

Survey Shows Consistent Progress In Development Of Oviedo In Last Season

Increased plantings in truck and celery and excellent prices for both truck and citrus, predicted by Oviedo business men and growers last fall, have more than come true within the last six months. A survey of the town made this week by the Herald shows.

Among the new business ventures the last season has brought is the Lake Charm Fruit Company, headed by H. A. Ward of Winter Park and managed by H. E. Cole, the company treasurer. Among the new grove and truck developments is Gardena Farms, promoted by the Field Land Company of Jacksonville.

The Field Land Company's tract is four miles north of Oviedo on the Sanford-Oviedo Road and contains a total of 1,500 acres. Much of this is being cleared and developed for truck and citrus growing. More than five houses have been erected and a 10 mile road built. The tract is being improved under the direction of J. H. Hall.

During last summer both the Atlantic Coast Line and Seaboard Air Line made extensive improvements in their truck facilities in the Oviedo section. New truck into the celery fields put every grower in the district within a quarter of a mile of a shipping point.

Building has progressed steadily in Oviedo during the past season. A new Baptist Church is one of the buildings more recently erected. With the First Methodist Church, Oviedo has two thriving congregations. The Baptist Church is under the direction of the Rev. J. M. Cook and the pastor of the Methodist Church has been the Rev. G. W. Williams.

At the beginning of the fall session of school last year the number of teachers on the faculty of the Oviedo School was increased from nine to 12. An active Parent Teachers' Association served lunches to the school children during the winter.

The Bank of Oviedo, of which B. G. Smith, a pioneer resident of Oviedo, is head, is one of the strongest institutions of its size in the state, according to Seminole County business men. T. W. Lane, county superintendent of public instruction, and G. P. Sweeney, prominent Oviedo business man, are the vice-presidents. J. H. Asbell is cashier.

B. F. Wheeler, veteran Oviedo banker and shipper, is the head of Neison's Company, the town's oldest packing plant. He is a prominent figure in county politics and the chairman of the Oviedo town council.

J. W. Conroy, one of the town's larger citrus growers is mayor. He is one of the few city heads in Florida that has been elected to his position. Prosperity will reach the Oviedo levels within the next few years. He said there were new business ventures every year and new trucking roads being cleared.

CITY DRIED UP

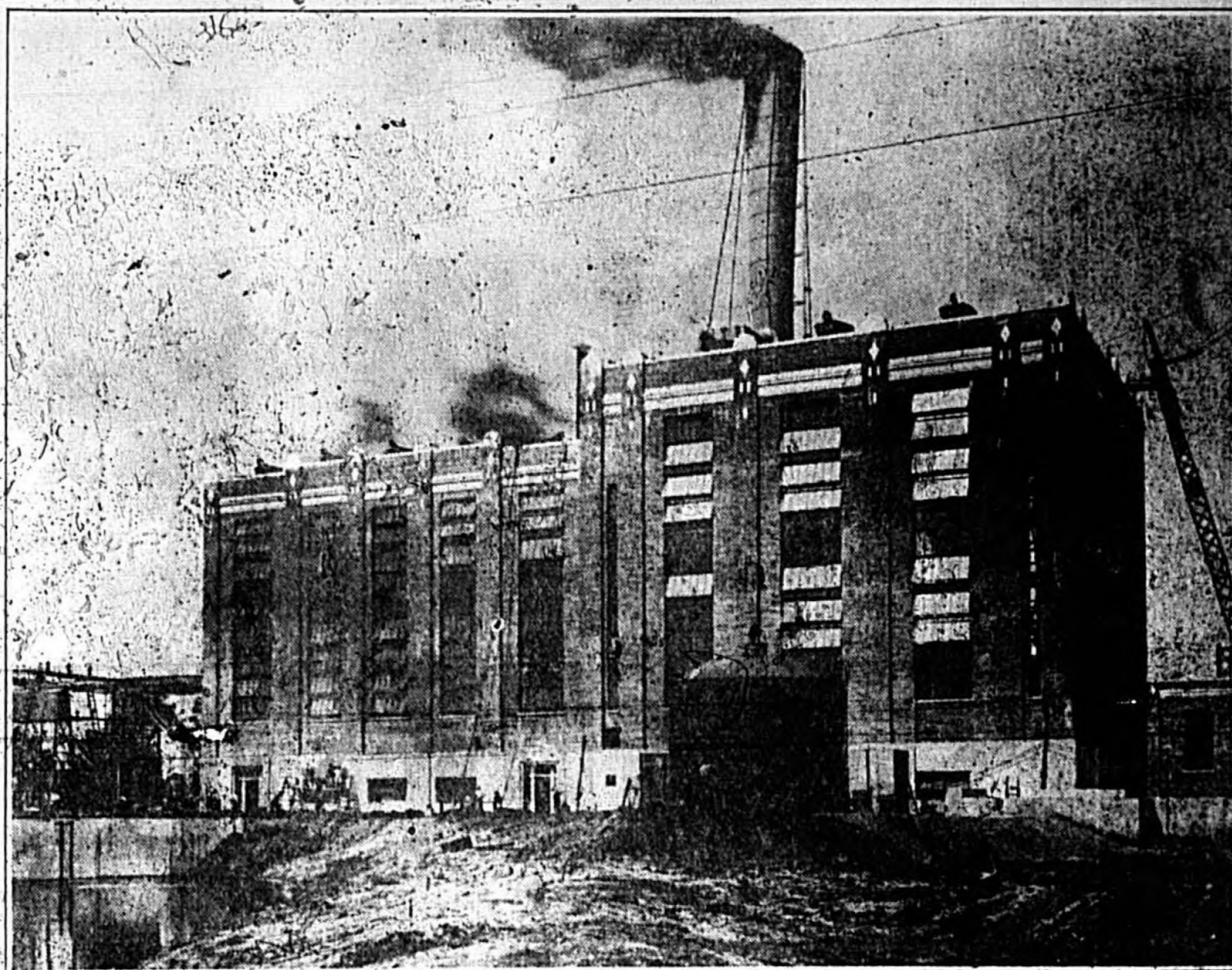
WASHINGTON, May 25 (AP)—Rain has been fairly
