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Selassie Warns World Of Another Titanic Conflict

Bearded Warrior In Tears As He Speaks Of Impending War

ADDIS ABABA, Aug. 22.—(AP)—Emperor Haile Selassie, warning the world Wednesday his imminent struggle with Italy may reach a conflict that will threaten the very existence of humanity.

The bearded and hooded Emperor stepped down from his golden throne to grant an amazing interview to the Associated Press at his primitive empire straddled with frenzied preparations for war.

That war, he predicted in the solemn tones of a medieval prophet, not only would destroy Italy and Ethiopia in blood but might drag in the whole world.

"Ethiopia," he said, "if victorious and fully united, must such a conflict leads to world-wide struggle between the white and black races, the very existence and survival of humanity is threatened."

"We will be back in 1941," he said.
