CIA Director To Oppose

Spying Budget Disclosure

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Ford administration is making a last-ditch effort to convince the Senate intelligence committee not to reveal how much the nation spends on spying.

CIA Director George Bush was scheduled to appear before the committee at a closed meeting today to argue that disclosure of the intelligence budget would be harmful to national security.

The committee already has voted 8 to 3 to include the budget figure in its report on foreign and military intelligence activities scheduled to be released today. Atty. Gen. Edward H. Levi also was expected to meet

with the committee in what one source said was an attempt to alter that panel's recommendations that call for stiff, new restrictions on electronic surveillance. Those recommendations, which this source said would permit domestic wiretaps only in cases involving criminal conduct, are expected to be made public later this week as part of a separate committee report on domestic intelligence operations.

Courts To Rule On Schools

washington (AP) - Two schools in the Virginia suburbs of Washington are the center of a new racial integration controversy which could bring a Supreme Court ruling that private academies for whites only are

The court hears arguments today in two cases where two black children and their parents are claiming that private schools may not legally refuse to accept pupils simply because they are black.

According to a recent estimate, about 3,500 private academies now operate in the South, with a total enrollment of 750,000, or 10 per cent of the region's white school children. Some of these schools were established after the Supreme Court declared in 1954 that segregated public schools were unconstitutional.

better than I do." Hayward itself, population 1, 600, has about six Indians but none speaks or writes an Indian language, Williamson

Humphrey Bill Attacked

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford, who has been predicting the Democrats will nominate Sen. Hubert Humphrey for president this year, today lambasted a key Humphrey jobs bill as "dangerously deceptive" and an

"election-year boondoggle." Ford, in a speech prepared for the 64th annual convention of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, also vowed to check the increase in government spending "if it takes all summer and more and more vetoes." He singled out a bill co-sponsored by Humphrey and

Rep. Augustus Hawkins, D-Calif., which would set a national target of 3 per cent unemployment within four years and guarantee jobs -- government jobs if necessary - to all adults willing to work.

Bergman Visits Hollywood

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Film director Ingmar Bergman, looking for a place to continue his work and his life, is in Hollywood to discuss his plans after leaving Sweden in anger.

"I improvise from day to day," Bergman said on his arival Sunday. Asked where he will settle, he said, "All I know is I am meeting Monday with Dino De Laurentiis; I have a very good relationship with Mr. De Laurentiis." But when a woman at the airport asked, "Why don't you settle in America?" he replied, "I don't know. Perhaps tomorrow I will decide to stay."

Busing Moratorium Urged

BOSTON (AP) - City Council President Louise Day Hicks says "violence in Boston isn't going to subside unless there is a moratorium on forced busing."

Mrs. Hicks, one of the leading opponents of the city's court-ordered busing for school integration, said Sunday. "The only way to bring peace to this city is for national, state and local leaders to march on Judge W. Arthur Garrity's court."

Bill Permits Optician Ads

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - A bill passed by the state legislature allowing opticians to advertise eyeglass prices has led to other proposals to set eyeglass standards and permit optometrists to advertise.

Rep. Gene Campbell, D-West Palm Beach, a key sponsor of the original bill, said that optometrists sell perhaps twice as many eyesight products as opticians. The bill, SB24, allowing opticians to advertise prices cleared the legislature last week and was sent to Gov. Reubin Askew. Supporters say that bill alone could save consumers \$10 million by stimulating price competition.

IRS Bureaucracy

Earns Criticism

Traditionally, no one likes the tax collector, which makes it easy for the Internal Revenue Service to say that people are always picking on it because it's saddled with an unpopular task. But the excuses are wearing thin.

More than a year ago, a congressional subcommittee jumped on the IRS for not understanding its own rules. A survey showed that IRS agents were giving wrong answers to one out of four taxpayers calling for information. The IRS acknowledged its shortcomings and launched a program to remedy them. Now, the same subcommittee has filed a progress report. It shows no progress at all, even though IRS claims it has cut its error rate in half.

meanwhile a California professor who specializes to analyzing reading problems has run a test which offers a clue to what's wrong. The instructions for Form 1040 contain so many ambiguous words and phrases that his test subjects all holding college degrees - couldn't understand

The IRS may represent the ultimate development of bureaucracy - a jungle of directives and forms that not only confuses and aggravates the public but is too dense even for its own personnel to patrol. Since 1962, for instance, federal law had saddled corporations and financial institutions with the chore of telling the IRS who receives all dividend and interest payments which exceed \$10, a massive bookkeeping and mailing procedure. IRS Commissioner Donald Alexander disclosed the other day that most of these reports are thrown away, never used for the intended purpose of verifying the figures on a taxpayer's return. Yet

Congress is pressuring Mr. Alexander to overcome the administrative shortcomings of his agency, which is quite proper, but Congress itself must take a major share of the blame for his problems. Years of tinkering with the tax code, the familiar attack on "loopholes" and efforts to adjust tax laws to accomplish social purposes, are what have created the present array of tax forms and their bewildering instructions. Treasury Secretary William Simon has been urging Congress to go back and start over, imposing "a simple progressive tax on a broad base which adequately reflects individual taxpayers' ability to pay." Is that impossible? It shouldn't be.

No Winners

Lebanon, its economy in ruins, its leadership in chaos and its people hopelessly divided, has been in turmoil for a full year. An estimated 15,000 have been killed in the civil war between Christians and Mcslems. The nation is fragmented among not only the Christians, who have been driven to the sea, and the Moslems, who have their own ideological differences, but two factions of Palestinian guerrillas, each with its own objectives.

The last thing Lebanon needs is interference from Syria. The plea of Leftist Moslem leader Kamal Jumblatt to the United States, France and the Soviet Union to oppose a Syrian invasion should be respected.

But it may be as futile as the series of "cease-fires," which have done little to halt the bloodshed and destruction. Jumblatt's goal is to establish a Moslem Socialist country Syria, under the leadership of President Hafez Assad, would prefer a restoration of the power balance with the Christians


and the prewar capitalist economy. Syria's Arab neighbors, however, are sympathetic to Jumblatt, not necessarily because of his political objectives. Libya and Egypt fear the "liquidation" of the Palestine Liberation Organization, which has been designated spokesman for all Arabs in their conflict with Israel and which has allied

itself with the Lebanese Moslems. Syria has its own guerrilla group operating in Lebanon's

Lebanon's tangled internal troubles are agonizing enough without the threat of foreign intervention, which could embroil all of the Middle East.

Diplomatic pressure from the United States and the Soviet Union, despite their contrasting philosophies, should be joined to prevent escalation of the Lebanese disaster which benefits





Red Tape Miffs Cincinnati

In Bid To Sign Taiwanese

CINCINNATI (AP) - Rebuffed by red tape, the Cincinnati Reds plan to continue efforts "through proper channels" to free two Taiwan baseball prospects from military duty so they might become the first Chinese players to play professionally in the U.S. "We haven't given up," said Sheldon Bender, director

of player personnel for the Reds. Reds President Bob Howsam traveled more than 16,000 miles a year ago to personally sign the two Taiwan prospects, pitcher Eng-Jey Kao and catcher Lai-Hua Lee. The two teenagers helped Taiwan win four consecutive world Little League titles in the U.S. Taiwan's dominance
