





City-County Meeting Breaks Down Barrier

Sanford and Seminole Commissioners, for the first time in history, sat down together Friday night and discussed mutual problems.

Each pledged harmony and cooperation with the other;

each became aware of the problems of the other. Under discussion were many of the projects in which the city and county share joint responsibility. Among these were roads, drainage, taxes and the various services de-

manded by the public. The meeting was called to discuss the possibility of the county sharing in the cost of the city's recreation program. Such a cost-sharing agreement would allow use of city fa-

cilities by non-city residents, without charge. Other matters of mutual interest came up after the recreation problem was settled, temporarily,

County Commissioners plan similar sessions with each Town Council in Seminole, Future sessions between the county governing body and the Sanford Commission are assured. During the session, each official had a chance to "get

everything off his chest." This was important in that it helped to break down the barrier which existed between the two governments.

Several past instances of non-cooperation between the two were cited. This led, in many cases, to duplication of equipment and machinery, some of which can be used no more than 30 days each year.

Possible benefits suggested as a result of such meetings included such things as joint purchasing of materials and equipment, the combining of such functions as tax assessment, tax collection, recreation and other activities, not only for Sanford and the County Commission, but for the

county and all municipalities. However, one of the most important points established at the joint meeting was the fact that Sanford is a part of Seminole County. This is a fact which too long has been ignored. County Commissions of the past admitted this,

but little was done about it. The feeling had been that the County Commission, legal-ly and morally, was responsible for the rural area, the city could take care of city residents. This feeling existed despite the fact that city dwellers were, and are, carrying a lion's share of the county tax load.

These meetings can lead only to better things for all of the people of Seminole County.
