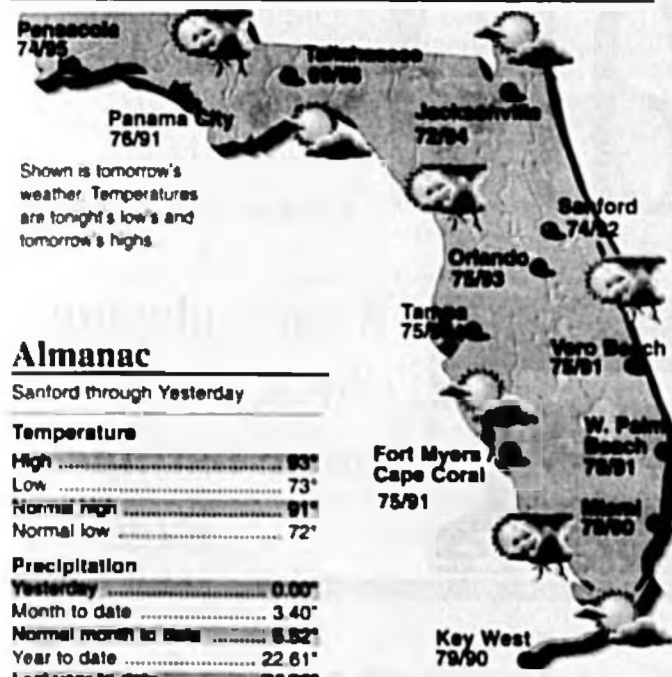
Each winning hunter is required to purchase an alligator trapping license, \$250 for Florida residents and \$1,000 for non-residents. Those who fail to obtain a license will have their opportunity revoked and the

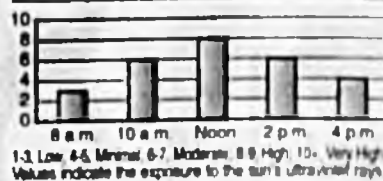

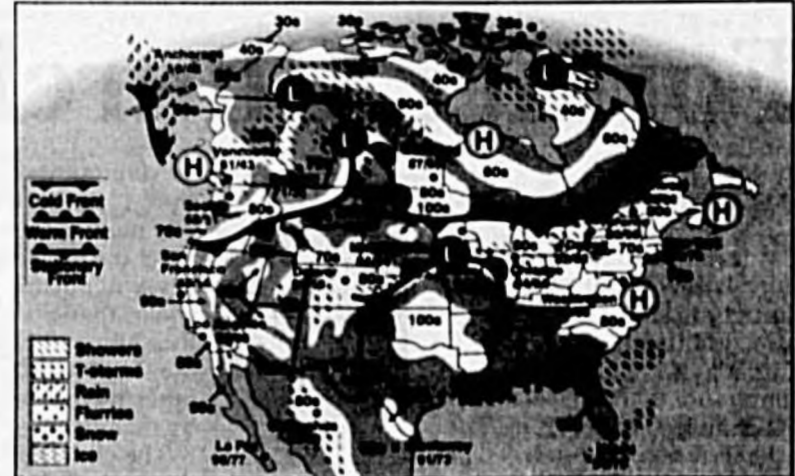

"There's a story about a man who put up a fence to block the trail from his backyard," Hoke said. "When he noticed some of the lady joggers he made a hole in the fence to watch."

I attended the groundbreaking for the Oviedo-Winter Springs section of the Great Seminole Trail. Saw a couple of fellows on unicycles. A trail's a great place for unicycles, an expressway is not. Seminole County is the Natural Choice for unicycles.

When I was a kid, playing in the woods was cool. I was seven or eight when I found out I could run only half way into the woods. You begin running out of the woods after that. Today, we're running out of woods we once ran into. Seen any treehouses lately?

