## Sanford eyeing lake water for reclaimed use

SANFORD - The officials turned out en masse Wednesday morning to inaugurate a pilot project to determine the level of treatment necessary to take water from Lake Monroe to augment the city's reclaimed water system.

The project may be the first of its kind in the State of Florida, and if proven successful, could become a pilot program for similar projects at various locations.

Taking water from the lake has been determined necessary during extended drought periods when reclaimed water supplies can be low and demand can be high. Such conditions can lead to an imposition of use restrictions as occurred this

The SJRWMD prefers that the city use this alternative water resource as a back-up rather than precious groundwater. The district is a co-applicant with the city on a \$300,000 matching

Officials from the city of Sanford, St. Johns River Water Management District and others included Jim Taylor of the University of Central Florida, Ben Fries and David Gierach of Conklin, Porter & Holmes, the city's consulting engineers, and representatives from Hayward/Xenon, Parkson/Dynasand.

While most reclaimed water systems consist of one or two types of uses. Sanford distributes unrestricted public access quality reclaimed water to sites including city parks, the Mayfair golf course, cemeteries, schools, residential and commer-Please See Water, Page 3A



A Seminole County topless dancer says she suffered from battered spouse syndrome before conviction in boyfriend's gruesome death

SEMINOLE COUNTY - A former topless dancer serving a 17-year sentence for the stabbing death of her boyfriend has asked the governor for elemency.

Michele Ashley Roger, 32, of Oviedo, was convicted of second degree murder in August 1994 for the Sept. 6, 1992 death of her boyfriend, David Richmond, 28.

Jim Richmond, the victim's father, who lives in Chicago, was informed Tuesday by the Office of Executive Clemency in Tallahassee and the Florida Parole Commission that Roger is seeking an early release claiming that she was battered by David

"We want to do everything we can to stop this," Jim Richmond said. "We don't want to see her go free. The grounds of battery are inappropriate, in fact, the opposite was probably true."

Richmond said he does not believe Roger was abused or battered.

'She has never expressed any kind of remorse for what she did," he said. Richmond said he will launch an extensive letter-writing and media campaign to prepare for the clemency hearing, which is scheduled for Sept. 17 at 9:30 a.m. Each family will get 10 minutes before the board, he said.

State Attorney's Office, said though he has not seen Roger's clemency request, his office "will strongly oppose it barring some

unforeseen developments."
"Norm Wolfinger (State Attorney) has felt very strongly about this case from the be-

ginning." White said. Gov. Lawton Chiles and his cabinet members, who act as the state's Clemency Board, will hear the request later this

At the time of the trial, the case received national media attention, largely because of the gruesome details disclosed during the investigation and Roger's family in-

volvement in trying to cover up the crime. During her trial, Roger said she stabbed Richmond in self-defense following an argument. She then left the Oviedo condominim the couple shared and traveled to her family's house. Will Roger, her father, admitted that he removed the body from the murder scene and disposed of the body by burning it, putting the bone fragments in a wood chipper and mixing the remains into concrete blocks. He later dropped the blocks off his boat into the Atlantic Ocean near New Smyrna Beach. Will Roger and his son. Ken Roger, who helped dispose of

the body, were sentenced to two years of probation.

The case did not come to the attention of police until Roger confided in a fellow dancer, who assisted with the investigation and also testified at the trial.

In a similar case, Kimberly Soubtelle of Casselberry, also a former topless dancer in the county, was convicted of second degree murder in the 1987 death of her busband, Pierre. Soubielle was granted clem-ency in 1993 on the grounds she was abused. Soubtelle graduated from Florida State University College of Law in May, however, she will not be allowed to practice law in the state.

timated to hit an all-time high of 29,700 students, up from the 28,302 from the previous years, according to Dan Cole-man, director of UCFs Department of Institutional Research and Planning Support.

Lake Mary to finalize new police station By Nick Pfeifauf HERALD STAFF WRITER

LAKE MARY - An ordinance approving the purchase of land on which to build a new police station is coming up for second and final reading before the Lake Mary City Commission tonight. Approval would resolve a search for a new location for the

facility under way for several years.

Consideration for a new site has included the possibility of building a major public safety complex at the present Rinehart Road property, utilizing city owned property in the east side of the downtown area, and others. None of them proved

Regarding the proposal to build at the present police station site, studies indicated the possibility of sinkhole conditions on the south and southwest portion of the property, and soil testing indicated the land may have been previously used as a dump, and might require an extensive and

expensive cleanup. The present police station building is also said to not meet the criteria of a possible expansion, as the building does not meet specified wind strength requirements, the air conditioning system is in need of expensive repair, and other matters.

Now, the city plans to purchase the Nazarene Church property at 171 E. Crystal Lake Avenue. The purchase price has been established at \$220,000 with the city also agreeing to waive a building permit fee of up to \$10,000 should the church rebuild in the city within the next five years.

Money for the purchase is to come from the General Fund balance, with approximately \$1,715,000 from the 1995 Community Bond Improvement issue which would help in the cost of building construction.

The final reading has been scheduled for tonight's commission meeting. Prior to the regular meeting, the commission will conduct a work session beginning at 5 p.m., to

discuss the proposed fiscal year 1998/99 budget.

The regular meeting will begin at 7 p.m., or as soon as possible following the conclusion of the work session. As of earlier this week, the following items are listed on the meeting's agenda;

work is good news.

Mayor Larry Dale says the SPD is "getting better" - and that how much better it is will be revealed in several months after a study by George Hubler, an independent police management expert.

It was Hubler who uncovered flaws in the organization a year ago and prompted the city to take a hard look at what the SPD was doing.

Several years ago when he was Police Chief in Los Angeles, Daryl F. Gates said that it is important for the public to come to terms with what a police department does.

