WASHINGTON, Jan. 8.—
(AP)—President Roosevelt, unheeding a dispute over curbing the Supreme Court, made a second brisk move today to achieve NRA goals by seeking to speed ratifi-cation of a child labor amendment.

In letters to governors and legislatures meet this winter and spring, he asked favorable action on the proposal pending since 1924. Only 12 more states need to act to make it the 22nd amendment. Twenty-four states have ratified it.

"It is clearly indicated that child labor, especially in low-paid understandardized types of work, is increasing," the President wrote. "I am convinced that nation-wide minimum standards are necessary and that a in-legal - safer elimination of child labor."