The honorable Larry Dale, an outdoorsman he, says eventually Sanford will be linked on to the Great Seminole County Trail. That I want to see. What does it take to get on the trail? — no, we won't give up Fort Mellon Park. Bring the trail, save the park.

All kidding aside, Ginger Hoke said there are plans and funding for a Sanford riverfront trail and also a trail from Mellonville toward U.S. Highway 17-92.

Back to silly: Taintsville, the beautiful town that ain't, would make an ideal reststop for Chuluota joggers heading to Oviedo or Oviedo joggers heading to Chuluota. The Taintsville Trail would be a worldwide tourist attraction. Where in the world is the Taintsville Trail?

Organizers of the Build the Trail initiative have less than three months to convince county residents to vote for Trail referendum on the Nov. 7 ballot. Nearly two-thirds of the voters approved the bonds ten years ago. It's on the ballot. It's up to us.

"My school teachers also placed an emphasis on excellence, an appreciation for the work ethic and to be certain to go on to college. We were fortunate that the War was coming to a close and we could go to college. I was fortunate to go to Bethune-Cookman."

Dr. Bronson's list of degrees and honors would fill the libraries of many colleges. He has divinity degrees, Doctor of Laws degrees, civic and religious honors and awards. He is the first Bethune-Cookman College graduate to be president of the school. He and Helen Bronson have been married 48

years. They have three children, five grandchildren.

On Thursday, Bronson was keeping a close count of this year's B-CC enrollment. Last year, 2,258 attended the college, which he says provides educational, social and cultural programs in a Christian environment.

"We can pray and we do," he said. "This is a private school."

The president comes to Sanford to both socialize with old friends like Coach Cornelius Franklin and to recruit students for B-CC. He'll be accompanied by the B-CC Pep Band, 24 Karat Dancers and Cheerleaders who will perform at 12:30 p.m. out-

side First Shiloh Baptist Church. This is B-CC's 75 year of football. Opening game is Sept. 2 against Savannah State in Jacksonville.

See if this works — be silly not sad

You may remember the song, "Melancholy Baby." No one seems to be melancholy or sad anymore. Instead, they are depressed.

Pastors and physicians must get melancholy at times treating so many depressed people.

Depression is a mean foe. Most of us develop a bad attitude toward ourselves. It's bad enough being sad. Being sad, mad is worse.

In his best selling book, "Care of the Soul," Thomas Moore suggests people should appreciate the role of depression in the economy of the soul more if they could take away the negative connotations of the word. "What if depression were

simply a state of being, neither good nor bad, something the soul does on its own good time and for its own good reasons?" Moore asked.

I suspect many of us do a fair amount of soul searching to understand what makes us sad when we should feel glad. At times, we're just a bunch of melancholy babies trying to

make the world go away. When it doesn't, we get depressed about it.

The pastors I've known say it's OK to be depressed as long as we don't get depressed about being depressed. In other words, appreciate the role of depression.

Six years ago, I met a couple of women who taught people how to lighten up. They would get groups of depressed people laughing themselves silly just by putting on fake noses and masks. It's hard to be depressed when you are being silly, they said.

If I could be silly or be depressed, I'd pick silly. A silly me is better than a sad me. I'd

even be a mini me before being a sad me. Thomas Moore's book doesn't deal with silly.

It is, however, thoughtful, eloquent and inspiring — enough to help several million people take better care of their soul.

As a student, I greatly admired my teachers who were steeped in theology and goodness. I imagined them to be so intelligent they would never be sad or depressed. Sadly, I learned they constantly battle the same foe as anyone of us. Rejoice and be glad, we are told.

This may require skipping the evening news, a pastor told me. "Anything else?" I asked. "Say three Hail Mary's."