Citizens ought to know they have a partnership with the police," he said. "When an offcer stops a citizen, the citizen should not mistake signs for discourtesy. He should cooperate. At the same time, the officer must absolutely explain · with courtesy why the person was stopped.





# Getting out of jail quickly after arrest

After being arrested, a person's primary concern is usually getting out of jail quickly. That person may be concerned for his or her safety and/or may not appreciate having his or her liberty taken away. Whatever the reason, many people who are accused of committing crimes are able to get our of jall quickly. This is because an accused is presumed to be innocent and both the U.S. and Florida Constitutions guarantee the right to pretrial release on reasonable conditions. Whether a person is able to get out of jail quickly. however, will oftentimes depend on the type of crime the person is accused of committing because the type of crime alleged will determine what conditions are reasonable.

Very often people who are accused of most inflor crimes and some not so minor are able to get out of jail within a few hours. This is because the accused may obtain release

through a pretrial release pro-

Pretrial release programs vary from county to county in terms of the procedures employed. However, they generally work as follows. Once arrested a person is interviewed by a pretrial release counselor who determines if the accused is eligible for release prior to First Appearance. Generally, if the crime alleged is minor and the accused has no criminal history, the accused is released without having to post any kind of bail. The only requirement imposed on the accused will be to report periodically to

the pretrial counselor while his or her case is pending.

The fact that a person does not qualify for pretrial release. however, does not mean that he or she may not get our of fail quickly. Jails usually have a standard bond schedule that allows for release, on bond, of persons accused of committing certain crimes. Naturally, the amount of bond will depend on the crime alleged. For example a person arrested for disorderly intoxication may bond out per the bond schedule for \$138 or a bond for such amount, which a person arrested for an alleged battery (not domestic) on another may bond out per the schedule for \$500 or a bond for such

If a person is released pretrial or per the jail bond schedule he or she will not have to come back to court until the date of arraignment. Unfortunately, sometimes a person is unable to qualify for

DEAR BETTY: Yes, you cer-

pretrial release, unable to qualify for release per the jail's bond schedule, or is simply unable to post a bond. Under those circumstances an accused may still be entitled to release. However, that person will have to walt and see a judge at what is known as First Appearance.

A person's primary concern after being arrested is usually getting our of jail quickly. How quickly a person is able to get out of fall, however, will usually depend on the nature of the crime charged and whether the person is entitled to pretrial release or ball prior to First Appearance. In the coming weeks we will discuss how persons who do not qualify for release as described above may get out of fail after First Appearance as well as other aspects of criminal law.

## Diagnosis requires precise history

DEAR DR. GOTT: What kind of specialist should I see for my condition? It's like a muscle spasm that affects the whole left side of my body from my face to my toes. It lasts 15 seconds and occurs from five to 20 times daily. I'm 25 and have had this condition since I was 13. I've seen MDs. neurolsince I was 13. I've seen MDs, neurologists and chiropractors and have had an EEG. All tests have been negative.

**DEAR READER: Your description** is too vague for me to give you any concrete advice. Saying something is "like a spasm" isn't really specific enough. Before coming to a conclusion, a doctor would need to know if the attack is painful or produces weakness. Is there tingling? What brings it on? Is it stress-related? Do you have headaches? Is your speech affected? Are there mental changes or any alterations in muscular function?

Since you have had this problem for 12 years, I suspect it isn't life-threat-ening. But before you can get help with it, I think you are going to have to play detective and define precisely what it is you are feeling. Despite the use of marvelous new technology for diagnosis, the best doctors continue to rely heavily on the most helpful diagnostic test of all: the accurate medical history.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I am in my seventh month of pregnancy and have con-stant stomach pain and regurgitation. I don't eat spicy or greasy foods. My gynecologist says it's the baby pushing on the stomach wall. Is that right?

DEAR READER: Probably, yes. At this stage in your pregnancy, there is very little room in the abdominal cavity. As the baby grows, something has to give to make room for it. During the last part of pregnancy, before the baby drops deep into the pelvic area, a woman's stomach may be pushed and displaced by the developing fetus. Heartburn, discomfort and regurgitation may result.

Once you have given birth, the becominal organs will return to their

natural position and your symptoms will disappear. In the meantime, you might try cutting down or avoiding foods that may be making your problem worse, such as yeast products (bread), caffeine and eggs. Try eating smaller, more frequent meals. And, as elementary as this sounds, make sure

### How things change over time

By Phillip Alder

How has the average life expectancy changed in the United States from 1900 to 1900?

The laws of bridge have undergone little change in the last 70 years. Arguably the best improvement was the increase in the penalty for going four or more down in a doubled non-vulnerable contract.

vulnerable contract.

Bidding has become much more scientific, declarer play has improved somewhat, and better defensive signaling methods have greatly reduced the amount of guesswork required. (When still in high school, a friend and I went to play in a local whist drive. We were expelled for cheating because we used defensive bridge signals!)

Here is an example of the impor-


tance of signaling.
Against South's contract of three no-trump, West leads the spade two.

Let's suppose declarer wins the third round of spades, then plays on diamends. How should West defend?

West must duck this trick and note partner's card. Here, East drope the four, the lowest missing diamond. This shows an odd number of diamonds. (East would play high-low with an even number.) If East has a singleten diamond, South has four and dummy's suit cannot be killed. But if East has three diamonds, South has only two. So, West wins the second diamond trick, cashes his long spade, and exits with a heart or club. Declarer has only eight winners.

If West ducks the second diamond on a "just in case" basis, South runs for home with one spade, one heart, two diamonds and five clubs.

In 1900, the average life expectancy was 47; now, it is 75. (I think that must be for men.)
