## FHP investigates dead man found along side 17-92

The body of a man was located by Seminole County sheriff's deputies Saturday off the shoulder of U.S. Highway 17-92, east of the Sanford Zoo, near the Preserve at Lake Monroe subdivision.

The body was identified as that of Dwayne Anthony McFarlane, 39, of DeBary. Initially suspecting that McFarlane may have been struck by a vehicle which left the area, the case was turned over to the Florida Highway Patrol.

Tuesday morning however, a spokesperson for the FHP said it is now uncertain if the man was actually struck by a vehicle.

"At this time, we are waiting for results from the Medical Examiner," said FHP officer Kim Miller. "Once we get that information, we will be able to determine if it may have been a hit-and-run, or death from some other cause."

The FHP is asking that anyone with information regarding this incident phone the FHP at 407-737-2300.

## Bystander thwarts bank robber's escape attempt

When James Trainor, 48, of Orlando went Tuesday to rob his second Seminole County bank in less than week, he didn't expect the quick work of a Good Samaritan would foil his crime spree.

Seminole County Sheriff's Office deputies responded at about 9:20 a.m. to a bank robbery at the CNL Bank, 1200 S. International Parkway, in unin-

corporated Lake Mary. Trainor had already slipped away, but he couldn't evade Justice — Longwood resident Steven Justice that is.

Shortly after the bank robbery, a deputy approached a blue Jeep Cherokee similar to the one used as a get-away vehicle described by witnesses at a Lake Mary bank robbery last Thursday at the First National Bank of Central Florida at 1511 International Parkway, located near the

intersection of County Road 46A.

"Lake Mary (police) provided some very timely information," said Steve Olson, Seminole County Sheriff's Office spokesman.

According to sheriff's office authorities, when Lake Mary police heard the robbery call being dispatched they provided deputies a description of the vehicle and suspect from the

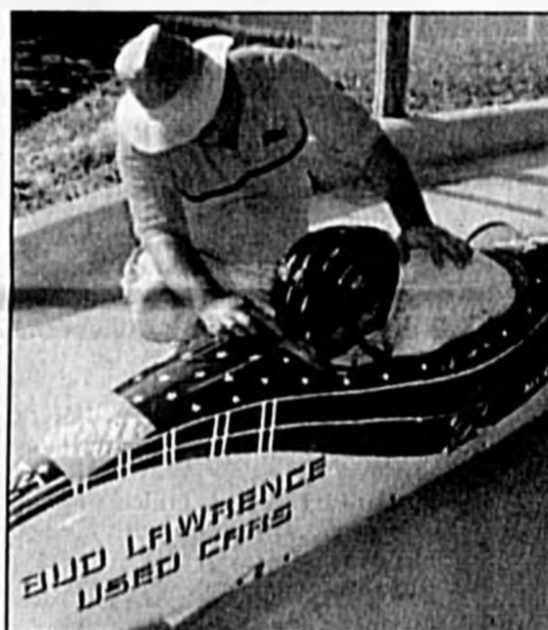
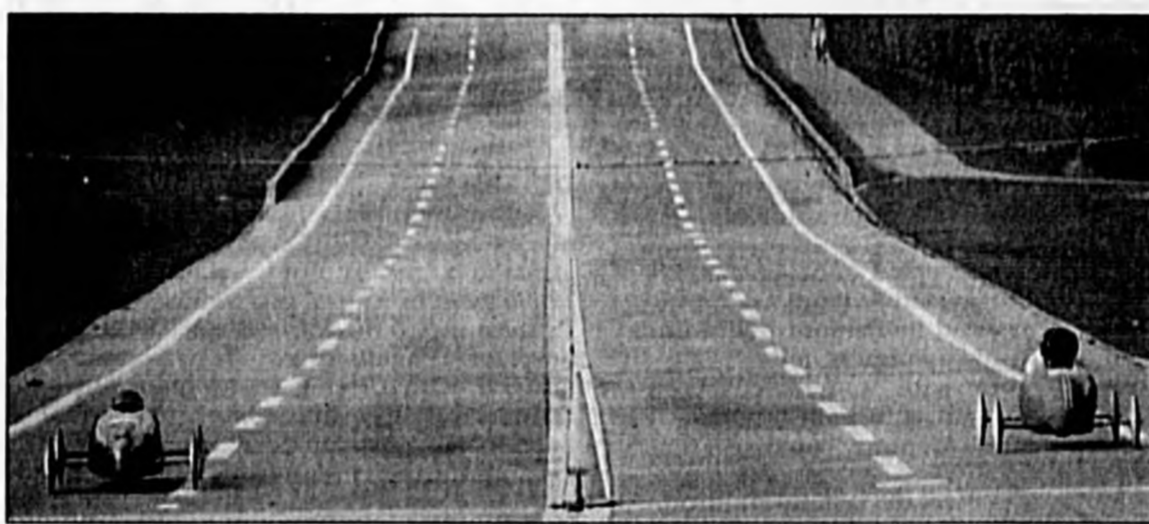

## Mica pushes S.R. 417 project

LAKE MARY — A federally subsidized transportation project could make it easier for International Parkway executives to make their way to the east side of Seminole County.

Congressman John Mica (7th District-R) is championing \$5 million in federal assistance for a fourth leg of the GreeneWay (State Road 417). Although the extension would be less than a mile long, Lake Mary Commissioner Gary Brender said the project is key to the developing corridor.

