# Six arrested by undercover team

SANFORD — Sanford police arrested six people in conjunction with a "reverse purchase" undercover drug operation July 15.

The operation began after a 3 p.m. briefing at police headquarters. The operation was a joint effort between the Sanford and Altamonte police departments who work together frequently on drug actions.

The undercover officer for the July 15 opera-

tion was provided by the Daytona Police Department. About 16 officers attended the briefing.

The plan called for the undercover officer to be placed at a variety of locations over the course of eight hours. Two officers in an unmarked vehicle would take a position from which they could monitor the undercover officers actions and call out for the apprehension teams once a transaction took place.

# 16-year-old shot dead by apartment night guards

SANFORD — Sanford police continue to investigate the fatal shooting of a 16-year-old by two guards employed by Country Lake Apartments adjacent to the southwest side of Seminole High School.

Seminole student Travares McGill was shot through the heart by one of the two guards who said they thought McGill tried to run them down in the car he was driving. The incident took place around 3:10 a.m. Sunday at the apartments.

Police have interviewed witnesses who were in and around the vehicle driving by McGill. According to spokeswoman Cleo Cohen, the vehicle had five occupants at one point.

Witnesses and the two security guards, Bryan P. Ansley and William P. Swofford, told

# City prioritizes path to future

SANFORD — The City Commission nailed down its goals for the future of Sanford on Monday.

Those goals were first touched on in early June of this year, and a second special goals retreat was scheduled to prioritize them into reasonable objectives.

The meeting began by facilitator Marilyn Crotty, director, Institute of Government, welcoming the commissioners and city department heads to the Safari room in the Wayne M. Densch Discovery Center at the Central Florida Zoological Park in Sanford.

"This is a great facility. What a great asset for small meetings," Crotty said of the newly opened center.

Crotty explained that this meeting would

# Local man flees from police for third time

LONGWOOD — A Winter Springs man is back in the Seminole County Jail accused of fleeing law enforcement and operating a vehicle in a reckless manner.

Santos Edgardo Nieves, 25, was first seen in a vehicle driving through a neighborhood near Altamonte Springs that has issues with drug dealing, according to the Seminole County Sheriff's Office.

Sheriff's deputies got behind

Nieves' vehicle and tried to stop it. The driver fled onto Interstate 4. Deputies backed off and the Alert 2 helicopter took over. The incident was documented on helicopter video early Sunday morning.

The car was observed driving at a high rate of speed with its lights out. During the event, a Longwood Police Officer deployed stop sticks and the tires began to deflate.

The vehicle kept driving, eventually ending up near Markham Road and Markham

Woods Road, the Sheriff's Office said. The driver then fled from the vehicle. Nieves tried to hide in a swampy area, but was located by Alert 2 and the Sheriff's K-9 unit.

Nieves was booked into jail on a charge of auto theft, because the vehicle belonged to a relative, and Nieves did not have permission to have it.

This is Nieves' third arrest for fleeing law enforcement in such a manner this year.

In February, Nieves was faced with 21 counts including fleeing an officer at high speed, reckless driving, driving on a suspended license, possession of narcotics possession, burglary and larceny.

He faced 12 similar charges after an arrest in January as well.

pick up where the last goals retreat ended.

"This is really putting the meat on the bones," Crotty said.

Seven strategic goal areas were identified at the last meeting and the commission was charged with putting them in order of priority.

Those seven goal areas were human resources; neighborhood improvement; growth management; fiscal issues; capital improvements; economic development; and communication.

After an almost four-hour discussion of objectives that would fall underneath each of these goal areas the commissioners, with the help of the department heads, identified 37 objectives.

Crotty then gave each commissioner 12 orange, circular stickers. The commissioners were asked to place all 12 stickers next to the 12 objectives they felt were most important. They were not allowed to put more than one sticker on an objective.

Once they had finished, any objective that had four or more stickers was considered a Tier 1 goal. Three or more stickers would be considered a Tier 2 goal. These two groups of objectives were the most important, and the rest would be left up for future consideration, depending on funding, resources, and other factors.

The commissioners ended up identifying four Tier 1 goals, which included employee morale, neighborhood improvement, performance-based budgeting and the capital improvement plan.