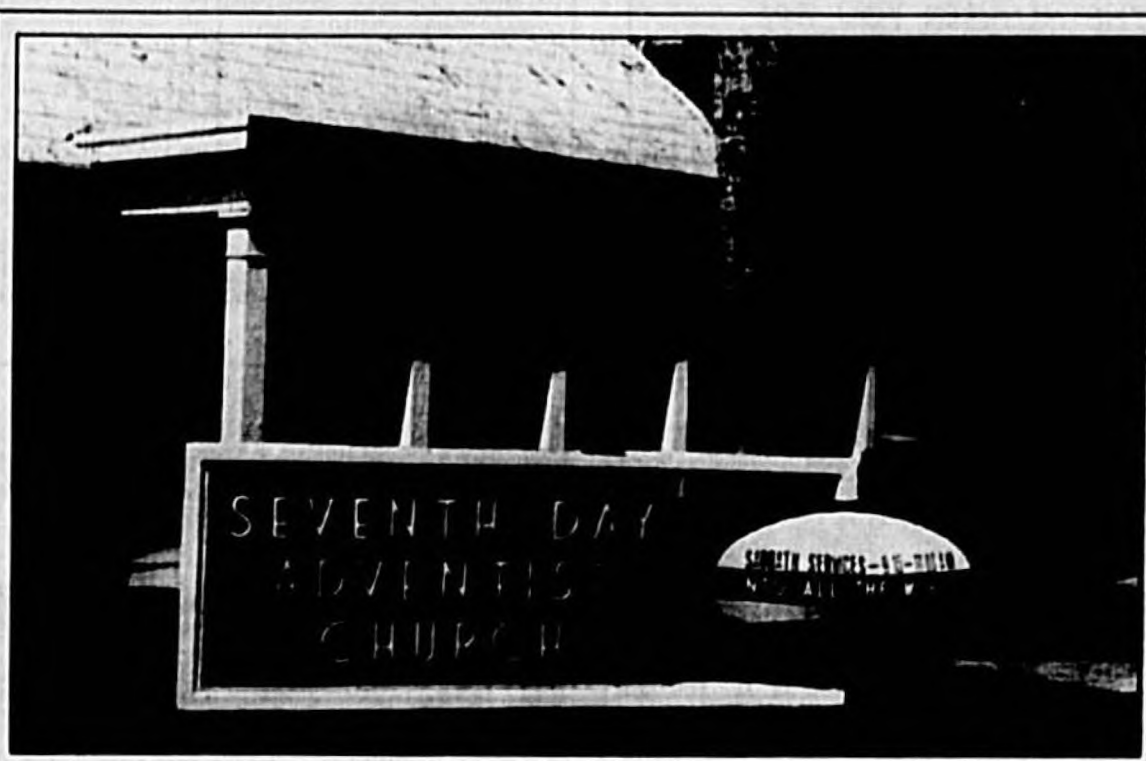

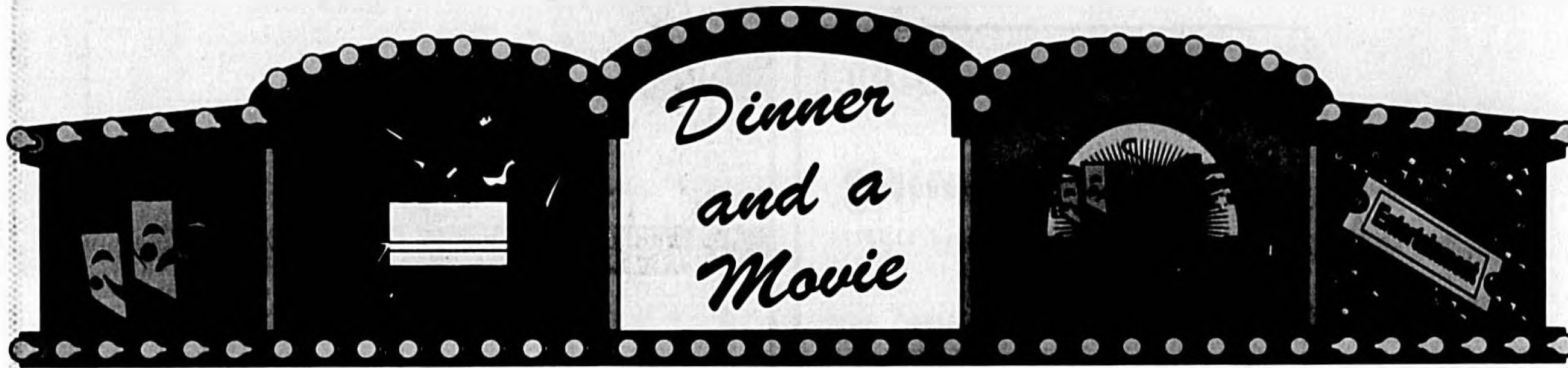

With nine days remaining until the season opener, Kruczek expects the offense to continue to improve with each passing day.