The "Missing Link" of the state road was completed two years ago with new ramps at both Lake Mary Boulevard and U.S. Highway 17-92 and new interchanges at Interstate 4, Rinehart Road and County Road 46A. The \$265 million link was built to ease traffic woes on Interstate 4, but Brender said one more interchange could further reduce congestion on Rinehart Road.

"I think we are really getting ahead of the traffic needs by

## Schools foundation takes stock in students

LONGWOOD — In the year 2000, an eighth-grade Hispanic student at South Seminole Middle School in Casselberry found a pamphlet that became his ticket to a college scholarship.

Fernando Echevarria said he was curious about the Take Stock in Children program offered by The Foundation for Seminole County Public Schools. It awards a four-year college scholarship to low-income students who meet requirements.

"I had heard or read that 60 percent of Hispanics don't make it past their first year of college," said Fernando, now a senior at Lake Howell High School in Winter Park. "I didn't want to be a statistic. I wanted to succeed."

Fernando and 15 other students graduated from the Take Stock program May 6 at Lyman High School. Each received a

When she is not fulfilling a schedule of appearances as reigning Miss Winter Park, Freeman is thinking ahead about college. She is considering enrolling at the University of Central Florida or Rollins College, but is also looking at University of Florida.

### Zellwood Corn Festival kicks off its 31st year

It's time once again for the Zellwood Sweet Corn Festival. This is the 31st year of the event and will be held May 28, 29 and 30.

Ticket prices have been lowered. \$13 in advance or \$15 at the gate. For children ages 5 through 12, \$5. Children 4 and under will be admitted free. Advanced tickets may be purchased from the office by mailing a check to P.O. Box 628, Zellwood, Fla., 32798 or phoning the office at 407-886-0014 and paying with a credit card. A three day pass is available for \$35. Parking is free.

Gates will be open Friday from 5 to 10 p.m. Saturday and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. There will be live music right up to closing time, and Zellwood Corn will be available at all hours. The music starts at 11 a.m. This year, there will be a bike show on Saturday and a car show on Sunday. Friday evening is Family Night, sponsored by Positive Hits 288.3 radio.

Entertainment will include comedian and singer Mark Lowry (known from the Gaither Vocal Band), Chris Rice, and Cartoons. (No alcohol or tobacco products will be sold).

Saturday will see Caribbean Chillers, Margo Rochelle and Rodeo Drive, Cross Canadian Ragweed, the corn eating contest, and the Charlie Daniels Band.

Sunday will feature Alan Cox, Jessie Lee, Caribbean Chillers, Red Eye Express, Diablo Canyon and the Diamond Rio. Corn shucking contest is at 12:45 p.m.

Each year, the festival serves approximately 200,000 ears of Zellwood Sweet Corn dripping in hot melted butter to some 25,000 hungry corn eaters. Long and Scott Farms in Zellwood will be providing the corn.

"Big Bertha," the giant corn cooker will be on hand preparing 1,650 ears of corn every nine minutes, in 350 gallons of boiling water. Local 2057 Firefighters will be cooking all the Zellwood Corn. Bring the family and friends, wear comfortable clothing, and bring a lawn chair or blanket for enjoying the great music. No tents, tarps, nothing larger than an umbrella, no pets, Frisbees or coolers. Video recording of the entertainment is not permitted.

In addition to all the activities, there will be an arts and crafts show, food concession, amusement rides and games and a souvenir tent. Grade 1 corn will be sold on the property. 2+2 Florida Prepaid College Scholarship. They will attend a two-year community college and then two years at a four-year university.

Fernando chose to start at Valencia Community College in Orlando. He said he wants to major in history and education at the University of Central Florida in Orlando or Florida State University in Tallahassee.

Watching Fernando and his peers were nine eighth-graders selected to sign a contract to begin the program. Together the eighth-graders stood and vowed, among other things, to maintain a 2.5 grade point average or higher, remain drug and crime free and meet weekly with a mentor.

Lisa Reineck said nine was a low number of participants starting the program. The reason is not lack of interest, she said, but the fact that costs for college keep increasing.

"The cost of a scholarship is over \$10,000," said Reineck, program coordinator. She added that the state pays for half.

The evening began with a dinner provided by Outback Steakhouse for everyone involved in the Take Stock program.

Mentor Helen Bernstein sat with her student Dlse Hirmiz. Bernstein said she has volunteered for more than 18 years with Seminole County schools, but the one program she is most

proud to mention is Take Stock in Children.

"I would absolutely do it again," Bernstein said.

Like all the mentors and students in the program, Bernstein meets for about 45 minutes every week to talk about grades, college prep courses and happenings in the young person's life.

"I feel like I'm a good female role model," Bernstein said, adding, "I'm careful of my boundaries." She doesn't take the place of a parent in other words, she said.

In the beginning, Bernstein said it was somewhat frustrating if Dlse didn't show up for meetings. As Dlse matured the frustrations evaporated and now Dlse carries a 3.5 to 3.7 grade point average. She said she looks forward to studying dentistry in the near future.

Eighth-grader Coral Bryan does not know who her mentor will be yet. The South Seminole Middle School student is shy when asked about the program she just signed on to.

"She's not shy about her education," said her teacher Jo Ann Carty. "She is a good student who isn't afraid to ask questions and who gets along very well with her peers."

When she attends Winter Springs High School in the fall, she will be paired with a mentor like John Edmead, a Winter Park mortgage banker, who has worked with Fernando for the

last four years.

Edmead said his service consisted of listening and advising in different roles.

"At times I played the adviser role, other times a relative role and other times the friend role," Edmead said.

When asked if he guided Fernando toward his teaching career goal, he said that was the student's own choice.