Employee morale fell under the goal area of human resources. Commissioners and department heads felt that it was important to let people know that the city of Sanford is a great place to work. The city staff will help commissioners develop a plan to improve employee morale, recruitment and retention.

"The public needs to know how highly we think of our people," Hipes said.

Mayor Kuhn and the other commissioners agreed that

Improving employee morale was one of the most important objectives on the board.

"Everyone needs to feel that they have value," Mayor Linda Kuhn said.

Another objective identified as a top priority was neighborhood improvement. Mayor Kuhn has asked that a presenter from St. Petersburg come down and discuss a plan for neighborhoods that has worked in the past. The goal would be to develop and implement a neighborhood improvement plan that helps leaders identify and fix issues in their neighborhoods.

Performance-based budgeting was identified as a Tier 1 objective. Establishing an outcome based budget, such as this, would require departments within the city to figure out what they need to accomplish and what it is going to cost to do so. If they are able to obtain their goal, they will receive funding for it again in future budgets.

An example given was if Police Chief Brian Tooley wanted to reduce crime by 20 percent in Sanford, he would need to look at what he'll need to accomplish that. If he decides that hiring six more officers to patrol the neighborhoods would help the department reach that goal, he would then need to figure into the budget how much that would cost.

Interim City Manager Eugene Miller told the commissioners and department heads that this was a viable objective and an important one.

"I think you could do it in a year...It's not that difficult," he said.

Another objective identified as Tier 1 was funding a capital improvement plan annually that would include maintenance issues and new and improved construction projects.

Tier 2 level objectives identified by commissioners were evaluating staffing city-wide; finalizing, adopting and implementing a master plan; developing design standards; building a new public safety complex; and engaging in regularly scheduled leadership meetings.

Crotty told members of the city staff and the commission that realistically all the objectives could not be done, which was why they chose objectives based on priorities.

"There's always too much to be done to match the resources you have," Crotty said.

All of these goal areas and objectives will be prepared for city staff, who will hammer out the details to implement them.

## Progress Energy plans to replace 2.7 million meters

Another group of officers riding in marked police cruisers would sweep in after the arrests were made to provide transport to the Sanford Police station. The perpetrators would be processed before being taken to the Seminole County Jail.

Sgt. Joseph Santiago would supervise the operation via radio communication from an unmarked car that would patrol the area. Santiago's boss, Lt. Chris Collison, would also monitor the entire operation from his unmarked car.

The first phase took place near Idea's Grocery Store on 13th Street. The undercover officer settled into his role as a drug dealer. Other officers monitored him and notified Santiago of a suspicious character near the store. The person gave the appearance of someone who might be selling drugs.

Not wanting to blow the undercover officer's cover before the operation began, and lacking any hard evidence that the man in question was selling drugs, Santiago pulled up the unidentified man and told him it would be in his best interest to move along.

About 25 minutes later, 54-year-old Jonnie Brown purchased crack cocaine from the undercover officer. Brown then rode off on his old bicycle, making it to the edge of the parking lot before he was apprehended. A search turned up the crack cocaine Brown had just purchased. Brown also possessed narcotics equipment.

Neighbors gathered as Brown was searched. One neighbor, believed to be a close relative of Brown's, offered to take care of the man's bicycle and the cardboard box full of assorted candy attached to the front.

As Brown was placed into the transport vehicle, Santiago said he believed Brown had been arrested before and that some of his previous charges were drug related.

Once the commotion died down, the operation resumed in the same location. As the officers took up

their positions, Santiago circled the area in an unmarked car, monitoring the movement and interactions taking place in the surrounding neighborhood.

He stopped occasionally to scold a convicted prostitute for standing on a street corner and to inquire about the activities of a trio of

adults standing in a shadow filled alley between two houses.

As he drove around, Santiago explained that the day's operation was a small part of the city's efforts to make Sanford a better place to live. Santiago credited the Sanford Parks Department for their efforts and discussed the positive effects of the community enhancement meetings that take place between citizens and local officials on a monthly basis.

Santiago also praised Sanford Police Chief Brian Tooley for his leadership, his emphasis on community involvement, and his urging of officers to further their educations and obtain college degrees.

Twenty minutes later a second transaction was interrupted by a young man with gold teeth who told the perspective buyer that the seller was a police officer.

