My 10-minute performance - well, it was an experience. Scared, I wasn't. Hughes has logged more than 5,000 hours in the air and has performed in air shows more than 100 times and he flies more than 50,000 miles each year in thrilling and captivating his

So why should I be frightened? I figured he wasn't going to allow anyone on that wing and take off if it were unsafe. Of course, I did remember the words of the spouse when we took off on the East-West Runway of Sanford-Central Florida Airport and they were: "Watch out for the first step, 'cause it's a long way down." Another thing I thought of was that even though Joe Hughes was at the controls, I had the Good Pilot right there along

Some people might say it takes guts to do a crazy stunt like this, but I didn't feel that way at all. I just placed my fate in the hands of that Good Pilot and let someone else do the worrying.

I knew that in addition to being an experienced fixed-wing pilot, Joe Hughes is also licensed to handle helicopters, gliders, jet aircraft and he's even flown the Goodyear blimp. (Note: I didn't say Goodrich.)

The 10-minute, super spectacular, wing walk that I took was breath-taking to say

After a briefing from Hughes, I climbed on top of that wing and stepped into the stirrups that hold you in place. Then he showed me how he wanted my hands and arms positioned during takeoff and landing, especially the latter, cause with outstretched arms during those periods would act like additional rudders and might throw him off. 

Mail Delays Prompt

Letters To Congress

WASHINGTON (AP) - One of the major reasons why Americans write their representatives in Congress is to complain about mail service, according to an informal sampling of 15 lawmakers.

Four said the Postal Service is the issue raised most often in their constituent mail. Several others agreed the Postal Service might be the leading issue but said they had no exact statistics available.

The 15 lawmakers represent a variety of constituencies and political philosophies.

An aide to Rep. Les Aspin, DWis., said, "I don't think there's a more unpopular agency in the federal government. The reason is that everyone receives mail and there's a lot of room for complaints. Other agencies aren't

\$5.80 For Chloroform List

Administration will sell you a list of nearly 2,000 drug products containing chloroform, the chemical recently found to cause cancer in laboratory animals.

Last week, the FDA proposed a ban effective July 8 on the use of chloroform in cough and cold remedies, toothpastes, liniments and food packaging. But the agency decided not to recall chloroform products already on the market ad to delay the ban for 90 days. The FDA has never before published a list of products

containing a substance to be banned and has not as ced the availability of the chloroform list, spokesman said. So far, only five requests for copies have been received.

More Heavy Fighting Mars Cease Fire

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - More heavy fighting made a mockery of the cease-fire in Lebanon's civil war today, inreasing the possibility of a Syrian march on Beirut to end

Police reported that 219 persons were killed and 341 wounded in the past 36 hours and that the bodies of 34 persons killed earlier had been recovered. This was near the casualty level during the war's heaviest artillery battles three weeks ago, and spokesmen admitted the figures

"The fighting is escalating ferociously on almost all fronts," one official said. "There are more killed on the ground than we can count because we cannot reach stricken areas."

The heaviest battles were in and around Beirut, where Christians and Moslems traded rocket, mortar and light artillery fire. Local newspapers reported that three hospitals in the Christian quarter were hit by shellfire following two mortar attacks on a large hospital in the Moslem sector. The first attack on the Moslem hospital Wednesday was reported to have killed five persons and wounded 25. No casualty figures were available for the

Students Demonstrate

The Thursday demonstration followed the serving of summonses on Wednesday on 125 teacher union locals for violating the anti-strike law, which passed the National

The teachers and other unions have for some time been protesting the government's anti-inflation program, which includes wage and price controls.

The students marched with a police escort from the top of Mount Royal and converged on the Hydro-Quebec which nouses the premier's office. After about a half hour, the demonstrators left peacefully.

Farm Wages Raised

TORONTO (AP) - The minimum wage for farm workers in Ontario has been raised to \$2.65 an hour, Provincial Labor Minister Bette Stephenson says.

The new rate, which will affect about 50,000 farm workers matches Ontario's general minimum wage and the hourly wage paid to seasonal farm workers from the Caribbean, Mexico and other countries.

Within hours, the auto industry had laid off 20,000 workers and other firms relying on shipments of parts and materials began furloughing help. The Department of Transportation estimated that within one week the strike could have idled one million Americans who had nothing to do with the Teamster wage negotiations, cutting the nation's production by

With a labor union holding the power to throw that kind of wrench into the American economy, the debate over government economic and employment policies or the regulation of business as a factor in economic recovery could be regarded as almost academic. The Teamsters Union is not the only one which straddles nationwide transportation networks. Railroad workers, longshoremen and airline employes have shown through strike action in the past that the bloodstream of commerce and industry in America can be pinched off at will.

Transportation strikes generally bring calls for legislation that would go beyond the Taft-Hartley Act in protecting the U.S. economy from such exercises of labor power. Congress has consistently let the matter ride — until the next crisis. The derailment of recovery which was threatened for a time has been relieved by a tentative settlement which is generous enough to convince Teamsiers officials that by tightening the screws on the public they can get what they want from the trucking ndustry. The issue of Teamsters wages may be receding, but the issue of big labor should remain alive in any discussion of dangerous concentrations of power in our society.

## **Bombed Out**

Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-ping is in political trouble in Communist China, but his popularity should be rising among theatergoers. According to a party journal in Peking, he has been making derogatory remarks about the theatrical fare steeped in propaganda which is a pet project of Chairman Mao Tsetung's wife.

What Teng has in mind, no doubt, is the kind of number sung for the Richard Nixons on their recent visit, a song titled "Don't Forget To Store Grain After A Good Harvest." It's no wonder such shows are a bomb at the box-office, says Teng. The vice premier, who is said to have walked out in the

middle of some party-line musicals, may be going all the way out because he failed to heed some latter-day Chinese wisdom to wit, when the Chairman's wife says it's good, it's good.

had in our recent history, a good case could be made that man is not advancing to a higher state, but instead is regressing to a lower one. But I don't believe that. Because if it were true then we wouldn't have the freedom that exists in

Back to Social Darwinism for just a moment. Anyone today who advocates that theory is living in the past. Because over a period of years this country has developed to a point of enlightment, one where man is not an animal, but is a thinking,

As a caring human being, man cares, also, for his fellowman. That shouldn't be difficult for us to

grasp because for years Christians have expressed similar beliefs and desires. In our system those beliefs were just shifted over to the government which responded with many of our social programs in existence today. They are designed, simply, to care for those who are unable to care for them-

There are criticisms. No mistake about that. A major one that springs to mind is the high costs of administering the programs. But we would be wise to pay the cost — if misery is being erased which otherwise would flourish and prosper.

No. Social Darwinists are wrong. They were wrong when they tried it in earlier years in this country and others, and they are wrong today. The reason they're wrong is because man is not one of the animals Darwin fitted so neatly into his thesis.

## Time Near To Move Your Clock WASHINGTON (AP) -

Daylight Saving Time will take effect again this year, with long days beginning a half-year run on April 25. when most Americans will turn the clock forward one Congress considered new legislation this year, but

the efforts were blocked and the 1966 Uniform Time providing for DST from the last Sunday in April through the last Sunday in October.

In January 1974, at the height of the Arab oil embargo, provisions of the 1966 law were suspended after Congress concluded that energy could be saved through year-around observance of DST.