"I suggested he do something he has a passion about," Edmead said.

Without help from the community, the program would not be successful, Reineck said. In addition to mentors, there are corporate sponsors who help fund the program.

Gerard Roux, a senior vice president with Bank of America and chairman of The Foundation for Seminole County Public Schools, told the young people Thursday about his high school experience.

"I carried myself in a way that was regrettable," he said.

He was cut from the basketball team in his senior year. He

the funds come from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund, which is money seized during arrests of drug dealers and other criminals.

"I couldn't think of a better way to use these funds," he said.

Later, he added that the sheriff's office support for the program stems from the fact that, "This is probably one of the better crime prevention programs."

doing it now," he said.

Transportation officials are proposing the \$5 million grant would build an entrance and exit to the GreeneWay from International Parkway just south of County Road 46A behind the Colonial TownPark development.

The new interchange would be a continuation of the current GreeneWay westbound ramp to Interstate 4.

The GreeneWay extension is one of many new transportation projects coming to Seminole County. The state legislature recently approved funds for widening State Road 46 to four lanes from U.S. Highway 17-92 to State Road

415; widening State Road 415 to four lanes from State Road 46 to the Volusia County line and constructing a new bridge over the St. Johns River; and a new Interstate 4 interchange at State Road 46.

Along with the state funded projects, Seminole County Engineer Jerry McCollum said the federal grant for the GreeneWay extension is another critical project for the county.

"The Congressman has been pushing very hard for the \$5 million, which does everything—designs it, builds it and the whole nine yards," he said.

The federal grant for the Seminole County project recently passed its first hurdle

as a \$275 billion highway bill in the House of Representatives was approved. Mica is Florida's senior member on the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, which drafted the legislation. He also serves as Chairman of the House Aviation Subcommittee.

The federal assistance is included in the Transportation Efficiency Act — Legacy for Users legislation, a bill that identifies highway projects eligible for federal funding for the next six years.

The Senate meanwhile, has approved a similar major highway bill, but it does not identify specific projects and is about

\$40 billion more than House version. Mica said in the coming months, differences between the two proposals must be reconciled through a House-Senate Conference Committee.

"It is possible we will not get it completed this year," said Gary Burns, a spokesman in Mica's office. "It was one of Congressman Mica's priorities."

Local officials are hoping the legislation will be approved at least after the presidential election.

"This is not a done deal at this stage, but we are very hopeful and optimistic," McCollum said.

**Capt. Reckline leaving Sanford Salvation Army**

**SANFORD** — The officer in charge of the Seminole County division of the Salvation Army is heading South, and not for a tropical vacation.

Capt. Robert Reckline, who has been the county's corps officer for three years, is being reassigned to Key West in June, where he and his wife will oversee the Monroe County division.

"We've had a wonderful time and we're really going to miss the area," Reckline said.

Reckline was born and raised in Baltimore in a single-parent

home with four siblings. After graduating high school in 1979 and working for a few years, he decided to attend the Salvation Army Training College to become an officer.

"I feel that what I'm doing now is what I was called to do a long time ago," he said. "Growing up I didn't have a whole lot. I've always wanted to help people avoid the same situation."

Reckline met his wife in 1981 at a Salvation Army camp in West Virginia. They married in 1982, and have two children. They are both ministers at the Salvation Army church in Seminole County. Other family

members are involved with the organization - Reckline's brother is a captain in Texas, and his brother-in-law is a major in Tampa.

Reckline and his wife were first stationed in St. Petersburg, then went on to direct offices in Orange Park, Miami, Brooksville and Ft. Pierce before coming to Sanford. The structure of the Salvation Army is much like the military.

"You're told where you're going and when," he said.

Reckline said when he came to Seminole County, his focus was on "what needed to be done for the Salvation Army in this area to enhance the current

programs that are taking place." The local division offers programs for food, housing, utilities, financial aid, youth activities, community camps, court-ordered supervised visitations and state-wide disaster assistance. Last year, the division helped 4,546 people with services such as food, prescriptions and after-school programs for children and provided 1,200 people with clothes, toys and food during the holiday season.

Reckline said he will miss the employees, church members and the advisory board for the organization, made up of leaders and residents from the county "who believe in the mission of the Salvation Army and want to help out."

"When we first arrived here we were welcomed and it's been a very enjoyable experience," he said. "I appreciate the support from the community and I hope that they will continue supporting the Salvation Army."

In Key West, Reckline and his wife will be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the organization, along with overseeing five thrift stores in the area.

"It's going to be a new adventure," he said. "The thrift stores in Monroe County are very successful, we want to make sure that we will keep them going."

For Reckline and his family, helping others is what it's all about.

"Helping our fellow man is what I believe we're placed on this earth to do," he said. "It feels good when you have people walk up to you and say that if it wasn't for the Salvation Army we wouldn't have a house or a meal. It's a feeling that you can't really express."

prior bank heist. Shortly after the incident, Deputy Devin Lucius noticed Trainor's vehicle in the parking lot of the Burger King on State Road 434 near Markham Woods Road.

Olson said the "relatively new deputy" approached the vehicle and Trainor was somewhat complying with his commands until the deputy went to handcuff him. As Trainor was freeing himself from the deputy's grasp, Lucius fired a taser at him that didn't make a direct hit. The deputy reported: "the suspect lost his balance and fell. The suspect immediately stood up and charged at me. I struck the suspect in the chest with my open

palms. The suspect hugged my legs as I took him to the ground. The suspect continued to hit me in my arms and chest with his hands."