The buyer walked away. Santiago pulled up in front of Idea's, stopped the car suddenly and jumped out of the car. After a brief and somewhat heated conversation with the gold-toothed man, Santiago patted the man's pockets and sent him on his way rather than charge him with obstruction of a police investigation.

The young man stood around for a few more minutes making hand gestures and talking on his cell phone. After a second warning from Santiago, the young man vacated the area.

Santiago then met with Collison behind a nearby church where the two decided it was time to move to a new location, near Eighth and Hickory.

While driving around the second location, Santiago pointed out a young man

wearing dreadlocks as "one of Sanford's biggest dopers," adding that sooner or later the dread-locked man will be behind bars.

Santiago also pointed out a man he referred to as "one of Sanford's busiest burglars," making a connection between drug use and the need to revert to crimes such as burglary and prostitution to make money to buy illegal substances.

Santiago explained that much of the drug problem in Sanford is the result of poor economic situations and too many single parent homes; situations that are passed down from generation to generation in the poor areas of Sanford.

Passing by a Wade's Super X store, Santiago spoke with satisfaction as he told those riding with him that this particular area that looked so quiet that evening was once notorious for street side drug sales; proof in Santiago's mind that his efforts were not in vain.

Santiago explained that the main purpose of the reverse purchase operation was to curb the easy availability of drugs, especially for those tempted to drive from nearby towns to make a quick and easy drug purchase. The reverse purchase operations are designed to compliment the department's on going drug investigations geared toward arresting the suppliers. By reducing the availability of drugs, Santiago said he hopes the efforts reduce crimes committed to purchase drugs.

Thirty minutes after arriving at the second location, a second arrest was made. Travis Carpenter, 28, was arrested for possession of marijuana under 20 grams after purchasing the drugs

from the undercover officer. A young man who accompanied Carpenter as he made the purchase was also apprehended and also secured with nylon restraints around his wrists. It was determined that the accomplice would be released after arriving at the police station where his nylon bindings would be removed in a safe manner.

At 6:30 p.m., the operation relocated to a third location. Six arrests were made that night. In addition to Brown and Carpenter, Felis Sharp, 35, and Feotis Dean, 42, were arrested for purchasing cocaine. Carlos Torres, 32, and Allison Joy Miller, 26, were charged with violation of Sanford's open container ordinance.

Contacted later, some people living in the community where the officers set up the sting saw the operation as bordering on entrapment.

A man who referred to himself as "True," said: "How can you arrest a man when you are the ones bringing in the drugs? This is the poorest spot in town and the police make it their favorite spot. This is all nickels and dime stuff here. Nobody has any money, why target this neighborhood?"

True acknowledged that he had been arrested twice, but didn't give specific details. A man standing with True said, "They (the police) harass us all the time."

Inside the store, a clerk said she had no problem with the police department's efforts.

"I don't do drugs," the woman said.

Al, one of the store's managers, said he wasn't aware the operation took place and said he wasn't aware of any drug traffic near Idea's Grocery Store.

police that the guards approached the car. McGill reportedly backed up abruptly. One of the passengers trying to get out of the car was pinned against a parked van, and his leg was broken.

McGill then crashed into the security guard's vehicle, put the car in drive and drove toward the security guards, according to police.

Both guards fired at the car. Two bullets hit McGill.

Ansley, 28, and Swofford, 26, were working for Ansley's security company, Community Enforcement of Sanford, patrolling the apartment complex.

Sanford Police Department continues the investigation of an incident at Country Lake Apartments that resulted in the fatal shooting of 16 year old Travares Edward McGill.

To date the Sanford Police Department has interviewed several witnesses that were in and around the vehicle that was operated by Travares McGill as well as the two security guards that were involved in the shooting. Witnesses and the security guards have stated that the security guards approached the vehicle. The driver of the vehicle, Travares McGill, abruptly placed the vehicle in reverse, pinning one of his passengers that was attempting to exit the vehicle and colliding into a van parked next to him. The passenger was injured, broken leg. The driver of the vehicle, Travares McGill, then crashed into the security guard's vehicle, put the vehicle in drive and then drove towards the security guards, accelerating very quickly. Both security guards fired shots at the vehicle. Two bullets hit McGill, one penetrated the heart, according to autopsy findings.

