3 POWER PACT MAY RESULT IN NAVAL PARLEY

Possibility Of Having Agreement Affect- ing Five Principal Nations Is Slight

LONDON, Mar. 22.—(AP)—An air of uneasiness hung over the five power naval conference today. Predictions were that unless there is a constructive development almost immediately a pro-posed three power treaty will be drawn up and the curtain run down upon the somewhat unsuccessful five power parley.

The British morning press in some instances went so far as to say that only a miracle could save the conference. "The nations are standing by helplessly, while a world treaty is negotiated before their eyes," the Chronicle commented.

The Daily Herald later stated, charged that "a rift in the French delegation has left the conference and turned the deadlock into a crisis. The other powers must prepare a scheme which satisfies the French demands of the conference is over so far as France is concerned."

This viewpoint is a serious fair-ly general despite denials by Jacques-Louis Dumesnil and M. P. Ley of the French delegation that their departure from the "big five" was no more than a tactical move and that they would return to the conference to-day, and that of General Stimson in St. Petersburg.

It remained, however, that the only member of the French delegation who left in London was Admiral de Fleury, and his departure, Premier Tardieu, was an important event with Mr. MacDonald's departure from the conference.

Chicago's Wave Of Crime Has Veered To Favorable Point

CHICAGO, Mar. 22.—(AP)—For once, at least, Chicago's crime wave has veered in the point marked "favorable" in the law.

Two more convictions in the case against the "blind trade" were returned by a jury last night in Judge Otto Kern's court, making a total of five within the past two weeks.

As to the "blind trade" convictions, the jury returned a verdict of guilty against the defendant, Joseph J. Kelly, who was sentenced to prison for one to five years each in addition, and were fined \$100.

The technical charges against the pair were "possession of bonds." Both confessed, however, to selling bonds to the defendant, Kelly, who admitted "passing a few pennies" to Kelly, and said to have been a member of the "blind trade" syndicate headed by one of the Althea brothers, using a successful card game for the means of a blatted hand of needed funds.

The other bonds were caught at the home of Joseph J. Kelly, who had received two checks from Kelly in the last two weeks, threatening him and his family with death unless he paid \$5000.



Doheny Acquitted On Charge Of Giving Albert B. Fall Bribe

Verdict Is Contradictory Since Fall Has Been Convicted Of Accepting The Bribe

WASHINGTON, Mar. 22.—(AP)—Edward L. Doheny was acquitted today on a charge of bribing a former cabinet officer. A jury of three women and nine men in the District of Columbia supreme court sustained Doheny's plea that the \$100,000 he gave to Albert B. Fall, Harding's secretary of the interior, was a loan and not a bribe.

The verdict charged that the money was given Fall to influence his award of the Elk Hills naval oil lease to a Doheny company.

Fall was convicted four months ago of accepting the money as a bribe and the contradictory verdict today has set up one of the most unique cases ever experienced in American jurisprudence.

Doheny moves as the jury filed into the court room and to the box. The jury men and women remained standing while the clerk asked if they had arrived at a verdict.

"Yes," replied the foreman. "What is your verdict," asked the clerk.

"Not guilty," replied the foreman. There was a tense stillness in the court room as Doheny and his counsel watched the foreman as he replied. The jury was polled and confirmed the verdict.
