ANCIENT CHURCH BELL

ONE IN PHILADELPHIA OLDER THAN FAMOUS "LIBERTY"

Goes Back to the Times When the Early Swedes Settled on the Banks of the Delaware—Still in Good Condition

Comparatively few persons among the fair or poor who attended the funeral of Rev. Snyder H. Stimes at Gloria Del (Old Swedish) church knew that the bell which tolled with measured strokes on the body of the beloved minister was carried to its last resting place in the churchyard in 1696, a century and a half ago. This says the Philadelphia Times. This indicates the approximate age of William Penn's famous Philadelphia bell. It has its origin in the days of the early Swedes who settled on the banks of the Delaware. In fact, the Gloria Del bell is so old that it makes the famous Liberty Bell appear like a youngster in swaddling clothes. Moreover, this Gloria Del bell is still in good condition, sound and recognizable.

Cast for the first church in Philadelphia about 1696, it was recast in 1706 partly from the old bell itself, as the inscription on the bell, Thomas Bleyleyer, one of the vestrymen of Gloria Del church has in his possession interesting data bearing upon the history of this famous church bell. As indicated in the inscription, the bell was recast and enlarged in 1706. But it is substantially the same bell which called the Swedes to prayer back in the earlier years. Israel Acrelius, provost of the Swedish church in America and rector of Old Swedish church in Wilmington, Del., in one of his historical studies of the early Swedes relates an anecdote of this Gloria Del bell and one of Governor Printz's daughters. It appears that after her father's death the Swedes on the Delaware offended this good woman, whereupon writes Acrelius, "out of contempt for the Swedes she sold with her farm the church at Tinicum which was built upon it, as also a bell to a Hollander."

We learn from the same historian that the congregation had to buy their bell back again by two days' trapping in harvest time after Mme. Arnegot had gone away. It is gratifying to know that even in those early times Philadelphians had at least one "working church." They were not the new warmers. Mr. Bleyleyer's documents inform us that the old bell, dated 1696, came from Tinicum town, called Elsingtown, on the west side of the Delaware river north of Darby creek which was the principal settlement of the third Swedish governor John Printz who arrived February 15, 1643.

The bell is supposed to have been first used by the Tinicum church in 1646 unless an earlier church was in existence at that place, and continued to be in use at that church until 1706, when, it is said, the Swedish congregation left Tinicum and united with Gloria Del church. At that date, it is supposed, the bell was removed from Tinicum to Philadelphia.

"A Jacksonville, Fla., company has purchased a tract of 400 acres adjoining the city of Savannah and will develop it as a residence section.

"Investors of Philadelphia, Pa., purchased a beach property of 450 acres at Miami, Fla., at a stated price of about \$150,000, and will develop it along unique lines, the property having a fine cottage of one mile.

These illustrate the investments that are being made in acreages and in suburban tracts in the southeast, though in many instances farm tracts are being bought with the purpose of dividing into small acreages for colonists.

which basis it is now suggested that you agree upon for the 1916 assessment greater uniformity and better equalization of tax assessments in all parts of the state will be brought about.

In view of the fact that we have certain fixed millages that cannot be reduced except by the legislature, and a constitutional amendment, to raise the 1916 assessment to basis double that of last year would necessarily mean a large increase in the amount of taxes that the tax assessors would have to pay. The increase in account of the one mill state school tax and the one-half mill state board of health tax, which I have no authority to reduce would be four hundred and fifty thousand dollars in these two funds alone. This would represent the increase in state taxes while there would also be a considerable increase in some features of the county taxes. Considering all the conditions I do not think the taxpayers of the state should be subjected to such decided raise in taxes, which would certainly amount to not less than half a million dollars increase and probably as much as a million dollars or more increase in state and county taxes over what was paid last year—and it was to prevent this unnecessary increase in taxation that I took this matter up with the state tax commission and am now bringing the same to your attention.


