WASHINGTON (UPI) Brazilian President Joan Goulart told Congress today he is confident peaceful competition with communism "will show representative democracy is the most perfect form of government for the preservation of individual liberty."

Addressing a joint session in Portuguese, Goulart reaffirmed Brazil's principles which united the peoples of the west."

He praised the Alliance for Progress, but warned Congress not to expect "rigorously technical global planning" and "prior elimination of instability" by Latin American nations.

He said Brazil offers "ample possibilities for foreign private enterprise that wants to cooperate loyally for the development of the country." In the field of public util-Ities, he said, "there are certain areas of friction that should be eliminated, since, by a natural phenomenon. they generate not only misunderstandings between the government and the franchised companies, but not infrequently misunderstandings between friendly countries."





Education's 2nd Chance

Ever since Sputnik, education in America has been one of the most cussed and discussed subjects on the national scene. At times there seems to be more talk than action, yet farreaching changes are taking placechanges that began long before the

Among them is the phenomenon called the junior college. Today there are nearly 700 of them, at least one in every state (California leads with 71). At the beginning of the century there were none.

The growth rate spurted after World War II with the influx of veterans and the new emphasis on higher education. Yet although about 900,000 students-one-fourth of all college students-now attend junior colleges, a wide area of public ignorance still exists in regard to them.

For those uninterested in a full four-year education, the junior college provides a terminal two-year course of either general or specialized vocational training.

But of greatest importance to a nation whose educational system is a reflection of its democratic ideals, the junior college often is the saving of youngsters who would otherwise be squeezed out of the education race: those who lack the money or credits to meet the rising standards and costs of universities, and the late-bloomers who may lack the ambition or immediate desire.

The junior college movement has been called the most significant development in U.S. education in this century. Indeed, some educators predicted that the two-year Associate of Arts degree awarded by these schools may replace the high school diploma as the basic standard of education. In the future, increasingly crowded universities may well require junior college credits for admission.

For many youths, the junior college is becoming the first choice after high school. For hundreds of thousands of others, it is a second chance at education.

Marsh, president of the Sante Fe Railway, added that government ownership might be inevitable unless remedies are found for such problems as over-regulation, unequal taxation and the in-

with other carriers. Another rail official said the government must stop treating railroads as if they were "a monopoly-which we haven't been for many years."

When the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) was created in 1887, railroads handled practically all of the nation's freight and passenger business. The ICC was set up to protect the public from monopolistic abuses frequent

in those days. Figures compiled by the ICC and the AWR indicate the railroads have slipped far from this position of auprem-

Last year, railroads hauled 44 per cent of all inter-city freight traffic. As late as 1929, they hauled 75 per cent. l'assenger business was down to 27% per from 77 per cent in

Other transportation media have increased their share. Freight carried by trucks jumped more than 31s times since 1946. Tonnage on rivers and canals rose four times. ir travel by 1960 totaled nearly six times that of 1946 and travel by private auto rose




