





# Today Is Start Of "Show Down" Season

Look at it from any angle, and the Day-After-Labor-Day is in very fact a new beginning. Not that the past slips away into the soft memories of vacation days "when the livin' is easy" with no

Not at all. Especially not this year when the seasonal readjustment, always difficult, is complicated by a presidential election with some ingredients which makes it a watershed.

The educational vista is blurred and, in some instances thrown out of all focus by rebellious students bent on violence, but there is no escaping the stress which now is being placed on the old-time educational approach and the insistence by events of new visions and new concepts with accountability written bold and strong on the banner of reform.

The business man does not need any real prod to stir him into the merchandising race using every means of attracting and making sales. For these are harvest days in more ways than one and there is just no way to keep up with the fast pace such as now exists in Seminole County without extraordinary effort.

In a somewhat surprise move the presidential race did get down to some out-andout partisan attention with President Nixon, cushioned with many millions of dollars to pay for his re-election, attacking Senator George McGovern, former professor and Democratic presidential nominee, in a Labor Day statement.

The Republican nominee swung out attacking the Democrat as advocating a welfare ethic that "destroys character and leads to a vicious cycle of dependency.

Nixon also continued his wooing of the bluecollar workers, traditionally Democratic grassroots strength, explaining that "we are faced this year with a choice between the 'work ethic' that built this nation's character and the new 'welfare ethic' that could cause the American character to weaken."

Senator McGovern, embarking on a major bid for support in the south, where the Democrats are traditionally strong and the McGovern '72 ticket is surprisingly weak, he took up the issue of a "clear choice" election. He charged the Nixon administration with

doing the "bidding of the great special interests" and defined his own concept of presidential leadership as one designed to "restore government to the hands of the people so the voice of the people is heard in the councils of Washington."

The Democratic standard bearer zeroed in on tax reform as a special and immediate issue which must be handled so that a fair tax program can be designed and enforced. In an



### **Democrats Wrong** On 'Secret Plan'

WASHINGTON (NEA

In the heat of battle, Republicans and Democrats alike tend to destroy each other's performances and proposals. They need to be called on it. And right now the Democrats are wrongly proclaiming that President Nixon said he had a "secret plan" to end the war in Vietnam. This misrepresentation has been repeated so often that even some detached observers are taking it as fact. The whole thing stems, of course, from a Nixon speech in New Hampshire roughly a week before that state's primary in March, 1968. At the American Legion Hall in

. I pledge to you that new leadership will end the war and win the peace in the Pacific-and that is what

Since at least November of 1967, Mr. Nixon had been saying that only a new administration could negotiate a settlement that would end the war. The Hampton utterance was his first flat promise to do so. His Democratic critics, and a whole body of newsmen, immediately demanded details. They reasoned that a

hard pledge implied a specific plan to fulfill it. But Mr. Nixon never, never said he had such a plan. secret or otherwise. In truth, he went out of his way, again and again, to say he did not. Richard J. Whalen, a former Nixon adviser-writer who

has written a critical Nixon book called "Catch the Falling Flag," says of the demand for details on the New "There weren't any. Nothing lay behind the 'pledge' except Nixon's instinct for an extra effort of salesman-

ship when the customers started drifting away." What Whalen seems to be talking about is this: At that stage in New Hampshire, it was apparent Democratic challenger Eugene McCarthy was making headway with antiwar assaults on President Johnson, Furthermore, GOP Gov. George Romney's withdrawal had deprived Mr. Nixon of a valid primary opponent. To sustain interest in this candidacy, Mr. Nixon sought to make LBJ and his war policies his target.

Author Jules Witcover, in his book, "The Resurrection of Richard Nixon," brands the end-the-war pledge a blunder. It evidently originated with Herbert Brownell, former Eisenhower aide. Whalen has Nixon adviser John Sears calling it "dumb advice."

Nevertheless, in trying to get out of the box, Mr. Nixon did not ever concede he had a plan. Even at Hampton he said he could promise "no push-button technique to end the war. He said simply that the goal could be achieved if we "mobilize our economic and political and

Next night, at a Washington fund-raising dinner, Mr Nixon said Johnson had put too much stress on the military side. He said we should use trade leverage to get the Soviet Union to use its power in the Vietnam matter, and called this a possible "key to peace."

In a 90-minute interview with the New York Times on March 10, Mr. Nixon said he would not explain in detail how he might carry out his pledge, that no one seeking the presidency should give away bargaining positions in advance. Yet, once more, he did not indicate he had a

objective." that he had "no magic formula." He said that one of the advantages of a new president is that he can start fresh without being imprisoned by formulas of the past." It may come as news to most casual headline scanners,



Marina Isle Camp on SR 46 reports speckled perch biting in the deep holes along the bank for those using live minnows.

Bream are still hitting best on crickets in this area and many big catfish are being taken both on worms and dead shrimp. A trio of bream fishermen tried the waters of Lake Jessup Saturday and were not disappointed. Using Hiley's Camp as headquarters, Bill Barnes of Orlando along with S. L. Franklin and T. A. Greene, of North Carolina, landed 46

bluegills and shellcrackers in a short time. Labor Day found both campgrounds on the Wekiva River full of visitors. George Chency at Wekiva River Haven reported, that although the water is high from all the recent rains and fishing not the best, his boats are bringing in enough for eating purposes. "Every evening," Cheney stated, "The smell of frying fish and hush-puppies fills the






