**Far From Utopia**  
 Adolf Hitler continues to boast to his people about the great benefits he has brought them. To hear him talk one would think that everything in Germany is Utopia itself, just on the outskirts. His speeches make one feel in this country that we are missing something, that if we only had a man like Hitler we would all be just one happy family, where everybody had a job, where no stomachs were empty, and where we were about to enter into the most sublime state of civilization. But while Hitler waves his arms and harangues his spell-bound listeners, the German Reich is prosecuting stringent measures for the conservation of food supplies in order to render the country an independent of food imports as possible. Food ration cards which were in use during the critical days of the World War have been printed and are ready for distribution. It seems that in Berlin the chief shortage has been in butter and eggs, but that difficulty has been overcome temporarily. Now the main concern is over the scarcity of meat which officials are urging people to eat as sparingly as possible. Some of the publications have admonished their readers not to throw away bones but to collect them and turn them in to a central office, since they are valuable material.

Der Fuehrer brags about the absence of unemployment. Yes, there are no unemployed. They are all working in munition and armament factories or enlisted in the army preparing to destroy some other country. He hasn't helped the unemployment problem, he has merely deferred it. When the saturation point in armaments is reached, and it will be reached, there will again be an army of unemployed to consider, and the country will be less able to meet it because of the heavy drain of money spent for military purposes. Things in Germany are not as rosy as the propagandists would have us believe, far from it. Life there, in, based on our standards, intolerable. We don't believe many people in this country would consider the issuance of ration cards as a sign of "happy days," and we don't believe many Americans would be gullible enough to believe that a huge standing army and millions of people employed in armament factories is any cure for unemployment. Nor do we believe that most red blooded people in this country would submit to having their press throttled, their private letters censored, and their public and private utterances scrutinized and punishable by government edict.

**Flying Is Safe**  
 Because they are usually spectacular, airplane accidents probably receive more than their proportionate share of publicity. This together with the fact that plane crashes generally result in a high mortality rate for those involved has caused flying very often to be looked upon as a dangerous mode of transportation, when as a matter of fact it isn't.

The Tampa Tribune points out that "although commercial airlines reported 42 accidents and 35 deaths during the first six months of 1935, which compared with 29 accidents and nine deaths in the corresponding period of 1935, the Bureau of Air Commerce reports that the lines flew 6,704,615 miles per fatal accident and 736,168 miles for every mishap. "Only five of the crashes resulted in fatalities to passengers, but in each case the death list was greater than past accidents of the same character. Included in the 1935 deaths by accidents to scheduled plane carriers were four pilots, two co-pilots, two members of plane crews and 27 passengers. "The most serious mishap was the crash of the TWA plane in Pennsylvania last April, in which all except two of the 14 persons aboard were killed. "Personnel errors caused 41.07 percent of the accidents, the report said, while airplane or structural failures were blamed for 23.81 percent. Weather, motor failure and landing conditions were responsible for the remainder."