Justice was nearby waiting in the fast food drive-thru line for a cup of coffee when he saw the action unfold.

"He was just interested in getting out of there and running for his life," Justice said of the bank robber.

Justice, a general manager of a food safety company in Orlando, said he's never been a law enforcement officer before, but he didn't like what he was seeing.

"More than anything else I think it was ticking me off that this guy was fighting with the deputy and didn't have the respect," he said.

Then before he knew it, Justice was running across State Road 434 along with the deputy toward Petty's Meats.

"I don't know what I was thinking," he said. "The only thing I was thinking to myself is 'I don't see a gun in his hand and we probably can take this guy.'"

"I'm faster than I think," Justice added.

Justice admits some of his adrenaline may have been from the recent long hours he's been working to prepare the company's annual budget.

"I took out some of my budget frustration on him, but that's OK," he quipped.

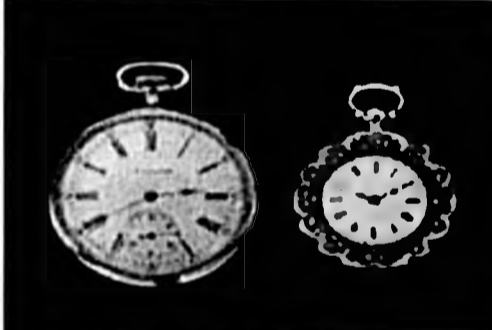
"I would probably do it again because I didn't want the deputy getting hurt," he added. "I really don't have a bad temper or anything like that. My wife tells me I'm going to get killed one of these days. I've confronted shoplifters in stores before. 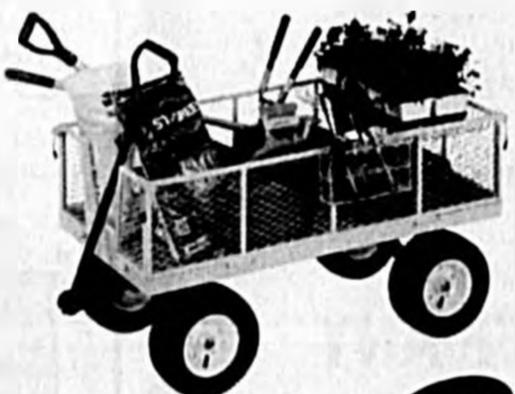

SANFORD — As the Seals and Crofts song goes, "We many never pass this way again...."

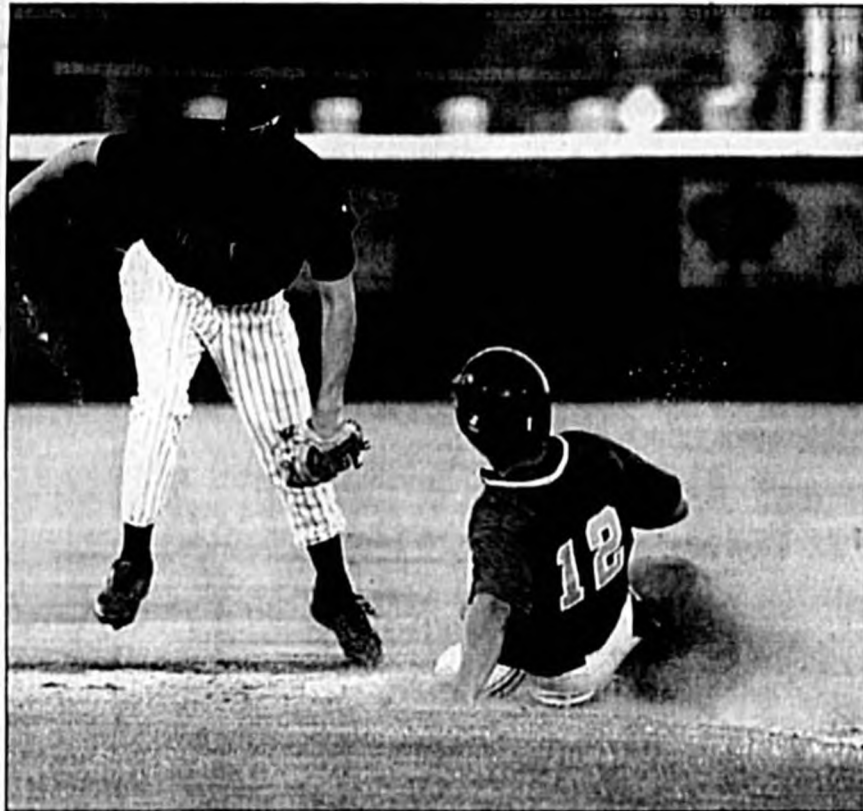
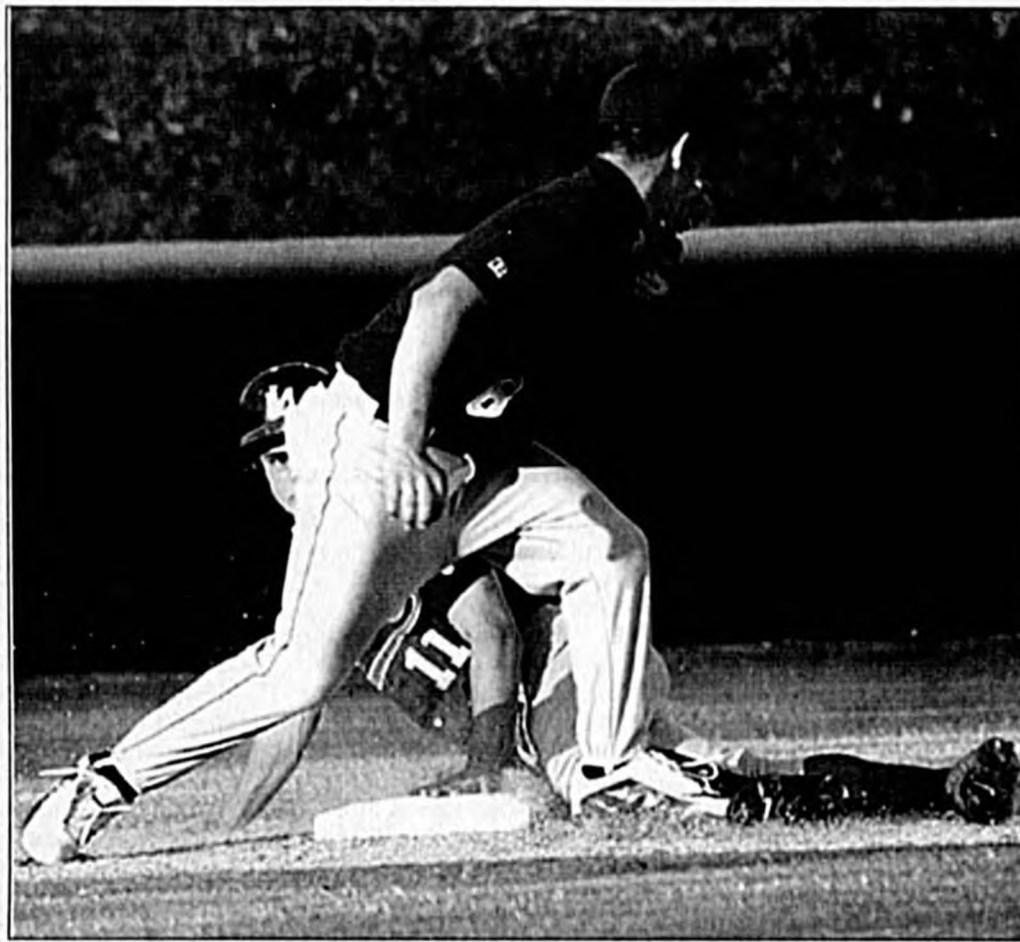

