CRANBERRY COFFEE CAKE 1 package (13 ounces) hot roll mix

% cup warm water 2 large eggs 14 cup butter or margarine Cranberry Filling, see below Confectioners' Sugar Icing, see

recipe below Soften yeast from roll mix in warm water according to package directions, using only 1/2 cup

Bent eggs until thickened and mon color. Add softened ast, butter and roll mix. With well. Cover; let rise in warm, draftfree place until doubled-50

to 50 minutes. Punch down dough. Turn out onto lightly floured board or is soft and pliable. Divide in

Roll out each portion to a 1 by 8-inch rectangle about 1/6 inch thick. Spread each rectangle with half the Cranberry Filling. Starting with 14-inch side, roll up; seal edges.

Place, seam side down, on greased baking sheet, curving each roll into a horsesnoe; seal ends. With kitchen scissors, at two-inch intervals, make cuts along outside edge of each horseshoe, halfway toward center. Cover; let rise in warm, draftfree place until almost dou-

bled-about 30 minutes. Bake in preheated 350-degree oven until golden brown-20 to 25 minutes. Immediately remove from baking sheet. While coffee cakes are still warm, drizzie Confectioners' Sugar Icing over tops. Makes two 10-inch coffee

Fresh Fruit Cheese Layer Cake with Chocolate Butter-Cream Frosting

CHOCOLATE BUTTER-CREAM FROSTING 6 squares (6 ounces) semisweet chocolate 1/4 cup water

4 yolks, from large eggs % cup light corn syrup % pound (I sticks) firm-chilled 1 teaspoon vanilla

Into a double-boiler top turn chocolate and water; melt over hot water; cool thoroughly. In a small deep mixing bowl beat volks until thickened and lemon

In a heavy one or one and a half quart saucepan boil corn syrup until syrup spins a thread when dropped from spoon-238 ter. Pour syrup very slowly over beaten yolks, becting constantly; beat until very thick and pale-colored. Refrigerate to cool thoroughly-about 30 min-

In a small bowl beat butter to soften and have creamy ((but not runny); add to cold syrup mixture; beat until blended. Add chocolate and vanilla; beat until slightly blended. If frosting is too soft to spread. chill until just stiff enough to swirl. Spread between layers and on sides and top of three eight-inch or two nine-inch layer cakes. Store cake in refrigerator. After frosting is chilled and firm it may be covered with