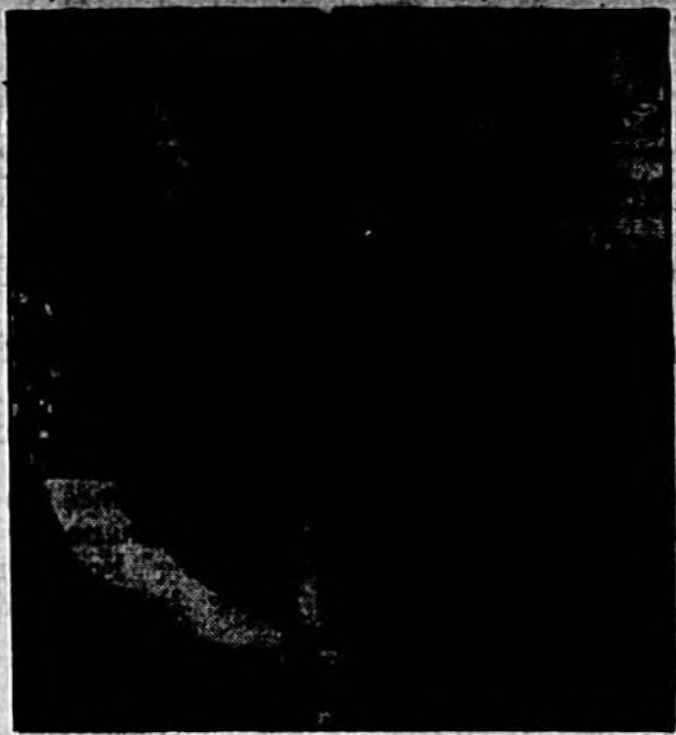

**Machine Outdoes Greatest Human Engraving Foot**

**Pin Point Is Used As Background For Printing Prayer**

By HOWARD W. BLAKESLEE Associated Press Staff Writer RICHMOND, Va., Sept. 15.—(AP)—By engraving the Lord's Prayer on a pin point, a machine has outdone the best foot of the human hand. Many engravers have placed the prayer on the head of a pin. The machine engraved all 300 characters within a point about twice the diameter of a human hair. This is equivalent to a dull pin point. The machine engraving was placed within a circle of 5-1,000 of an inch in diameter at the tip of a platinum gold alloy wire. The feat was accomplished here at the George Gordon Machine Company at the request of the national machine tool builders' association. The purpose was to demonstrate the possibilities of machine engraving over manual skill. The engraving was done with a post-processor, a machine having a pointer set to be run over any pattern. The post-processor will copy this pattern in reduced proportions down almost to invisibility. Fred Knapp made the pin point engraving. The prayer which he used as a pattern was printed within a circle about half the diameter of his hand, all capitals. Seen without the aid of a microscope, the complete prayer appears like a very faint speck on the end of the gold wire. Each letter is about 2-10,000 of an inch high. The depth of engraving is only 1-40,000 of an inch. This is so slight that merely rubbing a finger over the finished job would make it unreadable, might even obliterate it. Two months' preparation of the machine was required for this job. Twelve ball bearings were used to transmit the movement from the master copy to the cutter point. An error of 1-10,000 of an inch in only one of the bearings would have been sufficient to distort the en-

tire engraving and make it unreadable. It was impossible to use an electric light bulb for illuminating the work. The heat from the bulb expanded the parts sufficiently to raise the cutting point entirely off the engraving within an hour after it had been correctly adjusted. Cold drafts likewise had to be avoided. Knapp was troubled also by floating dust particles. When one of them settled on the cutter point it bulked so large under the microscope that it obscured view of the point and work. The only remedy was to take the cutter out and remove the particle. Another difficulty was keeping the cutter point sharp. This was solved by making a point which under the microscope was blunt and bullet shaped. The surface to be engraved had to be polished smooth and flat within 1-100,000 of an inch. Rouge, face powder

and many other materials failed to do this, but polishing with fine kid leather was successful.

Nothing is written in the newspapers for the public that isn't previously prepared or ordered by the agents of Stalin, Hitler, or H. Dorn. Realizing that the only hope of his social order government, which has so far been a miserable failure, depends upon keeping the electorate ignorant, Premier William Churchill has threatened to leave all newspapers in Alberta, Canada. It's funny how all subversive theories of government find it necessary to use darkness in order to spread.

**Italy Asks Adequate Diplomacy Before Parley At Locarno**

ROME, Sept. 15.—(AP)—Italy informed Great Britain officially today it must insist upon "adequate diplomatic preparation" before the Locarno Conference to map European security can be held. Previously Italy accepted in principle the invitation to a five-power or Locarno parley this autumn for the purpose of effecting a new security agreement in the face of Germany's rearmament of the Rhineland. France, Great Britain and Belgium already have conferred on the matter and an invitation sent to Germany and Italy. Germany accepted the invitation but continued to rearm the Rhineland.
