





The Manpower Problem

At the suggestion of local business men the Chamber of Commerce has organized an employment bureau where those looking for jobs may register and where those needing help may file their applications for workers. Thus a clearing house is set up facilitating the employment of clerks, stenographers and labor in general and a practical step is taken which may assist materially in keeping a number of places of business open which might otherwise have to close as the manpower shortage becomes more acute.

But it seems to us something more than this is needed if sufficient workers are to be found for those who need size them. It is a good thing to have one central agency where local business men may go when looking for help, but it will not answer the problem unless the help is available when they get there. What is needed now is a tremendous educational campaign to acquaint everyone in this community, and indeed in the whole country with the necessity of going to work,

When you run an ad in the paper for clerks, stenographers or general office workers and get no replies, you may conclude that every one is already working. Unfortunately such is not the case. There are plenty of people today who are not working at all. There are pienty of peo-ple who customarily have worked who no longer feel it necessary to work. There are plenty of people able to do a full day's work six days a week who are satisfied to work 20 or 30 bburs a week

Not long ago a young woman who had been working in our office had to quit because she had a baby and she could not find a nurse to take care of it during her office hours. The nurse who formerly worked for her had quit THE MISSING BROTHER