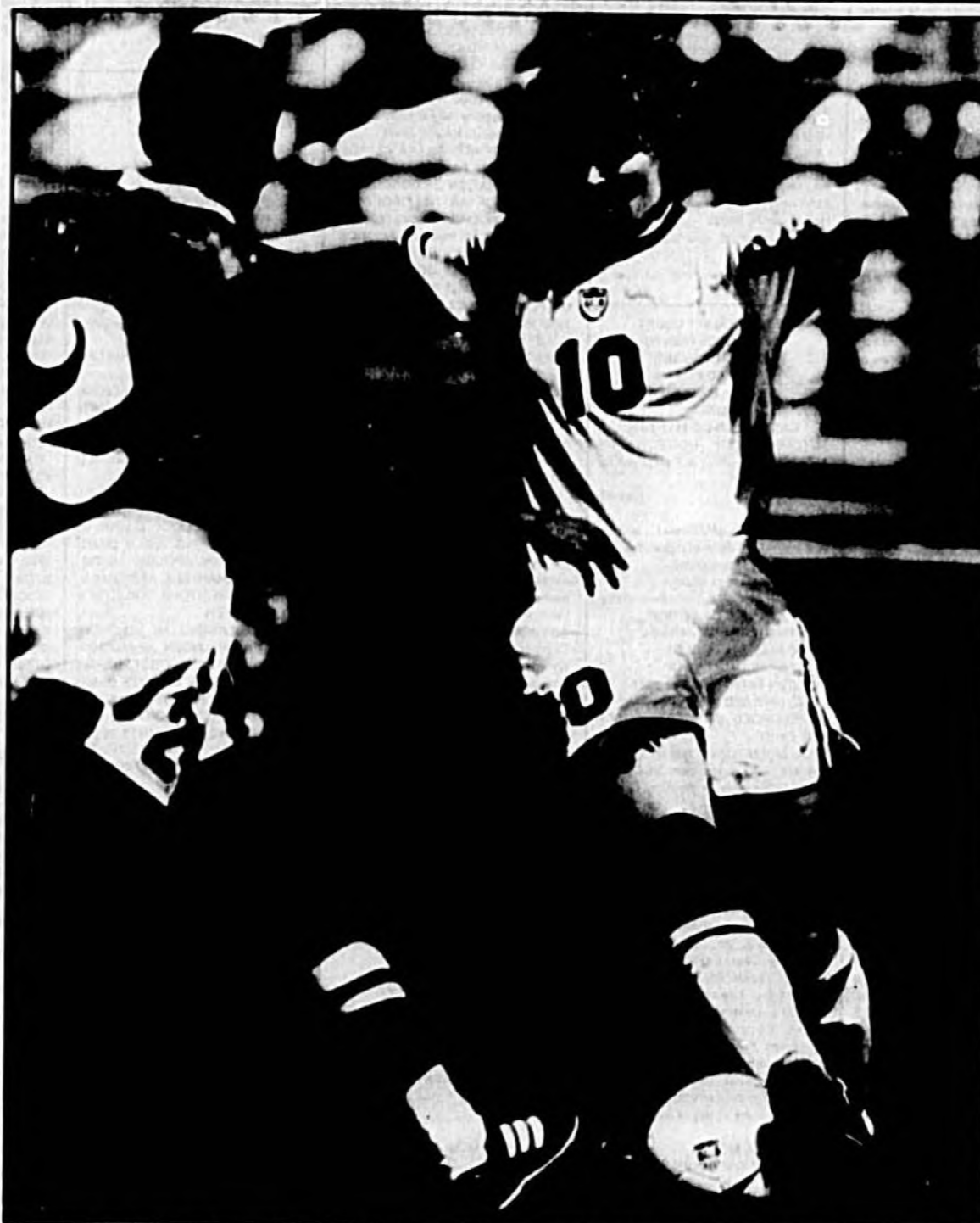

AKERS CALLS IT QUILTS

OVIEDO - Former UCF star and current women's assistant soccer coach Michelle Akers (No. 10 above) has retired from the U.S. Olympic team.

Despite chronic fatigue syndrome, broken bones and dozens of operations, Akers was one of the world's top players for 15 years, leading the United States to two World Cups and an Olympic gold.

But after reinjuring her shoulder earlier this month, Akers realized her body had given all it could. She said Thursday she's retiring from international competition, and won't play at the Sydney Olympics.

She still plans to play for the new WUSA franchise in Orlando, which starts play next April. Akers, 34, retires as the all-time leading scorer of the

Women's World Cup (12 goals), and as one of only four players in history with 100 or more career goals. With 105 goals, 37 assists and 247 total points, she trails only Mia Hamm in all-time scoring for the U.S. national team.

She has made 153 appearances for the United States, and holds U.S. records for most goals in a game (five), most goals and points in a calendar year (39 goals in 1991) and most consecutive games with a goal (nine).

The 5-foot-10 attacker was an original member of the U.S. women's national team, scoring her first goal on Aug. 21, 1985.

In the first Women's World Cup in 1991, she scored 10 goals and became the first American to win a Golden Boot, soccer's MVP award, and was the first female player with a shoe contract.

Frantz repeats

LAKE MARY - Defending champion Will Frantz of North Port birdied the first four holes Thursday enroute to a six-stroke margin of victory in the 21st annual Linktime/North Florida PGA Section Championship at the Country Club at Heathrow.