The bullet and weapons used by the security guards in the incident will be forwarded to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for ballistics comparison, Cohen said, to see which one fired the fatal shot.

The owner of the car identified McGill as the person the vehicle was loaned to Friday night in exchange for crack cocaine, Cohen said Monday.

McGill lived on Truman Boulevard. He was a member of the House of Refuge Ministries on Celery Avenue. A person answering the phone at the ministries directed a call to McGill's parents Sharon and Kirkland Bostic, but they did not return a voice message.

McGill's obituary said his biological parents are Eleanor McGill and Vernon Sims of Sanford.

Funeral services will be held Saturday, July 23, at 2 p.m. at the House of Refuge Ministries, 1001 Celery Ave. Visitation will be held Friday, July 22 from 4 to 8 p.m. at Sunrise Funeral Home, 900 Locust Ave., Sanford.

The Sanford Police Department has identified the fifth occupant of the vehicle that left the scene prior to law enforcement's arrival.

"We are currently attempting to locate the whereabouts of this individual," Cohen said Monday.

The family of Travares McGill has been very cooperative, she said, and the Sanford Police

Department Criminal Investigations Section will continue to stay in contact with the family and keep them updated with the progress of the investigation.

Information from the investigation will be forwarded to the State Attorney's Office for review, Cohen said.

A criminal record check on McGill revealed that he had previously been arrested six times on eight felony charges.

"Every motorcross racer in the country wants to compete in the Amateur Nationals,"

said Event Director Tim Cotter. "A win there can serve as a springboard to a lucrative professional motorcross career."

Most of America's top professional motorcrossers, including Jeremy McGrath, Ricky Carmichael, Travis Pastrana and James "Bubba" Stewart, have won AMA Amateur National Championships.

A victory at this race is so valuable that two teenagers, Georgia's David Millsaps and Pennsylvania's Broc Hepler, were rewarded with six-figure pro contracts after winning