Matt Fox fired a complete-game two-hit shutout with 12 strikeouts to lead No. 20 UCF past Georgia State 11-0 Friday evening at Panthersville Field in Atlanta to clinch the Atlantic Sun Regular Season Title outright and

also eliminated Georgia State from contention in the A-Sun Tournament. The regular season title is the fourth in five years for UCF.

Fox won his 12th game of the season, becoming just the fourth player in school history to win at least 12 games. Fox is tied with Casey Kennedy (2001) for third in UCF single-season history with 12 wins.

Lake Mary's Ryan Bono was 1-for-4 with an RBI.

On Saturday, Oviedo's Brian Brooks limited Georgia State to one unearned run over 4.1 innings to lead UCF to a 6-5 victory over the Panthers in game one of a doubleheader. In the second game, Dave Lambert drove in the game-winning run in the eighth inning to lead the Golden Knights to a come-from-behind 10-9 victory.

With the doubleheader sweep, UCF improved to 42-14 overall and 24-6 in the A-Sun while Georgia State ended its season at 18-36, 11-19 in the league. The 24 A-Sun wins set a new school record for UCF.

Brooks (3-1) yielded four hits and recorded one strikeout to lead UCF to its 41st win of the season in relief of Lake Mary's Kyle Bono, who had one of his few tough outings of the season. The Golden Knights rallied from an early 4-0 deficit after two innings for the comeback win with Ryan Bono going 1-for-4 with a run scored and Lake Mary's Drew Butera going 1-for-3 with a run and an RBI. Ryan Bono was also hit by a pitch for the 16th time in 2004, tying him with Rich Wallace for the UCF single-season record.

Both Ryan Bono and Butera had big games in the nightcap, Bono going 2-for-5 with a run scored and an RBI and Butera also going 2-for-5 with three runs scored (a career-high) and three RBIs.

UCF returns to action today (Wednesday) in the first game of the 2004 Atlantic Sun Championships in DeLand. The Golden Knights face No. 6 seed Campbell at 11 a.m. at Melching Field. **ATLANTIC SUN WEEKLY HONORS**  
Stetson University sophomore second baseman Brandon Paritz has been named the Atlantic Sun Conference Player of the Week and for the third

time this season. UCF right-handed pitcher Matt Fox earned Atlantic Sun Baseball Pitcher-of-the-Week honors as named by the league office on Monday afternoon.

Paritz batted .636 (7-11) with three doubles, four runs, and three RBIs last week to help lead the Hatters to a series win over Troy State. On Friday, Paritz went 4-for-4 with a walk and sparked a game-winning rally in the bottom of the eighth. With the scored tied at six, Paritz led off with a double against NCAA ERA leader Nate Moore and later scored the go-ahead run on a wild pitch. Paritz added three hits in Saturday's doubleheader and scored the game-winning run in Stetson's 2-1 victory in game two.

Paritz earns his first career Player of the Week honor and becomes the fourth Hatter to be named this season.

Fox, from Coral Gables, was nearly perfect against Georgia State on Friday night, throwing a nine-inning, two-hit shutout against the Panthers. The junior allowed just two singles and faced 30 batters en route to his sixth complete game of the year and third shutout. Earlier on Friday, Fox was named a semifinalist for the Roger Clemens Award, only to take the mound that night and strikeout 12 Panther batters. Fox finished the game by retiring 17 of the final 18 batters, including four of the last five on strikeouts.

