CAPITAL READY FOR LAST VISIT OF COMMONER

Near Crest of a Swelling Slope Where Many Heroes Lie, Body of Great States- man Will Rest Peacefully

Site Chosen Monday; Burial to Be Friday

WASHINGTON, July 28.—Near the crest of a swelling slope where sleep a great company of the dead of many wars, the American government Monday marked out in Arlington cemetery a final resting place for William Jennings Bryan. His burial there late Friday afternoon, with simple ceremonies, will fulfill his own oft-repeated wish. In life a crusader for peace, he chose in death to lie where the bodies of military men look down upon the capital, amid the beauties of the Virginia hills but yet nearby the towering empires reared to Washington and Lincoln.

Not all of the plans for Friday's funeral services have been arranged, but it seemed certain that the Commoner would be committed to his tomb with only those ceremonies which are fitting for a plain and humble citizen. No plans had been made to sound for him the bugle call that says a last farewell to the soldier, nor to heap up on his bier the pompous tributes of a great government for a fallen leader of the people. Those of his friends who are doing for him the last earthly service believe he would approve of no funeral program but the simplest.

RUM SHIP CAUGHT IN HARBOR AFTER PASSING RUNNERS

Crew Numbering Twenty-Four Arrested While Beginning Task of Unloading Liquor Cargo Valued at \$250,000

NEW YORK, July 17.—The two thousand-ton steamship Augusta was captured by customs officers in the Hudson river off Dykman street Monday after the ship had run the gauntlet of the rum blockade and her crew had unloaded and disposed of a cargo of liquor worth \$250,000, at bootleg prices, leaving only 15 bottles aboard. The crew of 24 men was arrested and the captain admitted having turned the liquor cargo over to "retailers" for distribution.

As the ship was being towed to the large office, Assistant Solicitor of the legal division of the customs service, held a preliminary hearing about the vessel, examining Charles Wilson, acting captain, and others of the crew.