At 14 under par 201 following a closing round of six under par 68, Frantz, 47, the head professional at Bobcat Trail Country Club, outdistanced the field to become the first player to make a successful defense of his championship.

"Being the first to defend, being Player of the Year in three different decades and making the Challenge Cup team again were on my mind before we started today," said Frantz, who won last year at Eaglebrooke in Lakeland.

First round leader Ted Goin of Ponte Vedra Beach finished where he started the final round, in second place, closing with 70 for 207.

"I had heard he was a good putter, but did you ever see a putting exhibition like that one?" Goin said after the round.

Frantz sank putts of 21, 25, 20 and 35 feet on the first four holes to open a six-stroke lead.

Goin cut the margin to three with birdies at the eighth, ninth and 11th holes, but Frantz birdied the par-3 12th from 30 feet and was never challenged again.

Mark Dunn of OceanSide Country Club, Ormond Beach, was third with 67-208, followed at 209 by Tom Doozan, Golf & Sea Club, Apollo Beach, and Brad Hauer, Metrowest Country Club, Orlando, on final round scores of 69 and 70.

Frantz was the Player of the Year, based on points earned for tournament performances, in 1986, 1988, 1990 and 1991.

He has also been on 18 Challenge Cup teams. The 19th annual matches against the South Florida PGA will be played in Oct. 1-2 at the Tournament Players Club at Heron Bay in Coral Springs.

He also won the NPGA Championship in 1996 at World Woods in Brookville but because of a rib injury, he was forced to withdraw prior to the final round the following year at Walt Disney World.
