





New Apprentice System Tried By California School

Thirty Students Are Given Places With Houses Of Business countless other business places.

SAN BERNARDINO, Calif. Aug. 4-"No experience, no job

Public school authorities here took this remark of a high school graduate as an indictment of educational methods. With growing frequency, it was being repeated in one variation or an other by dozens of graduates.

Albert D. Graves, Superinterdent of Schools, set out to do something about it. The result is a "work-and-learn" vocational program, which has placed 30 apprentices with business houses and industrial plants in its first
