



Mideast Warfare Resumes At Dawn, Israelis Penetrate Syria And Hit Egypt

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

Israeli tanks and warplanes resumed their offensive inside Syria at dawn today after an overnight lull in ground fighting. Israeli and Syrian missile boats battled off the Syrian coast for the second night in succession.

Israel reported a quiet night also along the Suez Canal but said artillery duels between the Israeli and Egyptian forces there resumed at

Israel claimed Thursday that its tanks had crossed the Golan Heights cease-fire line with (Earlier Story Pg 1B)

Syria and moved six miles down the road to

Israel said nothing about the dawn position of its armored force, resistance by the Syrians or how far the Israelis planned to push toward the Syrian capital, which is 40 miles north of the 1967 cease-fire line.

Syrian communiques ignored the claims of Israeli advances, saying only that ground fightfighters and antiaircraft batteries shot down six Israeli planes between 6:30 and 7:10 a.m.

Gen. Haim Herzog, the Israeli state radio's authoritative military commentator, said Thursday night that there remained between the Israelis and Damascus two Syrian defense lines and a "bristling" military complex around Qa-

tana, 16 miles southeast of the city. As the fourth Arab-Israeli war went into seventh day. Israel claimed that its missile boats sank two Syrian boats in a battle at the approaches to Tartus, on the Syrian coast. The Israelis said all their boats returned safely. Syria claimed that its boats sank three Israel boats and its air defenses brought down an

## Contracts Let For 3 Schools

The Seminole County school board has awarded contracts totaling \$3,666,338 for three schools in the south Seminole area, including a middle school and two elementary facilities, one of which is replacing the Altamonte Elementary School on SR 436.

In a Friday session the board awarded the contract for a middle school on Tuskawilla Road to Roger P. Kennedy Inc., Orlando, on the low bid of \$1,898,000.

Low bidder on new elementary schools at Sabal Point near Langwood and Palm Springs Road, Altamonte was Standard Construction Company of Florida, Maitland. Standard bid \$894,669 on the Sabal Point facility and \$873,669 on the Altamonte school.

The school board has determined the present Altamonte facility on SR 436 near I-4 is dangerous because of heavy traffic on the four-lane artery and the site is being sold to private developers for \$1,250,000.

The Tuskawilla and Sabal Point projects are the first of seven new schools slated for a two-year construction

The total bids on the schools was more than one-half million dollars mere than the board expected to pay, but moneys currently slated to furnish the facilities and other capital outlay projects will be transferred into the building fund to cover the contracts.
