

**Ervin Helps Rivers  
On Radio Transfer**

TALLAHASSEE, Oct. 4—(P)—Attorney General Richard Ervin asked the Federal Communications Commission yesterday not to delay transfer of the Miami radio station WMIE from Arthur H. McBride to E. D. Rivers, Sr., former governor of Georgia.

Ervin has long opposed operation of the station by McBride, father of the owner of Continental Press Service, which the Attorney General claims provides key information for illegal bookmaking operations.

Ervin said he has been informed that the FCC has ordered a hearing in Washington Oct. 22 on whether assignment of the station operating certificate to Rivers is in the public interest.

Rivers has a six months option to buy the station which expires Dec. 2. Ervin said in a letter to the chairman of the FCC he hoped the final decision would not be delayed beyond that date.

He said if Rivers does not get the station by Dec. 2, it would have "McBride unfettered" to operate it. He urged the FCC to give consideration "to the desire of interested citizens to put the radio station beyond the operation and control of Arthur H. McBride."

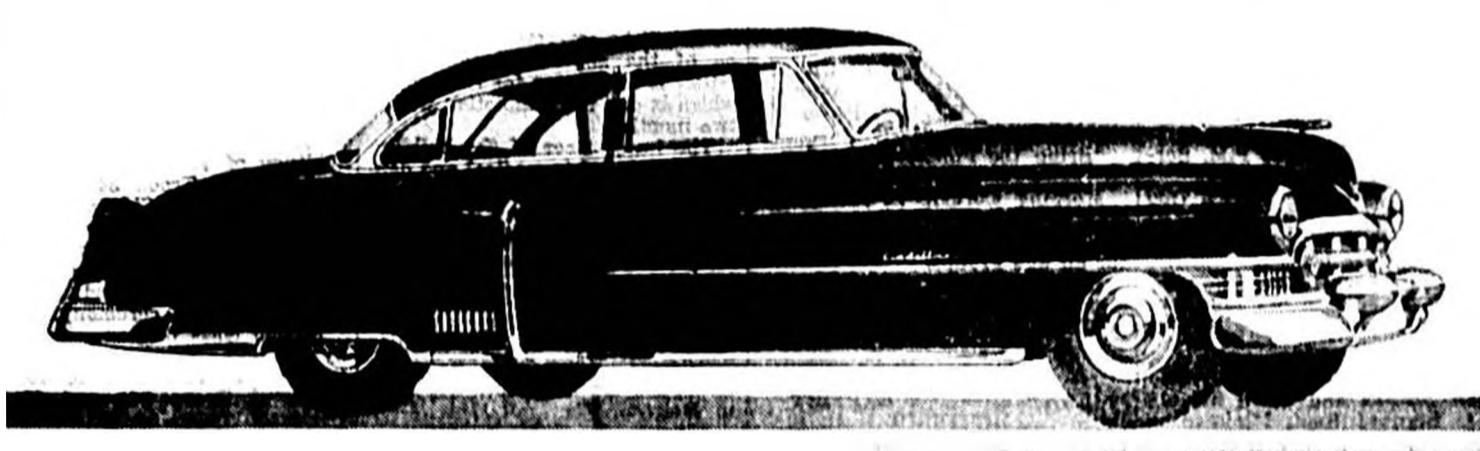

## Joe DiMaggio Gets Two Run Homer In Fifth For Winners

NEW YORK, Oct. 8.—(AP)—Allie Reynolds evened the World Series at two games each today by pitching the New York Yankees to a eight-inning 6-2 victory over the New York Giants before 49,010 fans at the Polo Grounds.

While the steady Indian from Oklahoma City turned back the Giants, his mates ripped into Sam Maglie and Sheldon Jones for 12 hits, including a two-run homer by Joe DiMaggio in the fifth. Reynolds had singled home the tie-breaking run in the fourth.

DiMaggio, snapping his hitless slump with a single and homer, hammered one of Maglie's pitches into the upper left field seats some 350 feet away. It was DiMaggio's eighth home run in 10 series, leaving him some distance behind Babe Ruth's all-time high of 15.