**BERGMAN A-SUN COACH-OF-THE-YEAR**  
UCF junior pitcher Matt Fox was named the 2004 Atlantic Sun Pitcher-of-the-Year while UCF head coach Jay Bergman was named the 2004 Atlantic Sun Coach-of-the-Year, the conference office announced Tuesday. In addition, six other UCF players garnered A-Sun First Team, Second Team or Freshmen Team honors.

Joining Fox on the A-Sun All-Conference First Team include sophomore pitcher Kyle Bono and junior outfielders Dee Brown and Clay Timpner. Junior shortstop Chandler Rose was chosen to the A-Sun All-Conference Second Team while freshmen RHP Taylor Meier and infielder Matt Ray garnered A-Sun All-Freshmen Team accolades.

Fox was chosen as the A-Sun's Pitcher-of-the-Year in the first year the conference has offered the award. A three-time A-Sun Pitcher-of-the-Week in 2004, Fox leads UCF with a 12-2 record and 1.84 ERA. In 98.0 innings, Fox has 112 strikeouts (fifth in UCF single-season history) and his 12 wins are tied for third in single-season history.

Bergman, who previously lived in Sanford and started the baseball program at then Seminole Junior College, was named the A-Sun Coach-of-the-Year for a record-setting third time. The dean of all A-Sun coaches, Bergman is the winningest coach in conference history and is also ranked among the top 25 all-time in wins in NCAA history. Bergman turned UCF around from a 31-25 record in 2003 including a 14-16 A-Sun mark to a 42-14 record in 2004 including a 24-6 A-Sun record and two top 25 rankings. UCF was voted third in both the A-Sun Coaches and Media Preseason Polls.

Bono put together a fantastic season on the hill to give UCF one of the nation's top 1-2 pitching tandems with Fox. The Lake Mary native is 8-1 with a 1.83 ERA in 88.2 innings of work. Bono set a school record with five shutouts in 2004 and ranks among the school's all-time leaders in single-season strikeouts and ERA. Bono was a three-time A-Sun Pitcher-of-the-Week during the 2004 campaign.

Meier became one of the most effective freshman pitchers in the nation as the Altamonte Springs native went 5-3 with a 2.39 ERA. In 60.1 innings of work, Meier fanned 45 and opponents batted just .217 vs. the right-hander. Meier is third on the team in innings pitched and strikeouts, behind Fox and Bono.

**CHRIS WESTERVELT NAMED ATLANTIC SUN PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

Stetson University senior catcher Chris Westervelt, who grew up in Lake Mary, has been named the 2004 Atlantic Sun Conference Player of the Year and third baseman Braedyn Pruitt has been named Atlantic Sun Conference

Freshman of the Year, the league office announced with its end of the year baseball awards on Tuesday.

This season, Westervelt is batting .381 with 11 home runs and a career-high 55 RBIs. He ranks among the top four conference leaders in 10 offensive categories, including hits (75), doubles (16), runs (53), and total bases (124).

The 2002 A-Sun Player of the Year, Westervelt joins former Hatter Wes Weger as the only two-time Player of the Year selections. Stetson now boasts 10 Player of the Year recipients, the most of any school in the league.

**BLAKE HOORELBEKE CHOSEN TO ATLANTIC SUN ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**  
Senior Blake Hoorelbeke was named to the 2004 Atlantic Sun Conference All-Tournament Team after guiding Stetson to a 2-2 record and the semi-final game last week.

Hoorelbeke, a senior from Rancho Palos Verdes, Calif. who previously played at Seminole Community College, was 1-2 in the circle with the first perfect game of her career coming in the Hatters' five-inning 8-0 win over Mercer. She also notched her 15th home run and 55th RBI of the season in that same game.

In Stetson's tournament record-tying 15 inning game against Florida Atlantic, Hoorelbeke had 16 putouts at first base along with one hit and one RBI.

For the week, she posted a 0.78 ERA and allowed just two earned runs and nine hits while striking out nine batters in 18 innings of work.

Stetson University softball player Brittan Houghton was recently selected 2004 First-Team Southeastern All-Region by the region's head coaches.

Among NCAA leaders, Houghton (Ft. Myers, Fla.) finished the season seventh in batting with a .444 average and 13th in stolen bases with 39, while leading the Atlantic Sun in both categories. The outfielder also led the league in hits (92) and was second in runs scored (48) and on-base percentage (.500). She set single season school records in batting, runs scored and hits at Stetson.

Houghton, who also serves as pitcher for the Hatters, notched a 13-3 record in the circle this season and ranked among conference leaders in ERA, opposing batting average and wins.

The junior earned Second-Team All-Atlantic Sun honors as an outfielder and was also chosen A-Sun Pitcher of the Week on April 26.

Houghton will now go on the ballot for All-America voting.

**UCF'S BEST NAMED LOUISVILLE SLUGGER/NFCA ALL-REGION**

Junior shortstop Stephanie Best of the UCF softball team was recently voted to the Louisville Slugger/National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-Southeast Region Second Team by the NFCA coaches.

The two-time Atlantic Sun Player of the Year, Best was among the country's top offensive players as she was ranked among the top five nationally in both batting average and slugging percentage. She finished the season hitting .442 with a .840 slugging percentage and a .562 on base percentage.

