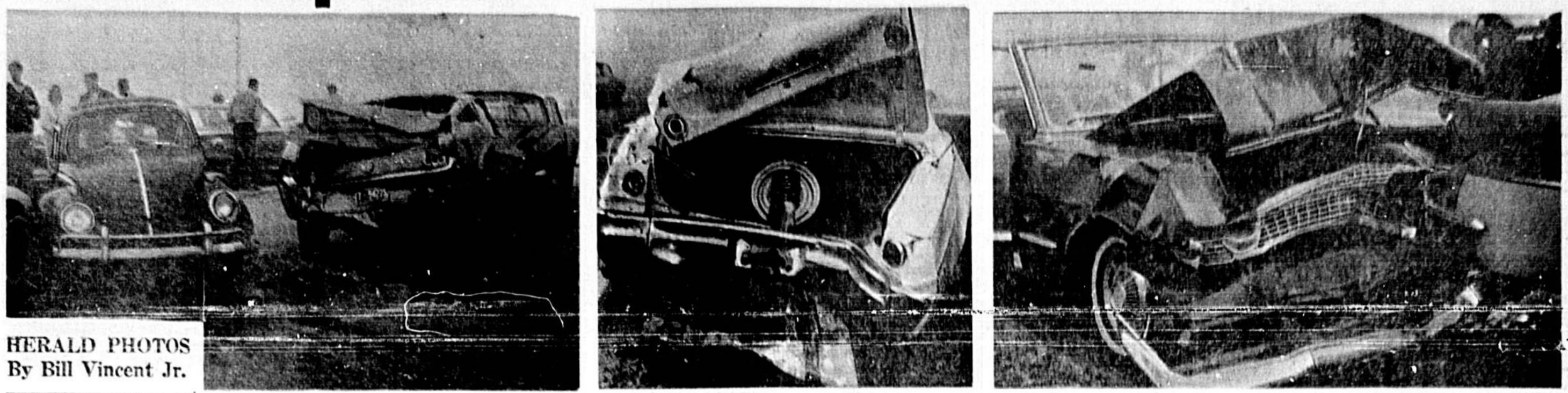

Yank Tourists  
'Holding Out'  
On Their \$\$\$

MIAMI (AP)—A Miami News survey indicates plenty of tourists are with us but they're doing out their money more cautiously on travel, vacation stays and race track bets.

Miami Beach hoteliers said business is off 16 to 18 per cent compared to a year ago. One reported a faster turnover of rooms, with people who used to spend three weeks settling for two instead.

Eastern, Delta and Northwest air lines said last week's heavy snowstorm in Chicago cut passenger volume by nearly 5,000.

The Sunshine State Parkway said 26,000 more vehicles used the toll road in the first 20 days of this month, three per cent more than the corresponding period a year ago. Tolls rose 2.2 per cent.

Hialeah Park horse race track offered an additional betting gimmick—the perfecta—starting Monday to coax more bets out of bettors' purses. The track attendance was down 4.6 per cent and betting was off 12.1 per cent for the first 10 days of the current meeting.

Report: industry spokesmen said inquiries are up and reservations look strong for the next two months.

They also reminded that last January saw record business and this month's volume looks correspondingly smaller.

### Court Favors War Opponents

NEW YORK (AP)—A U.S. Court of Appeals has ruled that local draft boards cannot reclassify registrants as a punishment for refusing to accept the draft.

The court said Monday it was reluctant to interfere in Selective Service matters but added that obligations "that the draft boards have unilaterally suppressed criticism must take precedence."

With its unanimous decision the three-judge panel reinstated a lower-court action by two University of Michigan students seeking to block their induction into the service.

The students were reclassified from 2B—a student deferment to 1A after they participated in an antiwar demonstration in Ann Arbor, Mich., site of the university.

The appeals court held the draft boards exceeded their jurisdiction and acted in violation of the First Amendment rights of free speech.

Minimum Wage Law Is Effective Today

By JOHN CUNIFF AP Business News Analyst - Nearly four million workers covered under federal minimum wage laws got a raise today to \$1.40 an hour from \$1.25. At that rate, their annual income is \$2,912, insufficient for many needs.

The common laborer, then, is in a poor and worsening bargaining position. Requiring this, government, universities and foundations are intensely studying the problems of this imbalance.

Progress is being made from a dimly lit platform. A few of the miles have been Social Security, minimum wage and fair employment laws. The Employment Act of 1946 which put the government squarely behind maximum employment and a concentration of effort by private enterprise and government to teach and train workers, including the handicapped.