The Giants who pummeled Reynolds had to win the opening game 5-1, found Allie a different pitcher today. Flaring that fast ball and darting curve and slider past the hitters, the 33-year-old right-hander had serious trouble with only one man. Al Dark, The Giant shortstop hit three straight doubles before he grounded into a double play in the eighth.

In the ninth Reynolds wobbled and Manager Casey Stengel pushed Bob Kuzava and Johnny Sam into last bullpen action. A walk to Hank Thompson and singles by Monte Irvin and Bobby Thomson gave the Giants a second run.

After walking leadoff man Hank Bauer of the Yankees in the first inning on four pitches, Maglie set the tone to retire the side. He fanned Phil Rizzuto, got Yogi Berra on a liner to Mays and curled a third called strike past Joe DiMaggio on a 3-2 count.

Dark, who hit a three-run homer off Reynolds in the first game, doubled off the left field wall with one out in the first inning. He went in third on Hank Thompson's slow roller to McDougald and scored on Monte Irvin's single to left, his 30th hit of the series. Irvin was cut down stealing. Berra to Rizzuto.

The Yankees bounced right back to tie the score, 1-1, in the second on Gene Woodling's blooper double to left, an error by Bobby Thomson on Gil McDougald's hopper and Joe Gamma's scoring single to right. With one on first and one out and only one out, Reynolds (fled to Irvin and Bauer's single hit base runner McDougald for an automatic third out.

This prelude play gave Berra his 10th hit of the series. Reynolds fanned Lockman in the second, walked Bobby Thomson and made Mays hit into an inning ending double play.

The Giants backed up Maglie with some fine fielding in the third. Thomson went to his left to collar Rizzuto's smash and threw out the shortstop. Berra's long drive a line drive to Hank Thompson.

Joe DiMaggio, hitless in 17 trips, finally singled to left, the fourth hit off Maglie. Irvin made a last second grab of Woodling's long and blown fly for the final out.

Reynolds, blowing fast, struck out Westrum, whiffed Maglie on three pitches and made Stanky foul out to Berra in the Giant third, leaving the score 1-1.

Reynolds' single, the sixth hit off Maglie, drove home Brown to tie the Yankees a 2-1 edge in the top of the fourth. With one out, Brown cut a single on which Dark made a spectacular stop but threw low and wide to first.

Collins walked and Reynolds hammered a single to center that scored Brown and moved Collins to third. Reynolds then was trapped off first and run down by Lockman.

Dark doubled to open the Giant's fourth. Thompson fouled out but Reynolds pulled out of it without damage, striking out Irvin for the second out and DiMaggio's foul Lockman's long fly to retire the side.

Rizzuto popped to Stanky. Berra singled into right. DiMaggio homered into upper left field stands scoring Berra ahead of him and Yankees ahead 4-1. Woodling popped to Dark. McDougald struck out.

Thomson walked in the fifth and Mays hit a one-bouncer to Reynolds who started a double play, the pitcher to Rizzuto to Collins. Westrum walked, Jack Lohke a righthanded hitter, batted for Maglie and popped to McDougald.

Brown greeted relief pitcher Sheldon Jones with a double to left center, the ninth Yankee hit. Jones then retired the side.

Dark lined his third straight double down the left field line with one out in the sixth. The record in one game is four, set by Frank Iba of the 1900 Chicago White Sox.

Once again Dark was left on base when Hank Thompson popped to Rizzuto and Irvin fouled to Collins.

The Yankees got two more runs in the seventh to open up a 6-1 lead. After Rizzuto singled to right to open the inning, the next two Yankees went out before Woodling walked. Westrum tried to pick Rizzuto off second on the play but DiMaggio and Phil secured for third and came all the way home when Stanky's throw

hit him in the back and bounced toward the stands.

McDougald followed with a single scoring Woodling who had taken second on Rizzuto's play. The official attendance was announced at 49,010 and total receipts of \$234,875. The player pool was boosted by \$119,282.80 to a record total of \$560,162.37. Bob Thomson's single was the only Giant blow of the seventh.