Best led the A-Sun in several offensive categories, including runs scored (55), home runs (16), total bases (137) and walks (42). She was named conference player of the week on three occasions and was named to the CoSIDA All-Academic District III First Team for the second consecutive year.

It was the second time Best earned all-region status. Last season, she was named to the All-Southeast Region First Team.

### Fresh tires help Kenseth claim All-Star Challenge

Matt Kenseth seized the lead from Ryan Newman with three laps to go and cruised home to win the Nextel All-Star Challenge at Lowe's Motor Speedway Saturday and collect a \$1 million paycheck.

Newman dominated much of the third and final segment of NASCAR's all-star race after staying on the track while his competitors, including Kenseth, stopped for new tires with 20 laps to go.

Kenseth's fresh rubber eventually proved to be too much for Newman.

"We just ran out of tires at the end," said Newman, who finished second ahead of Tony Stewart, Michael Waltrip and Dale Earnhardt Jr.

Kenseth, the defending Nextel Cup Series champion, said he simply seized the opportunity when Newman began to slip near the finish.

"[Newman] just slipped up a little in Turn 4, so I was able to clear him," Kenseth said. "I can't believe how hard he ran on old tires."

Several contenders were eliminated in a spectacular 13-car crash on Lap 11 that was triggered when Kurt Busch spun his Roush Racing teammate Greg Biffle as the pack raced down the frontstretch.

Busch, Biffle, Kevin Harvick, Robby Gordon, Joe Nemechek and Sterling Marlin were done for the night, while Jeff Gordon, Jimmie Johnson, Waltrip, Elliott Sadler, Kasey Kahne, Bobby Labonte and Ken Schrader continued with patched-up cars.

"It's early in the race, and a teammate wrecks you and just drives in the back of you," Biffle said. "It's crazy."

Busch said he was trying to push his teammate Biffle down the straightaway.

"I didn't mean to wreck him," Busch said. "I apologize for all the wrecked cars out there."

Marlin said he'd like to scrap the non-points all-star race.

"I know I might make somebody mad, but I'd rather go run a points race where it would mean something," he said. "It's like this every year. Everybody tears up their cars, and somebody is mad."

Tony Stewart won the opening 40-lap segment, while Newman, who led a race-high 49 laps, took the middle 30-lap run.

### Mears' car troubles cause wreck in Open

The Nextel Open opened with a Talladega-style "Big Wreck" just yards beyond the start-finish line and ended with a paint-swappin' short-track finish.

Outside pole-sitter Casey Mears had transmission problems just after the drop of the green flag, slowed dramatically and was rammed from behind by Jeremy Mayfield, triggering an 11-car smash-up.

Then with two laps to go, Mayfield and Jamie McMurray bumped and slid into each other while racing for the lead. A lap later, Mayfield cut behind McMurray off Turn 4, taking the air off McMurray's rear spoiler and sending him on a slide. That let Sterling Marlin speed from third to first and get the victory.

The first-lap crash ruined the night for Kerry Earnhardt, Scott Riggs, Ricky Rudd, Jimmy Spencer, Brendan Gaughan and Jeff Burton. Others continued, but with damaged cars.

"The transmission blew up," Mears said. "I went from second [gear] to third, got third for a split second and then it just blew apart. I feel bad for everybody. We had a mechanical failure, and it took out half the field."

But unlike other NASCAR races that count toward the points standings, there were no hard feelings in the aftermath of the crash.

Rudd, Burton and Mears were clowning and grabbing each other in fun as they climbed from the ambulance for the mandatory visit to the track's care center.

"You might as well [have some fun]," Burton said of his off-track antics. "It's been one of those years."

The Open, a 30-lap race for those who haven't won recently on the Nextel circuit offers the victor a chance to advance to the \$1 million-to-win Nextel All-Star Challenge, which is run immediately after the Open.

Ken Schrader also took a starting spot in the all-star race after being voted in by fans participating in an online poll.

### Magic Johnson, NASCAR team up for diversity

Former basketball player joins in diversity effort

Concord, N.C.

In an effort to diversify a sport that has been predominantly white, NASCAR has reached out to a former Los Angeles Lakers basketball player for help.

Earvin "Magic" Johnson has agreed to co-chair the new Executive Steering Committee for Diversity and will volunteer his time to convince minorities to participate.

His goal, and NASCAR's, is to have minority participation at every level, including drivers, mechanics, team owners, track workers and fans.

"I'm giving my time because I want to see more minorities in this sport," Johnson said last week at NASCAR's Research and Development Center. "I want to touch more minorities to let them know [NASCAR] is great."

Johnson, who became a successful businessman after retiring from the

NBA in 1991, said he's exploring the possibility of purchasing a race team, but he needs more time for research. He said he will be a hands-on diversity leader.

"Whether I'm an owner or not, if I can touch lives and make sure minorities can come up in this sport somehow, then I've done what I wanted to do," he said. "Do I know it's going to take a lot of hard work? Yes. Do I know it's going to take some time? Yes. But I'm patient. I'm here for the long haul."

For most of its 55-year history, NASCAR has been dominated by whites.

The only African-American to regularly compete in the elite Nextel Cup division was the late Wendell Scott, who ran 495 races from 1961 to 1973. He won one race and one pole.

In recent years, Bill Lester has raced in the Craftsman Truck Series as part of diversity programs sponsored by Dodge and Toyota. This year several black drivers, including Morty Buckles, are running short-track races with support from NASCAR's Drive for Diversity program.