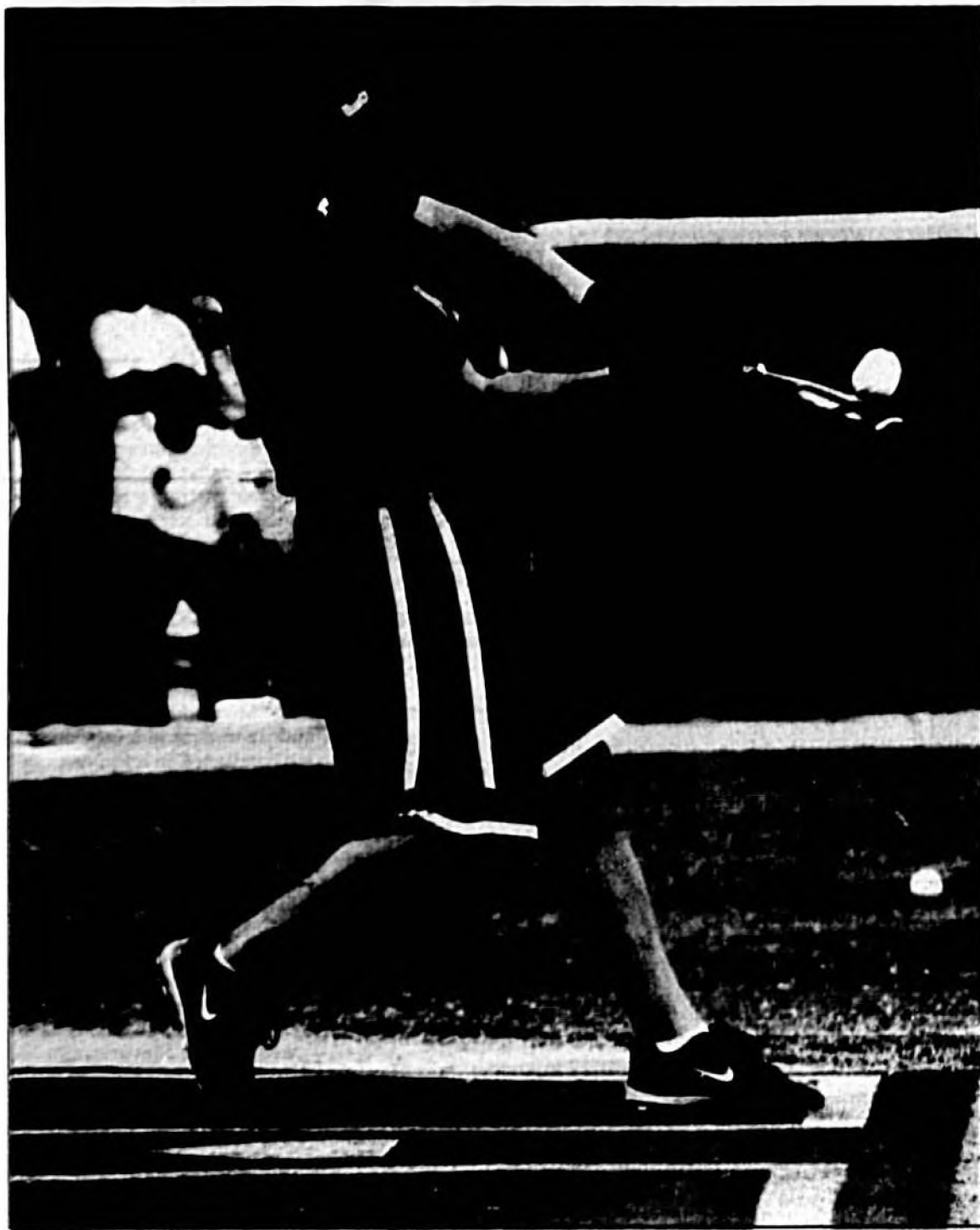

Across town, the Orlando Shockers were able to squeak out a win against Zephyrhills on the arm of Zach Butler. Butler threw his third complete game of the season, allowing the Snappers only four hits and improving his record to 2-2.

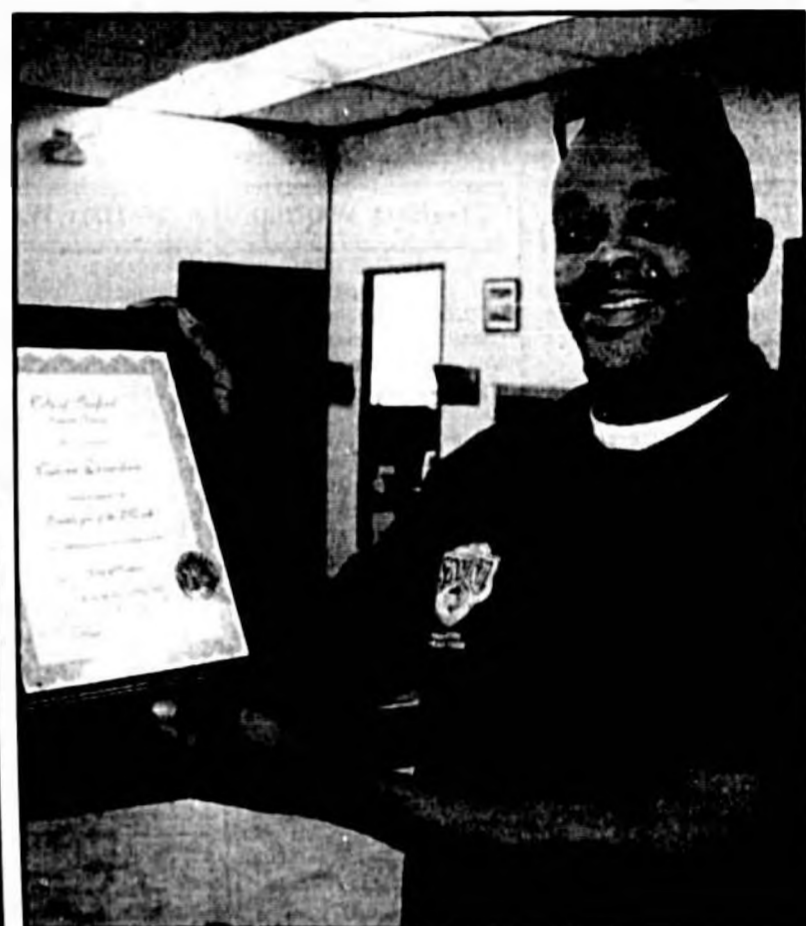