A 2002 ESPN/Chilton poll found that

25 percent of NASCAR fans are non-white. Statistics compiled by NASCAR show that it has been the fastest growing sport among African-Americans and Hispanics during the past seven years. African-American fans have increased 18 percent — approximately two million people — since 1995. Hispanic fans have increased 38 percent — approximately three million people — since 1996.

Johnson said he's aware NASCAR has some fans, including those who fly Confederate battle flags at races, who might not be open to an influx of minorities. But he doesn't see a major problem.

"I can't control what happens with flags," he said. "I can't control what people want to put in their cars. The only thing I can control is making sure these programs are run in the correct manner and make sure minorities are touched in the right way."

"There are some things that have been going on in NASCAR for years. I can't change that. I'm not here to change NASCAR. I'm just here to try to involve more minorities in the sport of NASCAR."

## Sheriff's office finds medical files in garbage

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office is in possession of files that were found in a dumpster outside of an Altamonte Springs area physician's office.

According to the law enforcement personnel who investigated, the documents appear to contain social security numbers, credit card and billing information, personal information, as well as treatment information.

The records were found in a dumpster outside of the office of Dr. Parviz Brauman (aka Brahma), 100 Lake Shore Drive, Altamonte Springs. The doctor is reportedly in the process of being evicted from the property for reported non-payment of rent.

The records were discovered Thursday morning by an employee of a dental office, which shares space in the building with the doctor's office. Deputies responded, documented the case, and took the records for safekeeping.

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office is now looking into whether a theft complaint, filed on May 21, has any connection to the discovery of these records. In that case, reported last Friday, Brauman alleged that somebody broke into his office and stole patient files. Further investigation revealed another employee was in possession of the records. According to the incident report, the employee said they were allegedly ordered to dispose of them by the doctor, but put them into storage instead.

The sheriff's office will be in contact with the State Attorney's Office as to appropriate criminal sanctions, if any, that apply to this case. A special line set up to handle inquiries about patient records found in the dumpster is 407-665-6663. If the line is busy, or for after hours inquiries, callers will be asked to leave their contact information and a staff member will call back.

# Bus service funding hotly debated

## County commissioners want route changes while cities demand dedicated funding source

SANFORD — By avoiding the possibility of losing one of the county's seven bus routes Tuesday, Seminole County Commissioner Grant Maloy is calling for changes to the lesser-used Oviedo line while some city officials are saying its time to overhaul the funding of the whole system.

Introduced to the growing

community southeast portion of the county in October of 1992, the Oviedo-based bus line primarily serves the University of Central Florida, Oviedo Marketplace mall and the neighborhood of Alafaya Woods. Seminole County com-

missioners considered eliminating the route this month when the city of Oviedo refused to pay nearly half of the \$80,000 needed to continue the service.

remaining portion of the route this month, Maloy said changes are needed to increase the viability of the route that has shown only a slight increase in ridership since its inception.

When Link 47 began it was

servicing about 3,500 passengers a month, and as of February 2004 only about 4,500 passengers used the route.

"It's still one of the lowest performing routes in the whole system," Maloy said. "One of the problems is it doesn't go to where there is a high density of people."

"To me it's on life support and it never seems to take off," he added.

## YMCA Safe Start program teaches children water survival skills

LAKE MARY — The story is the same, but it's the ending that is different.

On a cold January day in Sanford, Cally Dawber walked into her backyard pool area, with her 2-year-old son Grayson pedaling his tricycle. As Grayson pedaled on, Dawber turned away from the pool to lock the gate behind them.

She then heard a splash. She whirled around.

Grayson and his tricycle had fallen into the pool.

By the time Dawber got to the edge of the pool, Grayson had swum out from under his tricycle and grabbed onto the side of the pool.

Had Grayson not been taught how to react while unaided in the water, his story probably would have ended in another tragic drowning.

Drowning deaths in Florida are the highest in the nation, according to the Florida Department of Health. In 2002, almost 2,700 children 14 years old and under were treated in emergency rooms

for drowning related incidents, according to the National SAFE KIDS Campaign.

Fortunately for Grayson and his family, the instructors at the Seminole YMCA's Safe Start program had prepared him for just this kind of emergency.

The Safe Start program teaches children ages one to four how to swim through the water, roll onto their backs into a floating position, flip themselves back over and swim to safety. The program is a 6-week course, consisting of daily 10-minute sessions, five days a week. Children are taught to survive in the water while wearing bathing suits and normal clothes, as most



drowning deaths occur when children are wearing everyday clothes.

Since Safe Start began in 2001, there have been 14 reported survival stories in Central Florida from children who were Safe Start students, said April Vail, Director of Aquatics for the Central Florida YMCAs. So far, the Central Florida YMCAs are the only in the nation to have adopted the Safe Start program.

Safe Start is based on the methodologies of the Infant Swimming Resource, a program created by Dr. Harvey Barnett.

## New police employee to strengthen volunteer squad

SANFORD — A new Sanford Police Department employee hopes she has the "stuff" to expand the rolls of the Citizens on Patrol (CoP) program by tenfold next year.

Hired May 3 as the new volunteer coordinator, Sandra Stuff said within a year she plans to have the police volunteer squad expanded from its current 11 active members to more than a 100.

Chief Brian Tooley has long championed the volunteer policing initiative stating they "are a gift to the community and a welcome addition to the police

department." In the past year, the program has expanded to include mounted horse patrol and bicycle patrol, but as a whole, it still lacks the participation level that was initially expected.

Stuff said recent and future changes would help grow the program. Instead of mandating a set number of hours per month, the police department has lifted that requirement.

"Right now we are just trying to get the program established and growing," she said.

The department is also expected to ease the application
